To Whom It May Concern:

Tuscola High School would like to officially request a reclassification from 3A to 2A for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 sports seasons. We make this request based on a significant disparity in our current school size, the relocation of many families from the Waynesville community due to work hardships and the loss of work opportunities, as well as the necessity to close a feeder elementary school in 2015, just after the current realignment went into effect. Based on these factors, we feel that this move protects the integrity of the conference structure, preserves equity and simply allows for fair competition. These are all Core values that drive the NCHSAA.

Tuscola High School serves the Waynesville community in Western North Carolina. Waynesville is a small-town community that relies heavily on tourism as a revenue source. As a seasonal retirement community, home prices in the Waynesville area have also been steadily increasing over the past few years and many middle-income families have chosen to relocate to more affordable areas in surrounding counties. So, while some of the schools around us are experiencing moderate levels of ADM growth, the numbers at Tuscola High School are moving in the opposite direction.

In August of 2017, we entered into the newly formed Western Mountain 3A conference as the third smallest 3A school in the state. We would specifically request to be moved from the Western Mountain 3A Conference to the Mountain 6 2A Conference. We have spoken with both conferences and they are agreeable to the move.

Our request is based on our current size as well as anticipated decreases that we expect in the final two years before reclassification. We will demonstrate that our school has experienced a significant decline in enrollment and we expect these numbers to continue to drop of several more years before stabilizing.

In September of 2016 Tuscola High School had 1065 students enrolled. Over the course of the last two years, the enrollment has dropped from 1065 to around 973. Over this period, Tuscola lost 8.6% of its enrollment. This drop is significant and there is existing precedent for a reclassification based on these numbers. In 2014, at the midpoint of the last reclassification period, Jay Robinson High School was allowed to reclassify based on the following justification as it was recorded in the NCHSAA Winter Board Minutes from 2014.

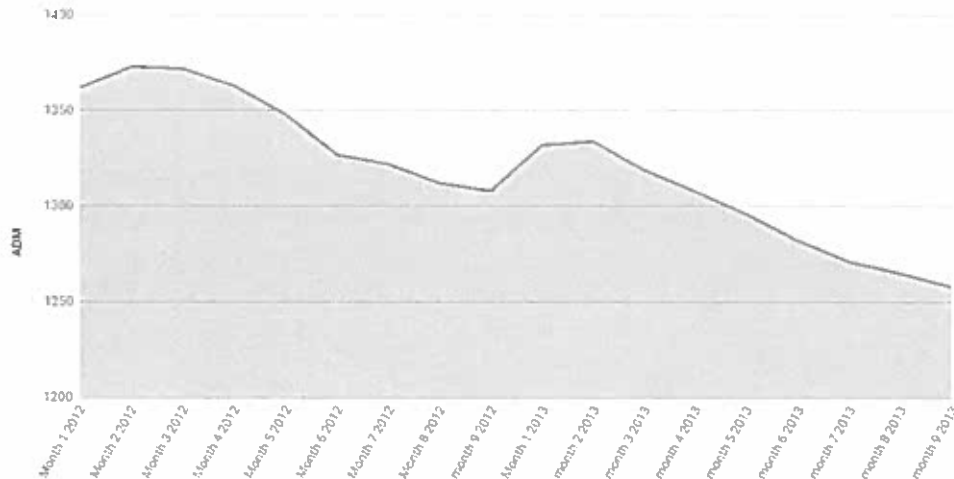
Jay Robinson High School: presenting were Greg Hall, principal; Glenn Cook, athletic director; Joe Glass, head football coach, and Bryan Tyson, county athletic director. Glenn Cook addressed the Board, with the school wanting to move from 4-A to 3-A and from MeCKa 4-A to South Piedmont 3-A. He noted that due to redistricting, lines were redrawn and school eventually lost 135 students in that process, which is how it was 4-A in realignment process but then dropped into 3-A territory. Both conferences have agreed on change.

Jay Robinson: Motion to approve appeal (motion by Greene, second by Poletti), which would change classification and conference, approved 17-0. School would change from MeCKa 4-A to South Piedmont 3-A.

In looking at the supporting information further, in 2011 when numbers were assessed for the potential reclassification, JRHS had an enrollment of 1447, over the next 3 years, the enrollment dropped to 1332 in Month 2 of 2014. These would have been the actual numbers used for the appeal at the winter meeting. This is a difference of 115 students or a loss of enrollment of 8% over three years.

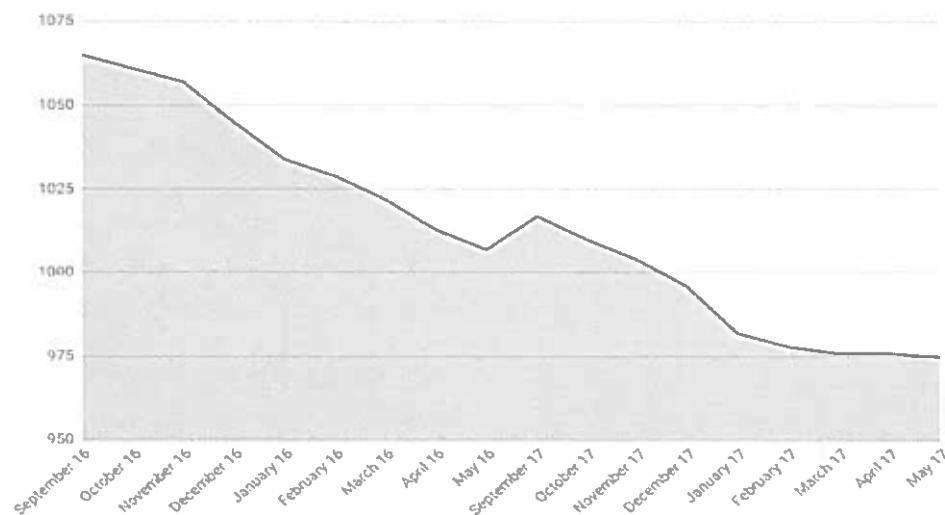
In comparing the two year drop at Tuscola with that of the drop at Jay Robinson High School, it is clear that the two are incredibly similar over the same time period. At the start of the 2012 school year, the school had an ADM of 1362 and dropped to 1258 within the two-year period.

As you can see below, our enrollment decrease of 8.6% has been steady over the past two years. Starting in September of 2016 and continuing through the end of 2018. Our numbers for the start of 2018 are consistent with these numbers while not yet officially reported on the NCDPI website.

Second, due to the shifting population in Haywood County and limited school resources, the school system reached the difficult decision to close Central Elementary in 2015 and redraw district lines to compensate. This school was one of five feeder schools for Tuscola High School and while this decision has had some impact on our student population due to family relocations, we will begin to feel the brunt of this next year as the students that would have been in 5th grade at CES in 2016-2017 reach high school age. This difficult decision illustrates the changing dynamics of resources in Haywood County and the necessity of many middle-income families to relocate.

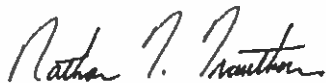
In 2009-2010, our county was struggling with an economic downturn that left many families with no other choice but to relocate to a more affordable area. Housing in the Waynesville community is limited and often a home in the Waynesville area will be priced tens of thousands of dollars higher than the same home in surrounding communities. When this is combined with a middle-income population that travels more than 22 miles to work, with 30% of these individuals leaving our county to find work, we struggled to recover from the recession much longer than some of our neighboring communities.

Unfortunately, we are still working to recover from this downturn in the economy, we are currently working with an ADM around 975 and anticipate that this number will fall in the coming two-year cycle. At the same time, we are competing in a conference with teams that are significantly larger than us. The last regular season away football game was with a team that has a current ADM that is 500 students more than Tuscola, yet in the same conference and classification. This is just one example of the kind of discrepancies that the conference system was intended to prevent from occurring.

In conclusion, we feel that our request for realignment based on a significant change in the community population over the past two years illustrated by both the closing of a feeder elementary school and the 8.6% drop in our enrollment places us in a statistically similar situation to the previously approved request made by Jay Robinson High School in 2014. This request is consistent with the core values of the NCHSAA. Again, this move also protects the integrity of the conference structure, preserves equity and simply allows for fair competition.

We appreciate your consideration in this matter and look forward to your decision.

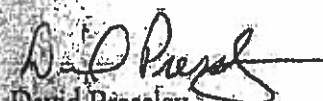

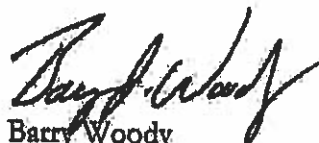

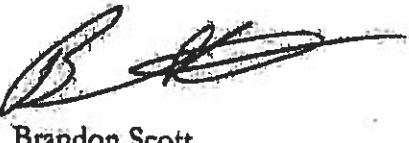

I am writing to you on behalf of North Henderson High School to formally request that our 3A classification be adjusted to reflect a 2A classification. I want to thank you in advance for taking the time to carefully consider our request and the reasons behind it.

By-Law VI of the NCHSAA Constitution states that:

“Classification is to be guided but not bound by the ADM figures averaging the daily membership in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 for the first month as submitted to the State Department of Public Instruction.”

Given that our classification is not bound by the first month ADM numbers, my hope is to provide supplemental information to support our belief that we should be moved from a 3A classification to a 2A classification.

During the last realignment North Henderson High School was reclassified from 2A to 3A based on our 2015 Day 20 ADM number, which was 1,082 students. This number put us approximately 45 students above the line between 2A and 3A. As part of our realignment we became members of the Western Mountain Athletic Conference with AC Reynolds, Asheville, Erwin, Enka, North Buncombe, TC Roberson, Tuscola, and West Henderson.

Our concern at the time of realignment was that North Henderson's student population and membership numbers beyond Day 20 reflect challenges that were not considered as part of the reclassification process. A significant portion of the North Henderson High School population is transient. Migrant students, McKinney-Vento students, among others represent a large enough population that North Henderson experiences extreme drops in ADM throughout each school year. The drops are significant enough that each year we drop well below the line between 2A and 3A.

A look at the yearly ADM numbers at our school demonstrates this problem. The numbers, by year, are as follows:

ADM	20 Day	End of Year
2015-2016 ADM	1,082	1,031
2016-2017 ADM	1,096	1,001

2018-2019 ADM	1,066	

As you can see a significant portion of our population leaves each year, and Day 20 numbers are not an accurate reflection of our actual school population. While I recognize that there is not a 10% drop in our Day 20 ADM from 2015 to this year, I implore you to consider the reality of our school that the Day 20 numbers do not highlight. Day 20 numbers are taken during the peak of our local apple season, which is far and away the largest industry in our district. By the end of the fall apple season our ADM numbers begin to reflect our school population more honestly. The apple industry here is a significant source of income and jobs in our community. The end of apple season marks a significant loss of migrant jobs every year. We are projected to finish the 2018-2019 school year with even fewer students than the 982 with which we finished last school year. As you can see, our ADM numbers are in decline overall and are consistently reflective of a school with a 2A population, which was even the case in 2015-2016.

An adjustment from a 3A classification to a 2A classification, specifically into the conference currently known as the Mountain Six, would put us into a conference with a more equitable disparity of students between the largest school and the smallest. The current difference between our school and the largest in our current conference is over 500 students. The disparity grows when our special student populations leave and we are left with our actual student population.

This adjustment would also reunite our school and community with more traditional rivalries, both in and outside of Henderson County. We believe that the protection of both historic and geographic rivalries is of paramount importance. Moving to the Mountain Six would re-establish our East Henderson and Hendersonville rivalries as conference rivalries. We would also regain our former long-time conference rivalries in a litany of sports with Pisgah, Brevard, Franklin, and Smoky Mountain. No such geographic or historic rivalries exist between us and any other Western Mountain Athletic Conference opponent apart from West Henderson High School.

A reduction in the overall number of teams in the Western Mountain Athletic Conference is also ideal for all schools involved. I currently serve as the president of the Western Mountain Athletic Conference and it has been a common topic of discussion among conference ADs that a nine-team conference presents scheduling constraints that smaller conferences do not have to deal

with. We have found that a nine-team conference poses constraints on our ability to schedule non-conference games in all sports, which I believe puts all of us at a unique disadvantage compared to our peers in smaller conferences.

A realignment adjustment that results in us moving to a different conference would not only provide us with a more equitable classification and placement, but it would also have no discernable negative impact on our current conference, the Western Mountain Athletic Conference. In fact, some of the issues presented above, most notably that of scheduling, would be mitigated for all parties involved.

It is our belief that it is in the best interest of the students at North Henderson High School to be adjusted back to a 2A classification, given the reason stated above. I appreciate you taking the time to carefully consider our request with an open mind and understanding.

I am writing this letter to support the request that West Caldwell High School be allowed to move from 3A to 2A for NCHSSA classification purposes. This request comes between possible reclassification periods because of current conditions which have contributed to immediate circumstances at West Caldwell.

West Caldwell has experienced a sharp decline of enrollment over the last two years. The attendance area of the high school has seen several business closures, which has hurt the school in many ways. The decline in enrollment has made it difficult for West Caldwell to field competitive teams and the lack of success carries over into the climate and culture of the school. I am writing this to inform you of our reason for requesting a change to 2A classification from the 3A classification. At the time of the last realignment our ADM was large enough to put us in the 3A category. Our surrounding area has seen a decrease in population overall, particularly in our part of the school system's zone, which has had a fairly drastic impact on our enrollment.

Our current enrollment stands at 943 and there are no real signs of an increase coming from our middle school. Average enrollment at our feeder school is currently 247 per grade level. Currently we have 251 in the 9th grade, 217 in the 10th grade, 255 in the 11th grade, and 220 in the 12th grade. On behalf of the students, staff and administration of Monroe High School, I am requesting that we be granted permission to move from the 3A Classification to 2A Classification. Due to loss of enrollment, current demographics, lack of ability to field all sports, High Priority Status, limited community financial support and decreasing revenues from athletic gates, we feel our student-athletes do not benefit by staying in our current 3A Conference.

Our current 20 day ADM is 1095 students. The 17-18 number was 1193. This is a decrease of 98 students from 2017-18, which equates to about a 9% drop. Our district has re-districted twice in the last 5 years and the option to grandfather at your old school was an option many kids chose. We feel if that option wasn't granted, our numbers would be even lower. Along with that, we have no way to tell how many current middle school students will choose to go to their new, assigned, schools, next year, once they become 9th graders. They are required to provide their own transportation if they choose the grandfathering option. Many of our stakeholders will not have that ability. If they choose to leave our Monroe Cluster, this will reduce us even further, going into next year.

The next issue we have is our demographic make-up. We are currently 54% Hispanic/Latino, 33% Black/African American, 9% White, 3% Multiracial, and 1% Asian/Amer. Indian-Alaska Native. With this demographic make-up, we are finding it harder and harder to field competitive teams in many sports. In our community, the main sport our Hispanic students participate in is Soccer. It is very hard to field our other teams in which the Hispanic community doesn't traditionally take part in. We have seen a large decrease in numbers for football, tennis, wrestling, golf, softball and we haven't been able to field a baseball team in the last 2 years, and most likely won't this year either. We have even seen a large decrease in our track numbers, which historically have been one of our stronger programs. We cannot field Lacrosse, which most of the other schools in our county and conference have been able to do.

With this current demographic, we are a High Priority school and currently run between 80 and 90% free or reduced price lunch. This has contributed to a significant decrease in financial support from our community. It is extremely difficult to find sponsors to support our school. Our booster club consists of 4 community members, which also serve as the officers. Even though they are able to get a little help in our concession stands, it is very difficult for them to take on any meaningful fundraisers to support our programs. Although they are very supportive, the dollars they can contribute are significantly less than our surrounding conference members. This has led to our available athletic budget decreasing each year for the last several years. Purchasing equipment that can help provide our kids with the tools they need to try and be competitive, has also become extremely difficult.

The decrease in numbers has also led an overwhelming number of 2 and 3 sport athletes in our school. We are asking families to support multiple sports, when it is very hard for them to support even 1 sport for their child. In the day of sport specialization, our kids cannot compete well against the other communities in our conference. The resources are not as readily available for our kids to join the clubs or private organizations that the other athletes in our area currently enjoy. The skill level gap, between our athletes and the surrounding larger schools, is increasing every year.

In closing, we would appreciate every consideration the Board can give to help us move to the more competitive 2A classification. Being able to compete against smaller schools, closer to our size and competitive abilities is important to the continued existence of many of our programs. Other than Parkwood, the other 6 schools in our conference are significantly larger than Monroe. The gap is generally several hundred kids between our largest schools to the size of Monroe High, at 1095. The larger schools are around the 1900 student range. Thank you for your consideration of our request and we hope that you are able to see the need for Monroe High to be re-classified for the upcoming 19/20 and 20/21 seasons.

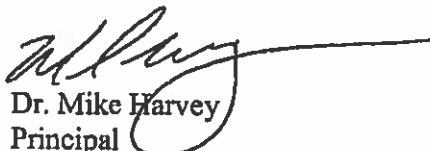

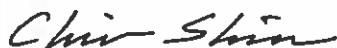

To whom it may concern:

Parkwood High School would like to ask that the NCHSAA consider our request regarding alignment adjustment for the 2019-20 school year. Currently we are part of the Southern Carolina 3A conference. It is our desire to be placed back in the Rocky River 2A conference where we competed before the last realignment.

We are appealing our current alignment based a local realignment plan that was approved by the Union County Board of Education last school year and enacted this school year. The specific details of this school realignment were sent to the NCHSAA staff earlier by district Athletic Director Doug Jones. The new alignment plan called for 190 students at Parkwood to be redistricted to other schools in the county. Due to a grandfathering option presented by the county, a large percentage of those students chose to stay at Parkwood. Despite those students remaining at our school we still saw a drop in enrollment from 1235 students during the 2017-18 school year to 1122 this fall after 20 days. This was approximately a 9% reduction in students.

While this reduction may not seem significant enough to merit a NCHSAA realignment, we believe that enrollment numbers will likely continue to drop based on the reduction in enrollment in the 7th and 8th grades at our only feeder middle school Parkwood Middle (PWMS). The 8th grade class at PWMS saw a 9% reduction in enrollment from 2017 to 2018 and the 7th grade class saw a 22% reduction from 2017 to 2018. Below is a chart that shows the forecasted enrollment numbers 2 years from now based on current enrollment data.

It's important to note that the figures in the chart above don't take into consideration the fact that many of the students coming from the middle school are likely to forgo the grandfather option and return to their assigned school once they complete middle school. It is possible that some currently at the high school through the grandfathering option will return to their home schools during their high school career. In addition, Parkwood High School typically loses an average of 30 students a year from the rising 9th grade class at PWMS to our charter and magnet schools in Union County (as shown in chart).

Following these trends it is easy to speculate that our enrollment figures will continue to drop into the next 2 years of our current alignment.

The redistricting plan here in Union County has also made the playing field much more uneven for us here at Parkwood. While our school's enrollment continues to drop, the affects have been to increase enrollment at the schools we compete against. The chart below shows the disparity we face.

As you can see by the chart there is a significant difference in enrollment between the other Southern Carolina Conference schools in our county and the 2 schools appealing for realignment. Our biggest concern with being a school with up to 710 less students than some schools in our conference is safety, particularly in the sport of football. Our varsity football team has been depleted by injuries this season due to players having to play on both sides of the ball due to lower roster numbers. We have seen about a 10% reduction in the number of students playing football at Parkwood since the local realignment. Our participation numbers in football at the middle school are also down due to the same reasons stated above.

We are pleased that our current conference has agreed (see attachment) that we belong back in the 2A classification where we were better able to compete before realignment. We are also pleased that the 2A Rocky River conference has agreed (see attachment) to take us back as a member should the NCHSAA accept our appeal.

Let me finish by saying that Parkwood High School is a small close-knit rural community. The families and local community take great pride in our school and its athletic programs. We were disappointed to have fallen a few students over the ADM number needed to stay in 2A during the last reclassification. The latest district realignment plan was difficult for our school and community for many reasons, athletics being one of them. Trying to compete with much larger and wealthier schools has at times been demoralizing for our students and at times put them at greater risk for injury. We hope the NCHSAA will take all these factors into account when deciding which conference and classification we belong in. It is our hope that we can stand in front of the board of directors and further explain why we think a reclassification is in the best interest of our students here at Parkwood High School. We thank you for your consideration.

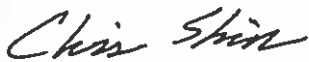

Other jobs at risk as MillerCoors shutting doors by September 2016

EDEN, N.C. — The big three automakers. The big three TV networks. Ma Bell. Pan Am.

America's ongoing taste for novelty, individuality and choice made casualties of them all.

Add mainstream beer to the list.

MillerCoors, the nation's second-largest brewing company, has seen its classic brands buffeted by recession, micro brews and changing tastes among drinkers.

And it hit home Monday when the company told employees it plans to close its Eden plant by September 2016.

With 520 employees, MillerCoors has been one of the city's largest employers for 37 years.

MillerCoors said in its announcement that production has declined by 10 million barrels of beer in the past seven years and the Eden plant's distribution overlaps with the company's Shenandoah brewery in Virginia, about 200 miles away.

So it will close its older Eden plant and spread its production out among five other breweries.

The move will be a devastating blow to the small city, where \$20-an-hour manufacturing jobs are in short supply.

Quincy Hairston of Martinsville, Va., has been with the company for six years.

"I'm hurt, but I'm blessed because I firmly believe God makes a way," he said.

Other jobs are at risk as well. Three trucking companies in Eden have major contracts with MillerCoors.

And Ball Corp., with 170 workers, makes cans for the brewery. A company spokesman said Ball has not made any announcement about its future in Reidsville.

The news came as a shock to many county and city officials.

Eden officials learned about Monday's meeting through an email sent last Friday but didn't have any indication the plant would close.

"It was a surprise to us," Eden Mayor Wayne Tuggle said.

City officials view MillerCoors as a good corporate citizen because of its support for local charities and events like next week's RiverFest.

But the beer manufacturer is also a \$1.3 million revenue source for a city currently operating on a \$22 million budget.

"It will be devastating to the city," said Mike Dougherty, Eden's economic development director.

Both Dougherty and Tuggle worry about the impact to local residents.

"How do you replace Miller with the high-paying jobs they have?" Tuggle asked.

"You just can't find those jobs."

The Teamsters Brewery and Soft Drink Workers Conference represents 420 employees at the plant. But the union said little about its plans for the workers.

County Manager Lance Metzler said in a statement the brewery represents roughly \$33 million of assessed tax value in real estate and \$132.6 million in equipment.

MillerCoors' sales volume totaled 64.5 million barrels in 2008, according to Beer Marketer's INSIGHTS, a trade publication.

By 2014, that had dropped to 55.8 million barrels — a 13.5 percent decline.

Marty Maloney, a MillerCoors media relations manager, said "fragmentation" in the beer industry is causing erosion in the company's traditional brands. He said volume declines will continue in the next few years.

It's a new world for the beer industry as the nation's iconic beer brands are being pushed aside by smaller craft brews.

The rise of local micro breweries has blindsided Anheuser-Busch and MillerCoors — the top two beer makers — drawing more upscale and adventurous drinkers into the world of wheat ale, blonde ale, seasonal ale and scores of other variations that can turn beer drinking into something akin to wine tasting.

At the same time, Millennials, the youngest drinkers, are sometimes bypassing beer altogether for wine or liquor.

Large plant closures were inevitable for MillerCoors, said Eric Shepard, vice president and executive editor of Beer Marketer's INSIGHTS.

"It's been a very tough period for them."

REIDSVILLE, N.C. -- The Ball Corporation beverage packaging plant in Reidsville will close in mid-2017, according to a news release.

The Reidsville plant opened in 1978 and was acquired by Ball in 1998 as part of the acquisition of Reynolds Metals Company.

It produces beverage cans in a variety of sizes, and employs approximately 150 people.

Elwood Ellington has worked at Ball Corporation for 14 years.

"We were led to believe that we were in pretty good shape," Ellington said. "We were still having some troubled times, but we thought we were going to be OK. To hear this news, it was very devastating."

Reidsville employees may be provided benefits and outplacement services in accordance with the bargaining process and are eligible to apply for job openings within Ball.

"This action will better align our manufacturing footprint to meet the changing needs of our customers and the market, as we actively manage our overall plant system after the addition of seven North American Rexam plants upon close of the acquisition earlier this year," said Daniel W. Fisher, senior vice president, Ball Corporation, and COO, global beverage packaging, in the release. "While closing a plant is always difficult, balancing our supply with demand in the highly competitive beverage packaging industry will better position the company for the long-term."

Vernon Gammon is a local union representative. He is trying to save the 150 jobs.

"I'm asking all local, state and fellow elected officials, let's step up to the plate," Gammon said.

The City of Reidsville and Rockingham County economic development teams say they are working to put plan in place to help the people who will lose their job. They say new businesses, like a Love's Travel Center and NTE power plant, are bringing opportunities to the area.

Remington is headquartered in Madison, Rockingham County. According to the latest Triad Business Journal research, the company employs about 150 employees at the Madison facility.

In 2014, the company scouted five North Carolina counties for a manufacturing plant that would have created 2,000 jobs over the next 10 years, but ultimately chose Alabama for the project. Later that year, the company announced it would lay off 41 employees from its 200-person workforce at its Madison headquarters.

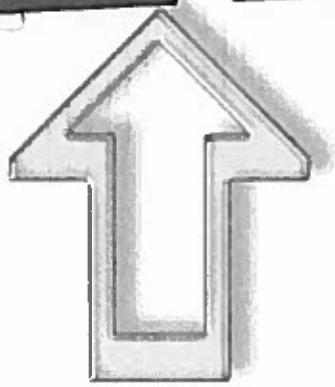

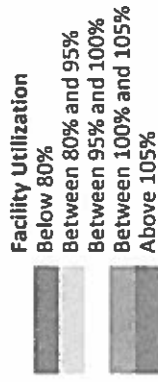

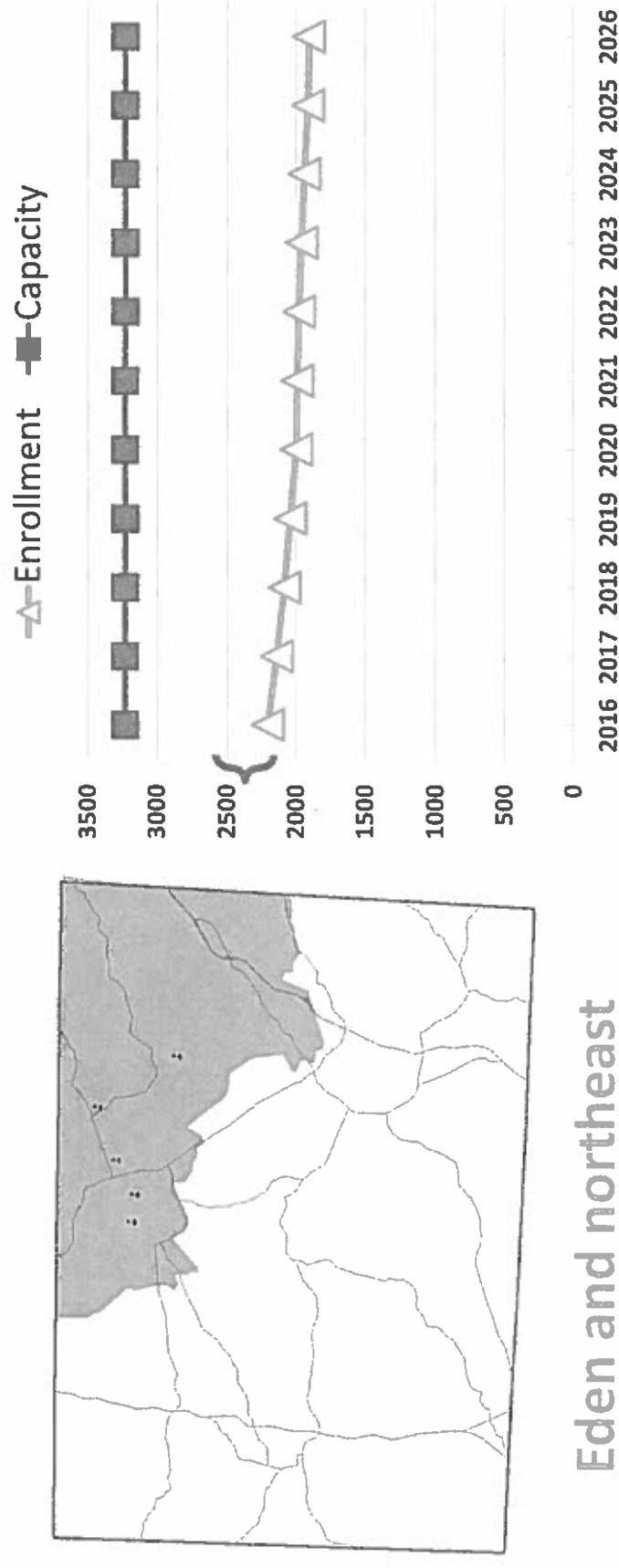

Attendance Zone vs. Capacity

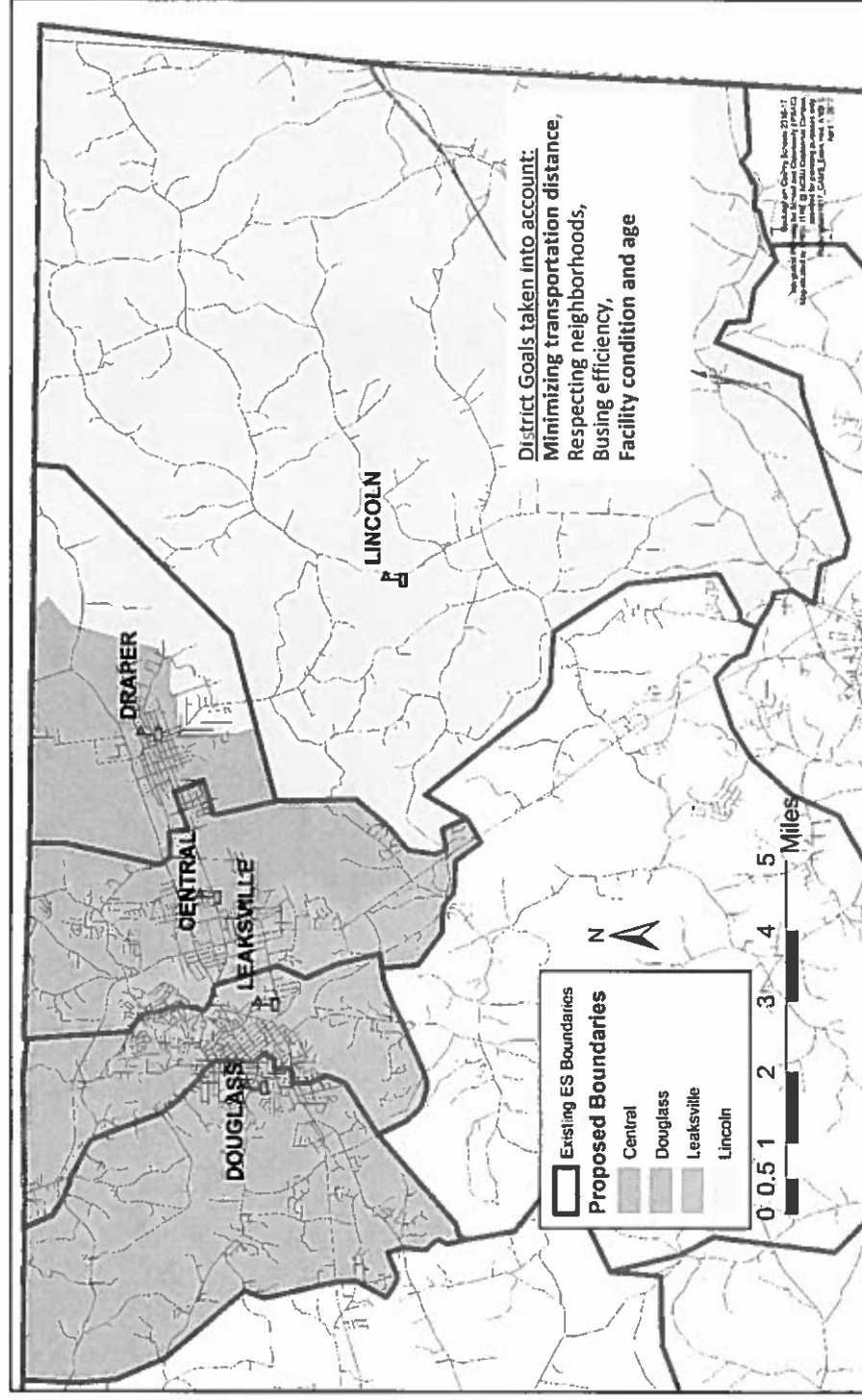

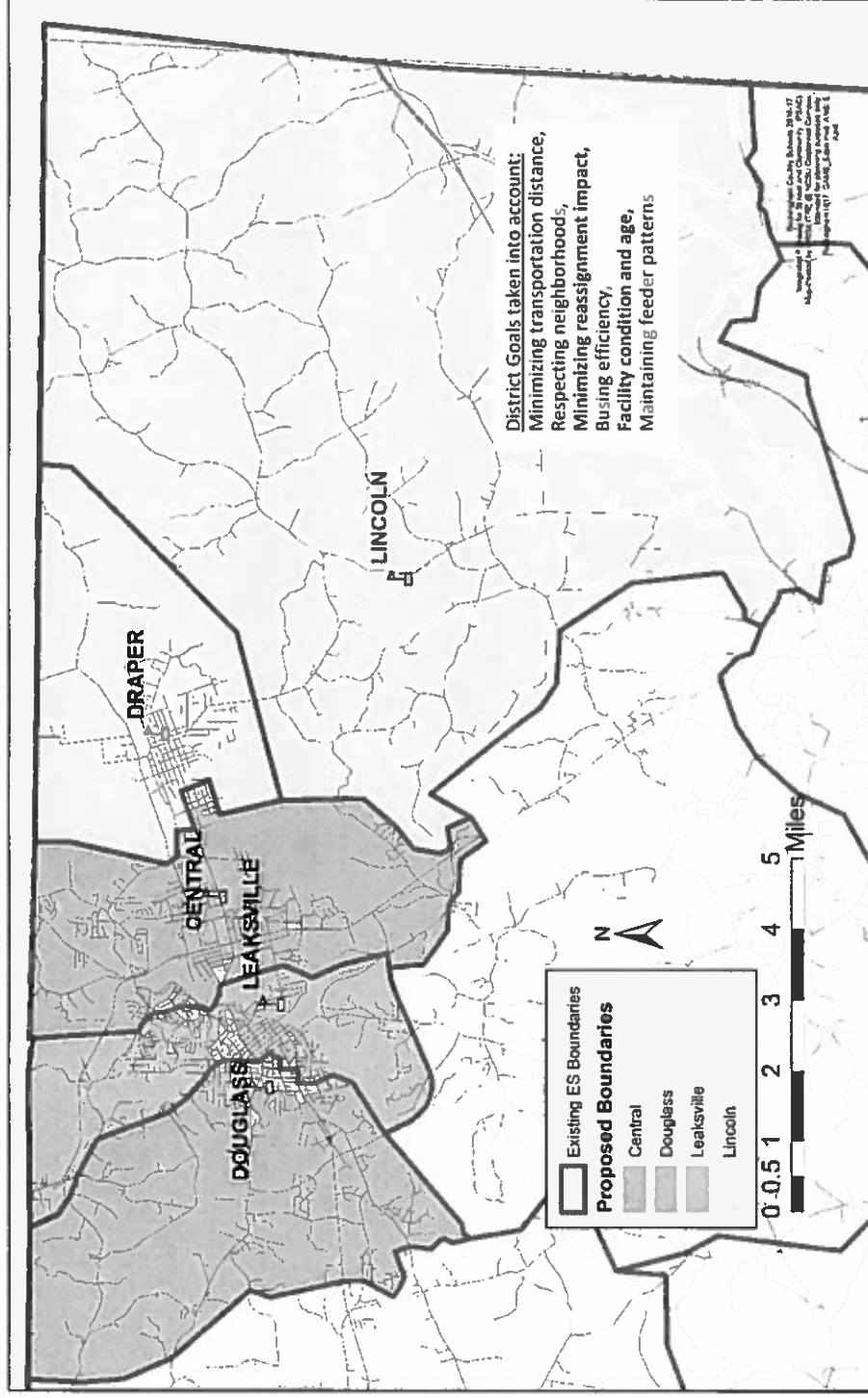

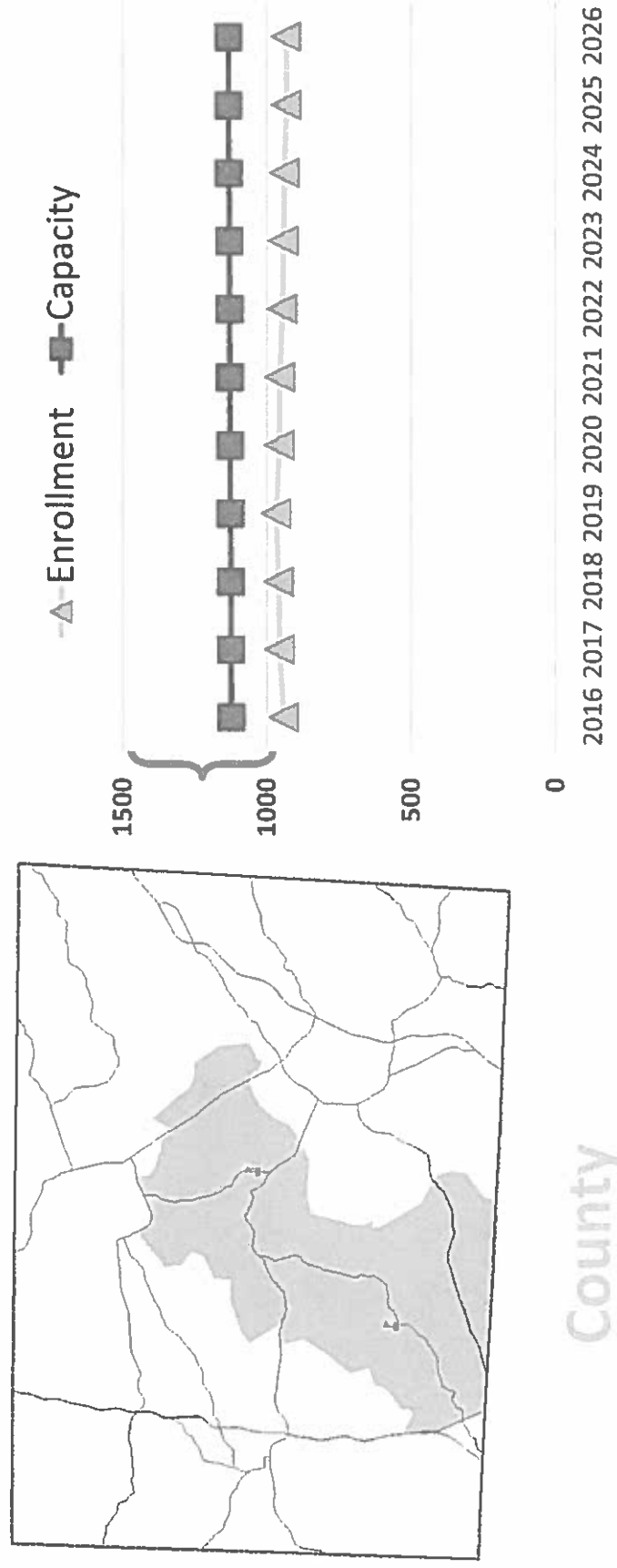


Proposed Preliminary Attendance Zone – Eden Option 2

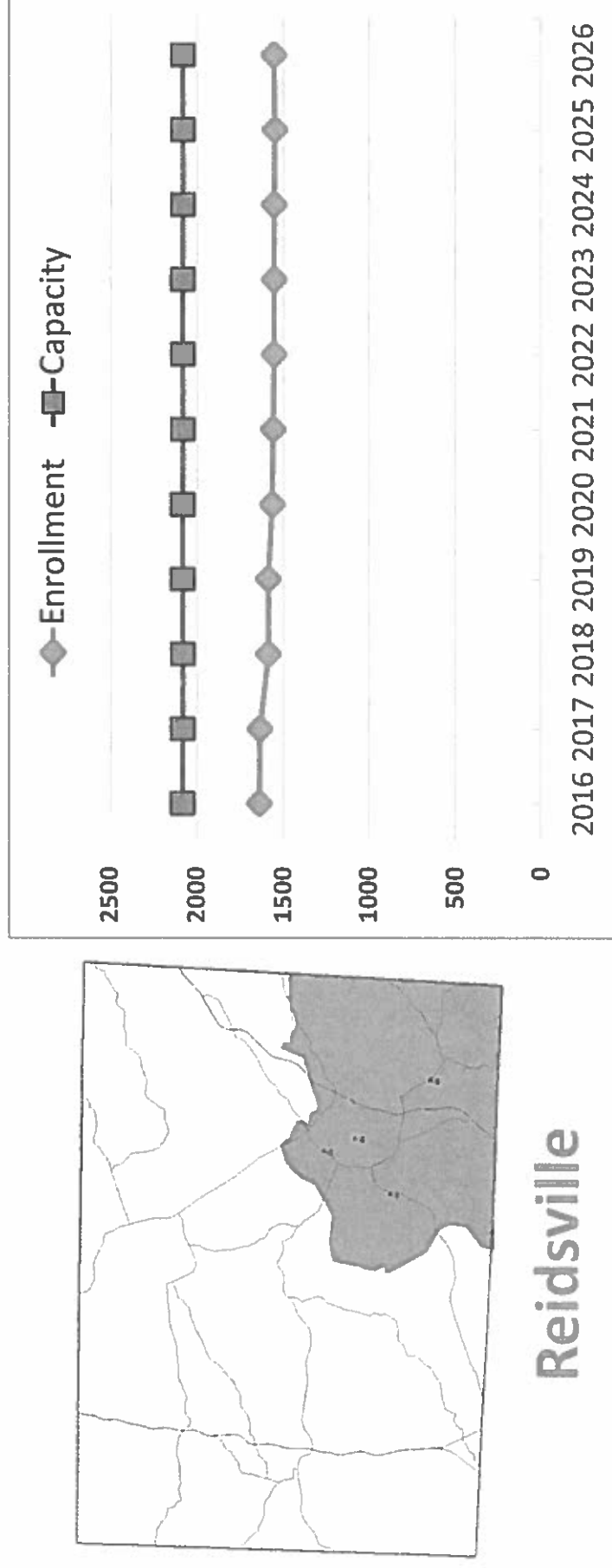

Sufficient elementary capacity in the County.

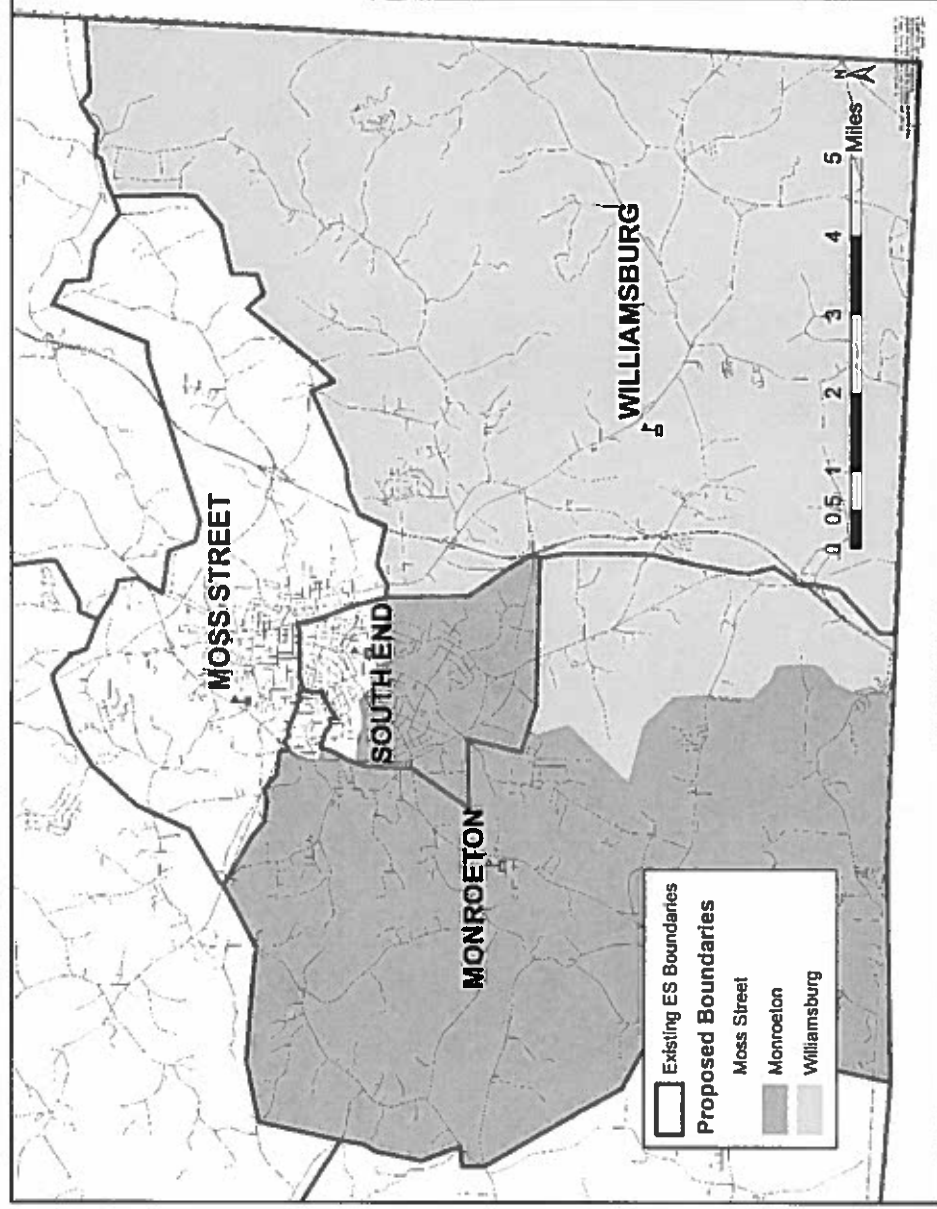
Attendance Zone vs. Capacity

Excess capacity in elementary schools in the southeast

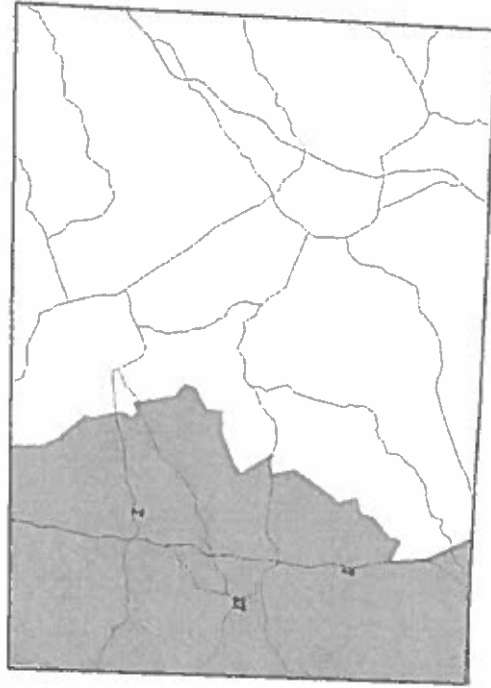
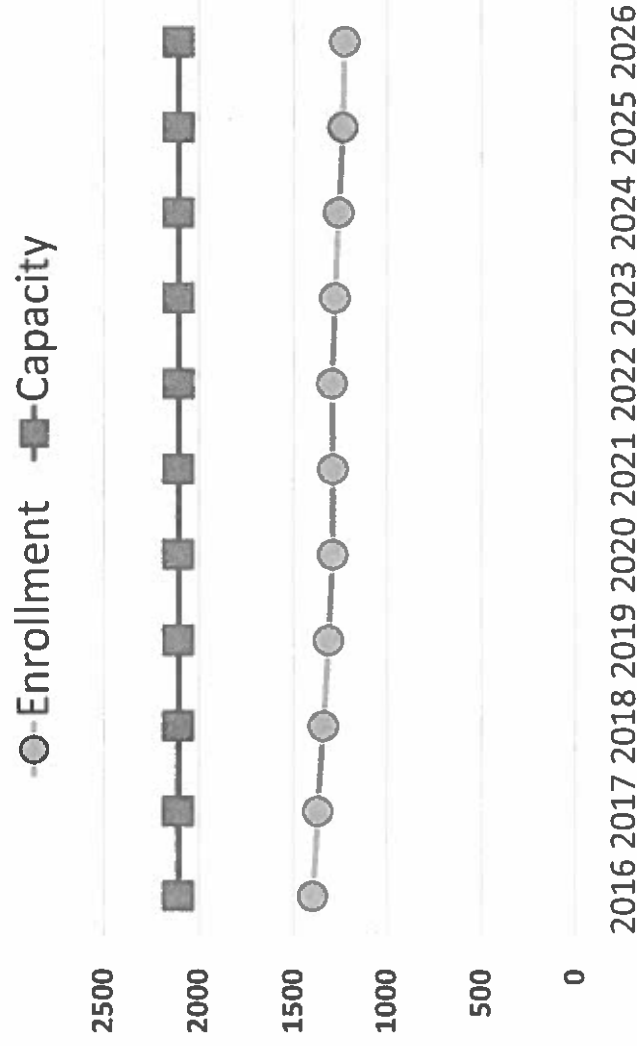

Attendance Zone vs. Capacity

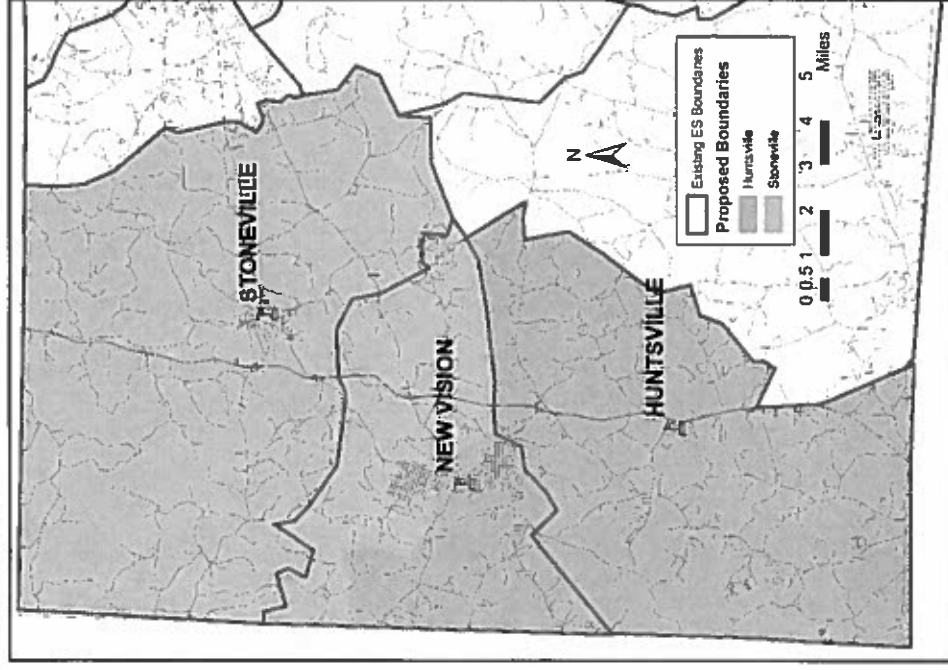

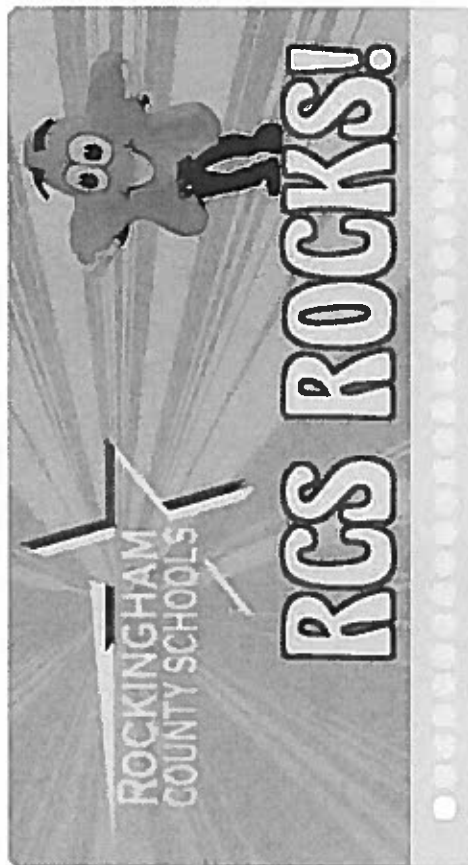

Our request for the re-classification of Southwestern Randolph High School as a 2A school is based on the following reasons:

1. Uwharrie Charter Academy opened during the 2013-2014 school year. This school is located three and a half miles from Southwestern Randolph High School and has an address aligned with the southwestern zone of the Randolph County School System. Furthermore, the number of students attending Uwharrie Charter Academy who were assigned to attend Southwestern Randolph High School has increased considerably when comparing the 2013-2014 school year to the 2018-2019 school year. This data is outlined in the following table:

In addition to the previously-noted information, during the 2018-2019 school year, the Randolph County School System's six traditional high schools have lost 354 students to Uwharrie Charter Academy. In terms of individual schools, Southwestern Randolph High School has lost the largest number of students to Uwharrie Charter Academy during the 2018-2019 school year when compared to the other five traditional high schools in the Randolph County School System. More specifically, 43% of the high school students who have left the Randolph County School System to attend Uwharrie Charter Academy during the 2018-2019 school year came from Southwestern Randolph High School. Thus, the presence of Uwharrie Charter Academy in the southwestern zone of the Randolph County School System has had a direct, and substantial, negative impact on the enrollment of Southwestern Randolph High School.

2. Southwestern Randolph High School has experienced a significant decline in enrollment since the opening of Uwharrie Charter Academy during the 2013-2014 school year. More specifically, during the 2015-2016 school year, Southwestern Randolph High School's enrollment as of the 20th day was 1,061. However, as of the 20th day of the 2018-2019 school year, Southwestern Randolph High School's enrollment had decreased to 901. Thus, Southwestern Randolph High School's enrollment has decreased by 160 students when comparing the 2018-2019 school year data to the data used to place the school in the 3A classification under the current re-alignment plan.

It also should be noted that a special application school, Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve, opened during the 2017-2018 school year. As of the 20th day of the 2018-2019 school year, 112 students in grade 9 and grade 10 attend the school. Furthermore, the enrollment at

Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve is attached to Southwestern Randolph High School for athletic purposes. However, despite the addition of the extra 112 students to Southwestern Randolph High School for athletic purposes for a total of 1,013 students, the number of Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participating in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School has been minimal during the 2017-2018 school year and the 2018-2019 school year. In fact, a total of seven (7) Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participated in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School during the 2017-2018 school year. The number of Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participating in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School during the 2018-2019 school year only increased to 14. Another important note is the fact that Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve only had grade 9 during the 2017-2018 school year. Grade 10 was added during the 2018-2019 school year. Grade 11 will be added to the school during the 2019-2020 school year; whereas, the 2020-2021 school year will include the addition of grade 12.

3. Based on the 20th day enrollment numbers for the 2017-2018 school year, a notable number of 3A schools have surpassed Southwestern Randolph High School in enrollment since the development of the current re-alignment plan that placed the school in the 3A classification. More specifically, at the time of the development of the current re-alignment plan, 10 schools in the 3A classification were smaller than Southwestern Randolph High School in terms of enrollment. However, by the end of the first year of the current re-alignment plan, the enrollment for nine (9) of those 10 schools had surpassed Southwestern Randolph High School's number of students. Furthermore, by the end of the first year of the current re-alignment plan, 15 schools in the 2A classification had enrollments larger than the number of students at Southwestern Randolph High School.

Please note that the 20th day enrollment number for grade 9 at Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve for the 2017-2018 school year, 62 students, is not included in the previously-noted comparison. While the 20th day enrollment number for grade 9 at Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve was attached to Southwestern Randolph High School for athletic purposes during the 2017-2018 school year, the number of Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participating in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School was minimal during that school year. In fact, a total of seven (7) Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participated in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School during the 2017-2018 school year.

4. At the time of the re-alignment process that led to Southwestern Randolph High School's current classification as a 3A school, the North Carolina High School Athletic Association had a total of 409 member schools. In terms of enrollment, 179 schools were larger than Southwestern Randolph High School at that time. However, based on the 20th day enrollment numbers for the 2017-2018 school year, the decrease in the school's enrollment has resulted in 203 schools, out of 413 member schools, being larger than Southwestern Randolph High School by the end of the first year of the current re-alignment plan.

Please note that the 20th day enrollment number for grade 9 at Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve for the 2017-2018 school year, 62 students, is not included in the previously-noted comparison. While the 20th day enrollment number for grade 9 at Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve was attached to Southwestern Randolph High School for athletic purposes during the 2017-2018 school year, the number of Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participating in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School was minimal during that school year. In fact, a total of seven (7) Uwharrie Ridge Six-Twelve students participated in athletics at Southwestern Randolph High School during the 2017-2018 school year.

5. As a result of the previously-noted decline in the enrollment of Southwestern Randolph High School, the leaders of the Randolph County School System have continued to transition the school to a 2A size school in terms of the allotment of resources such as teacher positions during the past few years. More specifically, through the use of our allotment formulas for high schools, Southwestern Randolph High School's level of staffing has gradually been aligned with the other 2A schools in the Randolph County School System. Thus, while not an athletic issue, the school system's planning for Southwestern Randolph High School, in terms of academic resources, during the past few years clearly forecasts its movement to a 2A school.

Conclusion

Due to the continued decline of the enrollment of Southwestern Randolph High School, the leadership of the school, including Shon Hildreth (Principal), and the leadership of the Randolph County School System, including Stephen Gainey (Superintendent), are aligned in terms of our request for Southwestern Randolph High School to be re-classified as a 2A school. Our preference would be the placement of Southwestern Randolph High School into the PAC 7 2A Conference due to the school's familiarity with its current members. The principal of Southwestern Randolph High School, Shon Hildreth, has reached out to the President of the PAC 7 2A Conference to communicate his desire for his school's membership in that conference. Also, Shon Hildreth of Southwestern Randolph High School has shared his school's plan to appeal for re-classification as a 2A school with the President of his school's current conference, the Mid-Piedmont 3A Conference. While the placement of Southwestern Randolph High School into the PAC 7 2A Conference is the preference of Shon Hildreth and Stephen Gainey, the assignment of Southwestern Randolph High School to another 2A conference within the region also would be a favorable result. The ultimate goal of this request is the re-classification of Southwestern Randolph High School to the 2A classification regardless of the assigned conference.

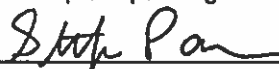

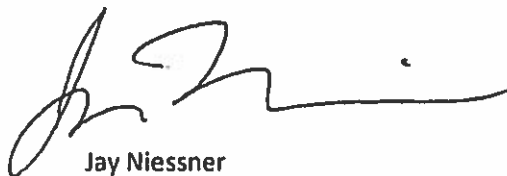

My name is Phil Harrington, and I am the athletic director at Christ the King Catholic High School in Huntersville, NC. Early this fall our school applied to be a member of the NCHSAA starting in the 2018-2019 school year, and we just recently found out that we have been accepted. The reason that I am reaching out to you is because I understand that you are the president of the PAC 7 1A conference, and we would like to be considered as a new member of your conference, as early as the fall of 2018.

To give you a little background on Christ the King, we opened in 2011 in a temporary location with just 28 students. We have been in our permanent location since 2014, and we currently have 290 students. Next school year we expect to be around 325 students, so our school has seen substantial growth in recent years. Due to our location near the corner of Hwy 73 and Poplar Tent Rd. in Huntersville, we have established relationships with many of the schools that are currently in the PAC 7 conference. We have been scheduling with Pine Lake Prep and Community School of Davidson for a number of years now in all sports, and we have recently scheduled basketball with Carolina International School and Mountain Island Charter, as well as lacrosse and soccer with Queens Grant.

Currently we offer the following sports to our students: Varsity Football, Varsity Men's Soccer, Varsity Women's Tennis, Varsity and JV Volleyball, Varsity Women's Golf, Men's and Women's Cross Country, Cheerleading, Men's JV and Varsity Basketball, Women's Varsity Basketball, Men's and Women's Swimming, Varsity Baseball, Varsity Women's Soccer, Varsity Lacrosse, Varsity Men's Tennis, Varsity Men's Golf, Varsity Softball, and Men's and Women's Track and Field.

Christ the King is a part of the Mecklenburg Area Catholic School system, which is a small school system comprising of the elementary, middle, and high schools in the Charlotte area. Students who wish to apply for admission into Christ the King or any of the Catholic schools in the Charlotte area, must apply to the Mecklenburg Area Catholic School System, not to Christ the King. We do not have an admissions office here at the school, and we do not offer academic or athletic scholarships at Christ the King. 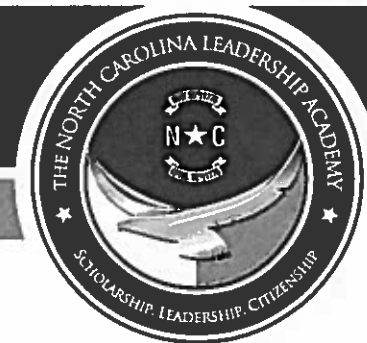

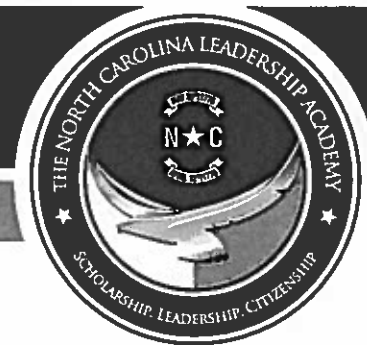
