RECOMMENDATION	SUPPORTING INFORMATION
<p><b>TABLED DISCUSSION FROM DECEMBER:</b> Require the following for ejections in pre-season scrimmages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Coach/player suspended from the remainder of the scrimmage – inclusive of multiple scrimmage events on same day (jamboree)</li><li>• Player must complete the NFHS “Sportsmanship” course before being eligible to compete in next scrimmage/contest</li><li>• Head Coach must complete the NFHS “Teaching and Modeling Behavior” course for any coach/player ejection</li></ul>	<p><b>Rationale:</b> Reinforces ejection policy</p> <p><b>Budget Impact:</b> None</p> <p><b>Educational Impact:</b> Emphasis on sportsmanship</p> <p><b>Equity Impact:</b> None</p> <p><b>Effective Date:</b> July 1, 2018</p>
<p><b>4. Scheduling Software (CMS Athletic Directors)</b></p> <p><b>TABLED ITEM FROM DECEMBER:</b> Require all NCHSAA member schools to use the ArbiterGame software for scheduling contests.</p>	<p><b>Rationale:</b> Prevents scheduling conflicts; allow schools to see officials outside of coverage area; schools already use Arbiter and many use ArbiterPay</p> <p><b>Budget Impact:</b> 1) Member schools would pay-standard fee \$800 per school. 2) If NCHSAA mandates a plan, Arbiter estimates \$500-\$800 per schools. a. Could use end-of-year money for purchase</p> <p><b>Educational Impact:</b> None</p> <p><b>Equity Impact:</b> None</p> <p><b>Effective Date:</b> Start of 2018-19 school year</p>



Piedmont Basketball	Ccanceling JV teams means cancelling games, unlink them from other JV team game, and having to adjust all other game times...extremely time consuming. Been over 15 changes so far this year to original schedule submitted
Western Piedmont Baseball	Unlimited changes due to Good Friday (don't pay attention to this when making their schedule) and no communication between teams when Easter breaks don't match up. Changes create deficiencies in what Umpires can be assigned...a problem when rivalry game or good Match-up
Twin Cities Softball	18 – prom, field trip scheduled, no bus driver
Piedmont Wrestling	Changes of times, # of teams, sites multiple times on same day a major problem
North State Football	82
North State Football	107
East Carolina Football	Most difficult is changing Varsity games to Thursday due to weather. Doubles cancellations and re-schedules, and officials not available for the change date a problem/more time consuming
