

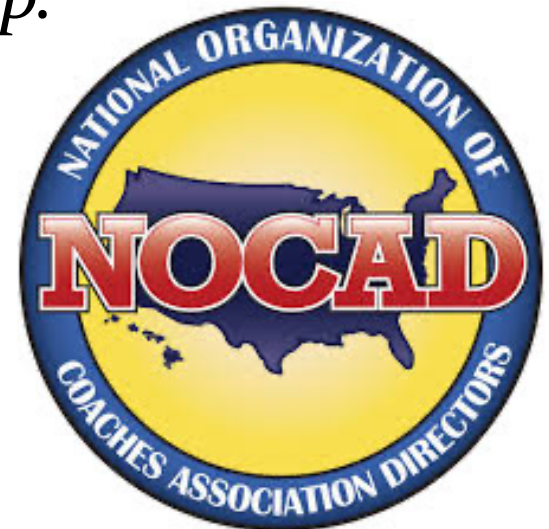

Paralyzed High School Basketball Player Settles for \$3.5 Million

Joe Kay, a former high school basketball star at Arizona's Tucson High Magnet School who suffered a career-ending injury that settled lawsuits against the Tucson school district and two students for \$3.5 million. Kay will receive \$2.9 million from the school district, and \$400,000 from the parents of the two students involved in the tragic incident.

Kay scored a team dunk in the final moments of a title game in February, 2004. Following the victory, the two students, along with other fans rushed the court and tackled Kay in a wild celebration. The crowd's energy was high, causing a stroke that paralyzed his left side.

IN MY OPINION

This injury was the tragic result of a celebration in which the home team was a big game. Celebrating fans did not intend to harm Kay. Kay had accepted a scholarship to play basketball at Stanford University prior to the "celebration." The fans' behavior resulted in a celebration to regain some of his physical strength, including unusual speech therapy.

This unfortunate incident emphasizes why risk management strategies are so important for schools. We recently reported that the Southeastern Conference has instituted a policy to punish member schools when fans rush the floor or field in celebration after big victories. It's too late to say "I'm sorry after people are seriously injured during such celebrations. Strategies and risk management policies for game and post game management should be implemented before the first game is played in each sport.

PENN STATE FINES COACH \$10,000

PENN STATE UNIVERSITY FINE \$10,000 for the women's basketball coach's role after an investigation of charges that Penn State violated university policy regarding discrimination. Jennifer Harris, a former player, stated that Portland told her that she needed to look more feminine. She also said that Portland had a policy that kept women off the team who she believed to be lesbians.

School officials concluded that Portland created an environment that was "hostile, intimidating, and offensive." Harris, who is black, filed a lawsuit against the coach, alleging that she was discriminated against because of her race. The university did not believe Portland discriminated against Harris because of race. Harris later transferred to James Madison University.

Penn State University President Curban Spitzer asked Tim Curley, athletics director, to make the following changes in the women's basketball program administration:

- NCAA standards and interviews of women's basketball players will be conducted by a staff member of the school's athletics action office, in addition to the athletic administrator normally assigned to the interview.
- The athletics director will submit to Spitzer by August 15, 2009, a revised protocol for student-athletes' race interviews that allows for checks and balances.
- Incoming student athletes should attend an informational session coordinated by Penn State's Office of Student Conduct.

Proposed Legislation to Pay College Athletes Defeated

Representative Patrick Smith of Tennessee's South Carolina district introduced a bill to pay college athletes in South Carolina. When the bill went before the House of Representatives, it was killed in 10 seconds by a panel of four members.

The bill proposed that basketball and football players be paid \$100 per month during their season, when practice and games take up a great deal of players' time. Representatives Smith told the panel that "these schools are making millions off these children and using them as slaves."

Years ago, Senator Jesse Chalmers tried hard to pass legislation in Nebraska that would pay athletes who play football and basketball. The bill he proposed was voted down on several occasions. Chalmers is now proposing a three-school system in Nebraska for Blacks, whites, Asians, and Hispanics that would effectively segregate students along racial lines. The proposal has met serious opposition by legislators who feel passage would promote segregation again.
