Examples: • Only the Head Coach may question officials • Soccer – eliminate dissent by players • Basketball – NBA model of negative actions/language be penalized by a technical foul • Any profanity of a coach is to be penalized • Baseball/Softball – Head Coach no longer may come onto the field to question calls.
