1. 2020 Summer Dead Periods (NC Basketball Coaches Association)	To lift the 2020 Summer Dead Periods. • June 29 - July 5 • July 20-26	Rationale: The intent of these summer Dead Periods was to give student-athletes and their families an opportunity over the summer to vacation and have some time away from their sports. Given the circumstances of this year with the Coronavirus, they have had a great deal of time away from their respective sports and many would welcome the opportunity to rejoin their teams and resume normal sports activities. Budget Impact: This rule change would have no budgetary impact on school's athletic department finances. Educational Impact: There would be no educational impact nor additional loss of instructional time. Equity Impact: The rule would be the same for both Boys and Girls. It would have no gender bias whatsoever. Effective Date: Summer 2020 Only

2. 2nd Summer Dead Period (NC Track and Cross Country Coaches Association) Attachment P1	To allow workouts during the NCCA Clinic week with the exception of the day in which a specific sport clinic is held. Example: Cross Country clinic is held on Wednesday. Cross County could hold workouts Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.	Rationale: For outdoor fall sports, the additional workout days in July would help athletes become acclimated to the heat as they prepare for mandatory practices beginning August 1. This is keeping in line with the NCHSAA Fundamentals of Heat Prevention and Management for all sports. Budget Impact: It will not affect the individual school's finances. Educational Impact: It will not affect the school day or loss of time. Equity Impact: Equitable. Effective Date: 2020-21 school year.
3. State Qualifying Procedure (Swimming and Diving Advisory Committee)	To change the number of qualifiers from each region from the top 8 to the top 6. In order to maintain the total of 24 state qualifiers, the remaining 6 qualifiers will be the top 6 times from any region.	Rationale: Often times regional are unbalance in terms of quality of competition. The proposal still allows for an equal and reasonable representation from each region while also allowing state championship caliber swimmers/relays to qualify. Budget Impact: N/A Educational Impact: N/A Equity Impact: Proposal impact is the same for males and females. Effective Date: 2020-2021 winter sports season.

RELAY MEET • (1,2) 50 Freestyle • (3,4) 200 Medley Relay • (5,6) 200 Freestyle Relay • (7,8) 4x100 Individual Medley Relay • (9,10) 200 Butterfly Relay • (11,12) 400 Freestyle Relay (8x50) • (13,14) 500 Freestyle Relay: <i>50-100-200-100-50 or 200-150-100-50</i> • (15,16) 200 Backstroke Relay • (17,18) 200 Breaststroke Relay • (19,20) 400 Freestyle Relay (4x100) Qualifying times for events (1,2,3,4,5,6,19,20) are eligible for regional entry.	Rationale: Relay meets are popular and fun for the student athletes. As swimming is typically an individual sport, relays are the only events that the athletes perform as a true team. It is a team building exercise, and promotes team spirit. Budget Impact: The fees charged will be determined by the host team/conference. These fees help offset the costs of a typically non-revenue generating sport. Educational Impact: Meets shall be contested to ensure that no loss of classroom educational time will be required, and that meets minimally impact the study time of participants. PENTATHLON MEET • (1,2) 100 Backstroke • (3,4) 100 Breaststroke • (5,6) 100 Butterfly • (7,8) 100 Freestyle • (9,10) 200 Individual Medley Qualifying times are eligible for regional entry.	Rationale: The winter sports season is relatively short, and surrounds the first semester exam schedule, which affects the participation in at least one meet per season for each team. Pool space is limited, so there are not as many opportunities for athletes to get official times for several events. This meet gives the participants that opportunity. Budget Impact: The fees charged will be determined by the host team/conference. These fees help offset the costs of a typically non-revenue generating sport. Educational Impact: Meets shall be contested to ensure that no loss of classroom educational time will be required, and that meets minimally impact the study time of participants. Lighting Standards Attachment P2	To require member schools to complete a “System Operation and Maintenance Checklist” form on an annual basis to ensure that electrical and structural components of facility lighting systems are up to code with NEC (National Electrical Code) and IBC (International Building Code) standards. • Deadline to complete the Checklist form will be prior to participation in the playoffs but staff recommends conducting annually in summer months when students are absent from campus. • Initial focus on electrical and structural components. Penalty for failure to complete the required Checklist form: The school cannot host a playoff event due to failure to comply with minimum electrical and structural requirements deemed safe for operation.	Rationale: Minimum recommended Lighting Standards have been in place since 1994 for the health and safety of the student-athletes/fans, etc. but no mechanism to ensure that schools are compliant has been in place. Budget Impact: Costs associated with having professional maintenance personnel assess the electrical and structural components for all lighting systems within the respective school’s various facilities, both inside and outside. Costs associated with remedying any deficient electrical and/or structural components to bring them up to IBC and NEC standards. Educational Impact: NA Equity Impact: All schools will be required to conduct the Checklist. Effective Date: In advance of 2020-2021 school year.

Indoor Track and Cross Country are the only sports that are not currently required to attend a ruled clinic. Budget Impact: The NCHSAA penalty code for 1) failure of head coach to attend a required rules clinic: \$400.00 and 2) head coach coaching in contest prior to attending rules clinic: \$500.00. Educational Impact: N/A Equity Impact: Men's and women's Indoor Track and Cross Country coaches would now be held to the same requirements as all other head coaches. Effective Date: 2021-2022 school year.
8. Pre-Participation Examination (Sports Medicine Advisory Committee)	To extend the validity of any PPE dated on or after 4/1/19. • Any student-athlete with a PPE form dated on or after 4/1/19 is not required to obtain a new PPE for the 2020-2021 academic year. • Any student-athlete with a PPE form expiring on or before 3/31/19 will need to obtain a new PPE form before they will be allowed to participate. • Applies to student-athlete participation in school-sponsored practice, competition or skill development.	Rationale: There are potential challenges regarding student-athletes obtaining PPEs for the 2020-2021 academic year. Many athletes will have their PPEs which will expire in the next few weeks/months and with the COVID-19 restrictions many will not have the opportunity to get these renewed. Many communities have mass screening examinations to provide the PPE annually. These are typically completed from April to June each year. The COVID-19 restrictions will preclude this. As the COVID-19 restrictions are lifted there will most likely be a large influx of patients who have had their care postponed for those who will take priority on re-entry into the medical system. Budget Impact: N/A Educational Impact: N/A Equity Impact: Proposal impact is the same for males and females. Effective Date: Immediately

2.2.3(b): The Board of Directors has adopted standards for the lighting of events sponsored by the NCHSAA or any member school.

- (1) These standards incorporate the most current data available regarding the lighting, electrical and structural issues that apply to the installation and maintenance of safe, effective lighting systems.
- (2) These standards were developed by a Standards Advisory Committee made up of experienced engineers, architects, electrical contractors, attorneys and insurance underwriters.
- (3) They are divided into recommended minimums and desirable features. The minimums establish criteria which are important to the safe conduct of sponsored activities. The desirable features are intended to provide guidelines for lighting system that give added values of durability, energy-efficiency, environmental sensitivity and cost effectiveness.
- (4) NCHSAA playoff events are intended to be held at sites that meet the minimum standards.
- (5) A copy of the revised lighting standards may be viewed on the NCHSAA website.

The benefits to schools to meet the minimum lighting standards are significant but the risk of just one injury justifies taking the necessary action to move this program from 'recommended' to 'required'. This is about liability, quality of play, and helping schools understand how they can practically implement best practices.

Schools can be supported with several strategies that would allow them to implement a testing protocol to aid in meeting minimum lighting standards as established by NCHSAA:

1. Schools can implement a testing protocol on their own with current resources, assuming they have the proper equipment (light meters) and trained personnel.
 - a. NCHSAA partner, Musco, will provide support with the necessary forms and templates along with sample reports to provide good understanding of how the testing should be done.
2. Musco can provide regional training workshops that would give schools/personnel the necessary training and resources to conduct their own inspections.
 - a. Musco would conduct these training sessions with licensed electricians at no cost to the schools. These training sessions can also be video-taped for use by schools in the future and discussion regarding what tools are needed (such as light meters, electrical testing meters, etc., which most schools/facility maintenance personnel should have in their tool bags) can be included.
3. Musco can provide a fee-based service utilizing their licensed contractors and staff to conduct the inspections.
 - a. Normally, Musco would see a cost of around \$2,500 for this type of program. However, they believe that there is so much value to the schools, that Musco will test the light levels at no charge, with schools covering the cost of the electrician at a nominal fee.

For example, there may be a minimum fee of \$500.00 for mobilization for 1 field test. For each additional field, there would be an added fee. The value would be to the schools for an easy program to implement, full testing and reporting provided, and ideally, a level of training done that would encourage them to do it on their own in the future. If any funding is available through the NCHSAA, it could be utilized to support the program by reducing cost or incentivizing the first "x" number of schools to schedule the inspections.

- As a starting point, an initial inspection would be prudent to establish a baseline of understanding where the facility stands in relation to the lighting standards.
- Subsequent inspections can be annual for the electrical inspection and bi-annual for light level testing. The biggest concern at this point is electrical safety. However, conducting a comprehensive inspection will go a long way in creating awareness of the current condition of the systems that are in play and for future upgrades to LED as funding becomes available.

- The Board will also have to determine how schools would report back to the Association upon completion of the test. This will support the Associations verification for compliance when playoff games are scheduled.

NCHSAA Academic Requirements

Recommendation/Proposal: (State in detail the recommendation/proposal)

The Principals and member schools in Onslow County respectfully request that the Board of Directors change the definition of “a minimum load of work” as currently defined in Handbook rule 1.2.5 Scholastic Requirements under [a] 1, 2, 3 and 4. Rather than trying to list all of the possible combinations of courses and schedules that might be considered a “minimum load of work”, we proposed that the rule define **a minimum load of work passed from the previous semester as 66% or more of the course opportunities the student attempted during the previous semester. All students should be required to be enrolled in at least 3 courses.** These should be courses that would earn the student credit towards graduation. We would suggest that rules 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 under 1.2.5 [a] remain in place.
