Seasons come and seasons go. This is true of athletics during the school year, athletics over many years, and certainly of our personal and professional journeys.

The 2017 NCHSAA Volleyball State Championships were held in Reynolds Coliseum on November 4th. The event is a prism to and a microcosm of our reach and responsibility from one season to the next.

Regardless of how the brackets were seeded, only eight teams (combined record of 214-21) made it to the finals. Those teams were Community School of Davidson, Roxboro Community School, Carrboro, West Iredell, Chapel Hill, North Iredell, Green Hope and Hough. 111 players were rostered for 21 coaches at the finals. Eight principals, eight AD's, a fresh crew of four officials for every contest, a fully staffed scorer's table, an NFHS Network broadcast crew, a student radio broadcast outfit, athletic trainers, security, concessions, fans in the stands, parking lot tailgaters...You get the picture! 400-plus teams at the start of the season. Four state champions later, seasons come and seasons go.

From 1976 to 1984, volleyball state championships were held in an open classification format. In 1985, play went to two classifications. In 1986, play went to the current four classification format. From 1976-2002, sets were won with 15 points. However, a team had to be in possession of the serve for the point to count. So, sets with seemingly low scores like 15-9 could actually have gone on interminably. In 2003, sets mercifully moved to 25 with every point counting. Seasons come and seasons go.

Private schools have been in the Association for over 25 years. Charlotte Catholic won 2A state volleyball championships from 1999-2001. Cardinal Gibbons won 2A state championships from 2005-2007. Gibbons won 3A state championships from 2009-2013 and nabbed a 4A crown in 2015. Traditional public high schools dominated volleyball state championships the remainder of the 51 years in 2A, 3A, 4A, two classifications, and open classifications. Seasons come and seasons go.

The 1A story is not so different, but does bear monitoring. In 2001, Durham School of the Arts won the title. In 2011, NCSSM took runner-up to North Stokes in a five-set thriller. (I should know, as my youngest daughter played for that SMath team!) Raleigh Charter took runner-up to Hendersonville and Starmount in 2012-2013. In 2016, Community School of Davidson won the 1A title over Louisburg. In 2017, CSD defeated Roxboro Community School for the title. Seasons come and seasons go.

We hear much of today's rate of unprecedented change. History informs us that change is constant. Our job is to perceive it, prepare for it, or respond to it. I am privileged to be part of such a board and staff that time and again have exemplified an uncanny ability to lead through change.

In closing, I thank you for your contributions to NCHSAA stakeholders. Clearly, the impact is vast. Be sure in your mission to do what is right for student-athletes that you do not overlook yourself. Take time for you. I wish you continued fitness in all aspects of your game. Would that it would get easier! Seasons come and seasons go.
