



TOGETHER WE MAKE THE RIGHT CALL SPORTSMANSHIP

- Baseball & Softball Player/Coach Protocol
- . Inappropriate language/profanity Automatic ejection
- . Assistant coaches contesting calls Automatic ejection
- . If assistant coach is on the field (coaching bases) and contests a call automatic ejection
 - If assistant coach is in dugout contesting call —restrict to dugout by NFHS rule code.
 - <u>and offense</u> automatic ejection



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- . No coach may come onto the field or to the home plate area to contest a call
 - If they come onto the field of play (between the foul lines) or immediately towards home plate – automatic ejection
 - Head coach may come to the respective foul line in front of their dugout, midway between home plate and first/third base, to confer with crew chief and base umpire (if necessary to explain the call) to make an appeal/protest





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- . Head Coach Appeal:
 - . This appeal/request must be done in a professional manner.
 - . When a ruling is given, the appealing coach must return to the dugout.
 - If the call is overturned, opposing coach may come out to the foul line in front of their respective dugout for an explanation without penalty



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- . Head Coach Appeal Consequences:
 - If the appealing head coach questions the call or is unsporting in his/her conference, a-learn-defensive conference will be charged-a warning will be given. This is to be recorded by the crew chief.
 - If the conversation/action of the appealing coach warrants, restriction to the dugout or/ejection will be given. This is to be recorded by the crew chief.
 - If the conversation/action of the appealing coach warrants, an immediate ejection can occur. <u>The 3-tier system of warn/restrict/eject is not</u> <u>mandatory.</u>



- . Any player displaying verbal or physical dissent to an umpire
 - Restricted to the dugout (disqualified)
 - . 2nd offense ejection from contest
- If profanity or disrespectful automatic ejection in accordance with NCHSAA Ejection Policy












CORRECTIONS Rules Book 2-65-2 ART. 2 . . . Intentional Walk (Base on balls) – A request made to the umpire by the defensive coach, pitcher or catcher, for the purpose of awarding the batter first base. No pitches are thrown. The request may be made prior to or during the at bat. Case Book 8.1.1 SITUATION 6 J: R1 is on third. R1 starts home as in a squeeze play. F3, who is playing close for a bunt, cuts off the pitch and tags R1. RULING: This is treated the same as catcher obstruction. The ball becomes dead at the end of playing action. The coach or captain of the team at bat has the option of the play or penalty. If the penalty is accepted, R1 is awarded home and B2 is awarded first. (2-36, 8-1-1d)















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PITCHER'S RECORD RULE 9-6-2

• ART. 2... The number of bases on balls, batters being hit by a pitch (F.P.), strikeouts, and base hits allowed by each pitcher shall be recorded in the summary. If a batter is hit by what would have been the fourth ball (F.P.), it is recorded as a hit batter. An intentional walk is recorded as a base on balls.




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





























NCHSAA RULES & REGULATIONS



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Board Changes 2017-18

Amateur Rule

- Increase allowable merchandise to be received from \$20.00 to \$250.00 per sports season
- Acceptance of money or a forbidden award will cause an athlete to lose athletic eligibility for the semester in which the violation occurred, and the following semester.



Senior Exceptions

- Students may be allowed to wear school uniforms, including protective equipment, in outside organization competition, so long as the student has exhausted athletic eligibility in that sport and received permission from the member school. Approval from the LEA is strongly recommended.
- Exception to the numbers restrictions for students who have exhausted their eligibility in that sport. Dead period rules will remain.



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Board Changes 2017-18

Transfer Rule

- Students transferring to a member school where the student's coach has relocated to within a year will be deemed ineligible for a period of 365 days LEA to LEA
- A student's first transfer after initial entry into the 9th grade is not subject to the NCHSAA transfer rule (LEA to LEA). For any transfer thereafter, the student must sit out for 2 consecutive semesters (at least 50% of the current semester + following semester) or 365-days, whichever is less.



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Board Changes 2017-18

Transfer Rule

- NCHSAA Transfer Committee will be composed of the NCHSAA Executive Committee and at least one (1) non-district affiliated member.
- Modify initial entry interpretation for non-district affiliated schools (Charter and Non-Boarding Parochial) –Rule 1.2.1(a)(2): boundary criteria shall only apply after initial entry into ninth grade.
- Students who want to participate in cheerleading are not subject to the transfer policy, however all current eligibility requirements would remain applicable.



Residence Rule

- No Custody
- Residency shall be deemed to be with the parent with whom the student begins the school year (i.e. 1st semester).
- Bona Fide Change: The change must not be solely made for athletics purposes.



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Board Changes 2017-18

Endowment Games

 The home team will remit twenty-five (25) percent of the gross revenue to the NCHSAA's endowment fund. If a member school plays an endowment game against a non-member school, the member school is responsible for remitting payment to the NCHSAA regardless of where the game is played.



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Board Changes 2017-18

Wet Bulb Globe Temperature

 Add language to the WBGT Index and Athletic Activity Chart in the 90 or Above category for Athletic Activity Guidelines: SUSPEND PRACTICE/MUST INCLUDE MANDATORY BREAKS AS DIRECTED BY GAMEDAY ADMINISTRATOR DURING CONTEST.

Facilities

The NCHSAA has the right to require host teams to find an adequate facility based on expected game/contest attendance and/or quality of venue.



Coaches Education

- Annual requirements must be completed after June 1, 2017 and before the first date of practice.
- NFHS Sudden Cardiac Arrest
 - To require all non-paid coaches to complete the NFHS Sudden Cardiac Arrest Course annually and prior to the first contest. Effective Date: August 1, 2017

- Fall September 15th

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Board Changes 2017-18

Skill Development/Dead Periods

- Change In-season dead periods from 6 weeks to 3 weeks
- Add new dead period:
 - Last 10 student days of the school year
 - Effective 2017-2018

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Playoff Bracket Size

- Change bracket sizes for baseball, basketball, football, soccer, softball and volleyball to:
 - 1A 48 teams
 - 2A 64 teams
 - 3A 64 teams
 - 4A 48 teams



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Board Changes 2017-18

Playoff Qualification Process

- Conference automatic qualifiers are determined by the number of teams from a given classification in each conference as follows:
 - 1 4 teams = 1 automatic qualifier 5 8 teams = 2 automatic qualifiers

 - 9 or more teams = 3 automatic qualifiers



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Board Changes 2017-18

Playoff Qualification Process

- Conference tournament champions automatically qualify
 - If the regular season champion also wins the tournament, no additional berth will be awarded.
 - If a team other than the regular season champion wins the tournament, it will automatically qualify for the playoffs. The team will be seeded as an atlarge berth in the playoffs unless already automatically qualified based upon their regular season conference finish.



Playoff Qualification Process

- Split conference application
 - The highest finishing team from a given classification will automatically qualify, regardless of overall conference finish.

 Two teams that finish 1st and 2nd overall in the conference from the same

 - classification will automatically qualify regardless of rule 4.1.18(a) (1-3). • **Ties for $1^{\rm st}$ place in the overall conference or for highest finisher in a classification must be broken using the established tie-breaking procedure [rule 4.1.13].



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Playoff Qualification Process

- \bullet If too many teams qualify using the above criteria, adjustments to the established bracket size will be made to accommodate the automatic
- If not enough teams qualify using the above criteria, the bracket will be filled by non-automatic qualifiers in that classification
 - Team in their classification will be selected to fill the remaining slots in the bracket based upon conference finish, then Adjusted MaxPreps Rankings.



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Playoff Seeding

- Once the qualifying teams in each classification are determined, they will be divided into two regions of equal size (East and West) based on the longitude of each school.
- into two regions of equal size (East and West) based on the longitude of each schi

 * The teams in each region will be seeded as follows:

 * Seed all 1st place automatic berths by Adjusted MaxPreps ranking (or other NCHSAA selected ranking system); then

 * Seed all 2nd place automatic berths by Adjusted MaxPreps ranking (or other NCHSAA selected ranking system); then

 * Seed all 3rd place automatic berths by Adjusted MaxPreps ranking (or other NCHSAA selected ranking system); then

 * Seed all conference tournament champions and at-large berths by Adjusted MaxPreps ranking (or other NCHSAA selected ranking system); then
- NOTE: The highest finishing team in its half of a split conference must finish in $1^{st}.2^{nd}, 3^{nd}$ place overall and/or have an overall winning percentage of .500 or higher in order to be seeded as a #1. Otherwise, the team will be seeded with all other at-large teams.

- Once seeding is complete:
 Existing byes will be awarded to the highest seeds possible.
 The higher seed is the home team unless otherwise determined by the NCHSAA.

- No more than 23 games, or 24 with one being an approved Endowment Game
- Teams and individuals are limited to two games on a school day. The limitation extends to four games, if on a non-school day.
- Conference tournaments are not included

 - Incorrect record subject to DQ from playoffs
- All game results MUST be entered by May 5^{th} at 11:59 p.m.

The quality of responsible behavior characterized by a spirit of generosity and a genuine concern for opponents, officials and teammates.

- Wholesome athletic environment
- Good Sportsmanship > Victory
- Modest in victory, gracious in defeat
- Respecting judgment and integrity of game officials
- Role modeling good behavior



Ejection Policy

- Fighting
- Leaving the bench area
- Flagrant contact
- Taunting, baiting or spitting toward an opponent or official
- Profanity
- Obscene gestures
- Disrespectfully addressing an official



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Ejection Follow-Up

- Teaching & Modeling Behavior Course

 - Required for any coach ejected during a contest
 Required for any coach who has player (s) ejected for fighting
- NFHS Sportsmanship Course

 - For any ejected/disqualified player
 Free, on-line course (nfhslearn.com)
- All certificates must be sent to NCHSAA



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Inclement/Hot Weather Guidelines

The following should be considered when scheduling practice:

- Time of day
- Intensity level of practice
- Equipment worn
- Environmental conditions
- High Temperature and high humidity

create a dangerous situation for athletes. $\label{eq:high-humidity-humi$ also cause serious heat-related problems.

- Water/fluid replacement breaks recommended each 20 or 30 minutes. (depending on practice conditions)
- Check with your AD on your LEA's and school's policy pertaining to practice on days of extreme heat.

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Clinic Attendance

Head coaches in <u>baseball, basketball, cheerleading, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track & field, volleyball <u>and wrestling</u> must attend an NCHSAA approved State Rules Clinic.</u>

- Must be completed prior to coaching in the first contest; subject to \$400 fine, in addition to a \$500 fine if he/she actually coaches in the contest
- Can be satisfied at the NC Coaches' Association Clinic being held here in Greensboro—July 17-20



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Clinic Attendance

- If the head coach cannot attend the NCCA clinic or is not hired until afterwards, the requirement can also be met at one of the statewide officials' clinics, which are posted on the NCHSAA Website under clinics. Please note that several volleyball and soccer clinics for officials occur prior to the NCCA Clinic.
- Athletic directors cannot satisfy this requirement by attending a rules' session in place of the head coach



Coaches' Education

NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching Course

- \bullet $\underline{\textbf{All}}$ coaches must satisfy the requirement prior to first contest.
- Complete prior to first contest; subject to a \$500 fine; continuing to coach without completion = another \$500.



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Coaches' Education

Concussion Management Certification

- The NFHS Concussion in Sports Course (free on-line course) or an equivalent course must be completed annually (after June 1, 2017 and before the first date of practice) by all coaches.
- Prior to the first date of practice for that sport; subsequently, the certificate of completion must be on file at the individual school; subject to \$500 fine.



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Coaches' Education

CPR/AED Certification

- All head and paid coaches must be CPR/AED certified
 - Effective August 1, 2017

NFHS Sudden Cardiac Arrest Course

- All non-paid coaches are required to complete the NFHS <u>Sudden</u>
 <u>Cardiac Arrest</u> Course annually (after June 1, 2017 and before the first
 date of practice).
 - Effective August 1, 2017



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Requirements of the Law:

- Concussion signs and symptoms
 - Given prior to participation
 - Parents/athletes sign indicating "receipt of" <u>Return to Play (RTP)</u> <u>form</u> signed by a physician licensed to practice medicine
 - An up-to-date Emergency Action Plan (EAP)

Must be on-file

Must be posted

Must be updated annually

• "When in doubt, sit them out"



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Cardiac Safety Program

All NCHSAA member schools must have a Cardiac Safety Program to include three (3) components:

- Appropriate number of AEDs on Campus
- AED maintenance program (battery checks, maintain, replacement at appropriate intervals)
- Required viewing of short AED/CPR video for all supervising adults (teachers, coaches, administrators)



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Coaches' Education

"Education is a journey, not a destination"



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Accredited Interscholastic Coach (AIC)

- Requires completion of 4 courses:

 - Fundamentals of Coaching
 1st Aid, Health & Safety for Coaches
 - Sport Specific Course or Teaching Sports Skills
 - Concussion in Sports (Free)



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Coaches' Education

Certified Interscholastic Coach (CIC)

- Completion of AIC requirements
- Plus:
 - Teaching & Modeling Behavior
 - Engaging Effectively with Parents
 - Sportsmanship
 - Creating a Safe and Respectful Environment
 - Strength & Conditioning
 - 2 additional courses (User Choice)



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Transfer Policy

- If a bona fide change of residence—no transfer waiver necessary
- Transfer packet with forms are on-line; password protected
- Work with athletic director to ensure students meet residence rule requirements
