## Alignment Appeals



#### Article VI spells out the details

- Occurs in second year of the alignment
- To address special hardship conditions relative to classification
- To occur after the two year football contract period
- To take place at the winter meeting

Currently, in the second year of the 2017-2021 Alignment

New schools will be placed if requested

# Alignment Process

Discuss in depth with all parties: coaches, administrators, superintendent, board of education

What is the hardship?

What are the conditions that caused the hardship?

What is the difference in ADM numbers now and two years ago?

Notify and discuss with current and proposed conference members

Once decision to appeal is made

Complete the on-line form, stating intent to appeal and why

Then submit all required, supporting documentation

**DEADLINE: November 5, 2018 (adjusted)**

### Sportsmanship/Ejection Policy

- Added language to 2.4.2 (f)
  - "The NCHSAA will have zero tolerance within the confines of an NCHSAA event for the following: profanity of any kind, inappropriate language, racial or ethnic slurs, sexist or homophobic language".



## Sportsmanship/Ejection Policy Penalties

- Added "coaches" to 2.4.3 (c)
  - "Players or coaches receiving two ejections for unacceptable behavior as defined above will be suspended from all sports for the remainder of that sport season."

#### **Scrimmages/Ejections Report**

- Ejections in pre-season scrimmages now requires:
  - Coach/player suspended from the remainder of the scrimmage – inclusive of multiple scrimmage events on same day (jamboree)
  - Player must complete the NFHS "Sportsmanship" course before being eligible to compete in next scrimmage/contest
  - Head Coach must complete the NFHS
     "Teaching and Modeling Behavior"
     course before being eligible to compete
     in next scrimmage/contest

#### **Video Review for Ejections**


- When available, NCHSAA staff may utilize video to invoke ejections/sanctions not reported by game officials
- Video clips to be presented for committee review within two (2) business days of the contest
- Except for mistaken identity, NCHSAA Staff does not overturn ejections

# **Ejection Policy**

- Fighting
- Leaving the bench area
- Flagrant contact
- Biting
- Taunting, baiting or spitting toward an opponent or official
- Profanity of any kind, inappropriate language, racial or ethnic slurs, sexist or homophobic language (zero tolerance)
- Obscene gestures
- Disrespectfully addressing an official

# **Ejection Follow-Up**

- Teaching & Modeling Behavior Course
  - Required for any coach ejected during a contest
  - Required for any coach who has player (s) ejected for fighting
- NFHS Sportsmanship Course
  - For any ejected/disqualified player
  - Free, on-line course (nfhslearn.com)
- All certificates must be sent to NCHSAA



# Sport Specific Items | Basketball (and Other Sports)



Any competition with outside teams in an Off-Season Skill Development Session is prohibited during the academic school year calendar, inclusive of all weekends, holidays, work days, etc.

# Sport Specific Items | Soccer



Ties must be broken in all conference matches, which would include a conference tournament if one is held.

- If a tie score exists at the end of regulation play during each conference varsity game, there will be two, complete five (5)-minute overtime periods--not sudden victory. If the score is still tied at the conclusion of the two five (5)-minute overtime periods, the tie will be broken by kicks from the penalty mark.
- JV- do not play overtime periods.
- In tournament play, tied games must be resolved by the NFHS Tie Breaking Procedure, and those decisions count in a team's won-loss record. One goal is added to the winning team's score, and an asterisk may be placed by the team advancing to indicate advancement was the result of the progression format.

#### Seeding

- At-large berths
  - 4.1.18(e)(1): Teams in their classification will be selected to fill the remaining slots in the bracket based upon *conference finish*, then MaxPreps ranking.
- At-large berth interpretation
  - Clarified/adjusted interpretation of the rule below to: The highest finishing non-automatic qualifying team in each conference will be compared based on their adjusted MaxPreps ranking. Under no circumstance may a team "leap-frog" a higher finishing team in its own conference.

# General Updates



### Sports Medicine

#### **Return To Play Form**

If a student participating in an interscholastic athletic activity exhibits signs or symptoms consistent with concussion, the student shall be removed from the activity at that time and shall not be allowed to return to play or practice that day. The student shall not return to play or practice on a subsequent day until the student is evaluated by and receives written clearance for such participation from (i) a physician licensed under Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes with training in concussion management, (ii) a neuropsychologist licensed under Article 18A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes with training in concussion management and working in consultation with a physician licensed under Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, (iii) an athletic trainer licensed under Article 34 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, (iv) a physician assistant, consistent with the limitations of G.S. 90-18.1, or (v) a nurse practitioner, consistent with the limitations of G.S. 90-18.2.

# GUIDELINES ON HANDLING PRACTICES AND CONTESTS DURING LIGHTNING OR THUNDER DISTURBANCES

These guidelines provide a default policy to those responsible or sharing duties for making decisions concerning the suspension and restarting of practices and contests based on the presence of lightning or thunder. The preferred sources from which to request such a policy for your facility would include your state high school activities association and the nearest office of the National Weather Service.

# COMBAT DEHYDRATION

**START BODY COOLING** Remove excess clothing and equipment to start the body-cooling process.

**REDUCE BODY TEMP** Move the athlete to a cool/shaded area. Use fans or ice towels as needed.

**ELEVATE THE LEGS** Place the athlete flat on their back. Elevate the legs above the level of the heart.

**MONITOR ATHLETE CLOSELY** If the athlete is in significant distress or not showing signs of feeling better, contact emergency medical staff immediately.

## Eligibility

### **Eligibility Verification Form**

- Principal's verification that all requirements completed
  - All athletes eligible
  - All meetings held
  - All forms signed
  - ETC.

### Hardships

- Online form (updated)
- Appeals heard by subcommittee of the Board of Directors
- Not for local promotions standards or attendance
- For scholastic requirements, eight semester, residence, McKinney Vinto, etc.

## Emancipation Hardship

### Rule 1.2.9 (g), under Residence

- Residence remains whatever it was at time of emancipation
- Hardship exception for athletic purposes
  - Legally or otherwise determined to be freed from parental control
    - No responsibility for the student athlete

### **Residence Rule**

No Custody

Residency shall be deemed to be with the parent with whom the student begins the school year (i.e. 1st semester).

Bona Fide Change: The change must not be solely made for athletics purposes.

### **Transfer Rule**

- Initial Entry
  - 1<sup>st</sup> day of class where attendance is counted
  - Or 1<sup>st</sup> day of practice for that sport season
- After initial entry
  - Must sit for 2 consecutive semesters or 365 days, whichever is first
- After initial entry, boundary and transfer criteria apply
- If a student transfers to a member school where the student's coach has relocated to within a year, will be deemed ineligible for a period of 365 days; i.e. LEA to LEA
- Cheerleaders not subject to transfer policy
  - Local rules could "trump"

# Transfer Waiver Policy



- Use Updated Online Form
- Initial Ruling Made by NCHSAA staff
  - If authorization, receiving school receives notification
  - If not authorized by NCHSAA staff
    - May appeal the ruling
      - Heard by the Transfer Committee
        - Executive Committee of the Board, plus one non-district affiliated staff member
        - Full Board of Directors


