# 2022 NCHSAA LACROSSE PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

CHAPEL HILL - The North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) finalized and released the playoff brackets for the 2021 Men's and Women's Lacrosse Championships. 2022 Marks the 13th year of the NCHSAA Lacrosse Championships as a sanctioned playoff and championship event.

The State Championship Games will be contested on Friday, May 20 and Saturday, May 21 at Koka Booth Stadium at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary. Play is scheduled to begin at 7:00 on Friday night for a single game with a double header scheduled for Saturday at 11:00 a.m. Tickets to the Championships will be sold through GoFan.

The 2022 NCHSAA Lacrosse Championships will be broadcast live by the NFHS Network. Subscribers can log in to their network accounts and watch all three games or any live event from across the country on the NFHS Network for just \$10.95 per month.

Media outlets seeking to broadcast an NCHSAA Playoff game live must submit the online Broadcast Post-Season Request Form by visiting the Media section of the NCHSAA's website. All forms must be completed at least 24-hours prior to the start of the contest. Rights fees for the broadcast are made payable to the host school of the contest and must be paid prior to the start of a broadcast.

# NCHSAA WOMEN'S LACROSSE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP RECAPS



## 2021 Women's Lacrosse Championship | East Chapel Hill sprints past Weddington 14-8 for second championship

RALEIGH, NC – East Chapel Hill got off to a fast start, netting three goals in the opening eight minutes of play to build an early lead and push on to a 14-8 win over Weddington in the 2021 Women's Lacrosse State Championship Game. The Wildcats got five goals from Riley Ellis and four from Talia Zuco to grab the program's second State Championship.

In addition to her four goals, Zuco was dominant on draws, helping the Wildcats maintain possession after their scores and earning her the game's Most Valuable Player award. Along with Ellis' five goals, the Wildcats got a nice three-goal, two-assist performance from senior Sophie Halus.

After the Warriors got the scoring started as Elektra Koulouris found the back of the net off a feed from Ava Myers three minutes into the contest. That was the only lead the Warriors held in the game. East Chapel Hill scored the next three and six of the next seven goals on their way to a 6-2 lead and cruised from there.

The two teams traded early second-half goals before Weddington's Jordyn Case netted a goal off a free position shot with 15:22 to go in the game. With weather entering the area, the game was suspended for just over two and a half hours with the Wildcats up 12-6. Case finished with a pair of goals and a pair of assists, leading the Warrior efforts.

After the weather delay, each team tacked on a pair of goals, but East Chapel Hill managed to hold possession in their attacking end, forcing the Warrior defenders to chase as the clock dwindled.

Weddington finished the season 17-2. The Warriors were 10-0 in Conference 13 play, winning the league championship. Weddington reached the State Championship for the first time in program history, winning the Western Regional Championship for the first time.

East Chapel Hill finished the season 16-2, earning the conference title in Conference 4 with a perfect 11-0 record. The Wildcats won the program's second Eastern Regional Championship and second State Championship, returning to the State Finals for the first time since beating Charlotte Catholic in 2015.

The NCHSAA is committed to highlighting and promoting outstanding sportsmanship. The Association has partnered with NC Farm Bureau to recognize one individual from each participating team in an NCHSAA State Championship who has demonstrated exemplary sportsmanship throughout the year. This year's winners of the NC Farm Bureau Sportsmanship Awards for the Women's Lacrosse Championship are Mia Farley from Weddington and Riley Akos from East Chapel Hill.

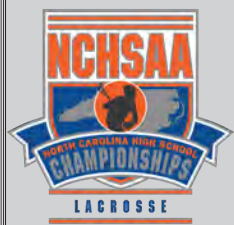

Catholic struggled to mount many offensive possessions in the second half, but were fairly successful when they did reach the attacking end. The Cougars received two goals from Caleigh Brady, and one goal each from Kaitlin Coleman and Kylie Skovira.

Kylie Skovira of Charlotte Catholic grabbed the first goal of the afternoon after 40 seconds of play, giving the Cougars an early 1-0 lead over the Crusaders. The Cougars lead was short lived as Cardinal Gibbons responded within minutes due to a free position goal by Ella Reaves Vaughan of the Crusaders.

The first half remained back and forth with MVP Caroline Kimel scoring two within the half and Ella Reaves Vaughan, Caroline Mullahy, and Catherine Field all scoring one goal each for Cardinal Gibbons. On the Charlotte Catholic side, Katherine Coleman ripped in two goals and Caleigh Brady, Kylie Skovira, and Meghan Lowe all pitched in with one goal each for the Cougars. The teams headed into the locker room with the score tied 6-6 at halftime.

Charlotte Catholic finished 17-5 on the year. The Cougars had a 4-1 record in conference play and made it to the State Championship Match for the fifth time in program in history.

Cardinal Gibbons completed the season with an 18-3 record, while staying undefeated in conference play, 10-0. The Crusaders claimed their fourth consecutive and all-time NCHSAA State Championship.

## 2018 WLAX Championship: Cardinal Gibbons claims their third straight title with a 14-8 victory over Charlotte Catholic

CARY, NC – In a game that started out very tightly, Cardinal Gibbons used a 6-1 run late in the first half that extended into the opening minutes of the second half to stretch out a lead and outpace Charlotte Catholic 14-8. The Crusaders claimed their third straight state championship with a dominating performance in the draw circle and offensively.

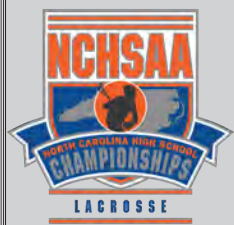
Charlotte Catholic grabbed the lead just more than a minute in as Megan Flesch popped a shot in with 23:56 to go in the half on a free position shot opportunity to give the Cougars a 1-0 lead. About a minute and a half later, Gibbons tied the score as Grace Nelson ripped a shot in off a feed from Catherine Field to tie the game. The goal was one of three for Nelson on the day, who was also dominant on draws, helping Gibbons to a 14-10 edge in establishing possession. Nelson was named the game's Most Valuable Player.

After the two teams traded a couple goals in the first half, Kylie Skovira scored the first of her three goals to help Charlotte Catholic tie the game at 4 with 4:04 to go in the first half. Gibbons answered with the next six goals of the game, three to close the first half and three to open the second. The six goals were all scored by different players and pushed the Gibbons advantage to 9-4 with 21:08 to go in the game.

Blake Palmer kept the Cougars in the game, making nine saves while facing 31 shots from the Crusaders. Cardinal Gibbons kept the pressure on most of the contest, winning the groundball battle substantially and outshooting the Cougars 29-15.

Charlotte Catholic finished the season 14-5. The Cougars made the program's fifth appearance in the NCHSAA State Championships after winning the Western Regional Final for the fifth time in school history.

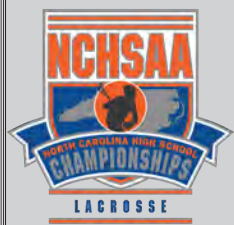

## **2016 WLAX Championship: Cardinal Gibbons wins first Women's LAX Title behind Skowron's 8 goals**

CARY, N.C. - Cardinal Gibbons jumped out to a three goal advantage, and senior Erica Skowron had two of the game's first three goals, the other was scored by senior Crusader attacker Morgan Winstead. Lake Norman called time out to regroup and that's when Emily Chironna put in the Wildcats first marker of the day.

In the end, Skowron was just too much for the Wildcats to handle as she poured in eight goals on the afternoon and added two assists. She was named the game's Most Valuable Player as the Crusaders won their first Women's Lacrosse State Championship in school history.

Gibbons responded immediately as Jordan Lappin stepped in to win a draw and Cassie New poured in her only goal of the game with 7:16 to play, making the score 16-14. Lappin and teammate Elizabeth Wilson tacked on two more for the Crusaders to close out the scoring.

Lappin had four goals for the Crusaders, adding two assists. Wilson had three goals and a pair of assists. Winstead had a goal and two assists for the Crusaders. Forbes Collier had a first half goal to round out the scoring for Cardinal Gibbons.

For Lake Norman, Kieran Rinaldi led the Wildcats with five goals, Carly Vaccaro scored four times adding an assist, Chironna and Vanessa Grauds had two goals each, and Dworschak added a single marker and two assists.

## **2015 WLAX Championship: Lake Norman Nips Cardinal Gibbons In OT To Win NCHSAA Women's Lacrosse**

CARY – Sophomore attack player Kieran Rinaldi scored two goals in overtime as Lake Norman edged Raleigh Cardinal Gibbons 17-15 in the North Carolina High School Athletic Association's sixth annual state women's lacrosse championship Saturday afternoon at WakeMed Soccer Park.

The game was knotted at 13-13 with 2:15 to play as Lake Norman moved the ball around and ran the clock down, and Rinaldi

scored with 18 seconds to go to put the Lady Wildcats up 14-13. But Gibbons countered with an amazing goal by Erica Skowron just before the final horn to send the game into overtime.

Two three-minute overtimes ensued, with Lake Norman forging a 16-15 lead in the first stanza on goals by Carly Vaccaro and Rinaldi, and then Rinaldi's final goal with 1:42 to go in the second OT period put the Lady Wildcats ahead by the final margin.

No more than two goals separated the teams throughout the first half, which ended in a 5-5 deadlock. Lake Norman opened up a 9-6 lead early in the second half before the Crusaders came back.

Vaccaro finished the day with six goals to end the season with a whopping 87. Rinaldi tallied five times and Julianna Dworschak had three goals.

Jordan Lappin of Gibbons was chosen the Most Valuable Player of the championship with six goals and two assists to end the season with 90 goals. Skowron tallied four times for the Crusaders and Sarah Comstock had three.

Lake Norman outshot Gibbons 36-17 and had a commanding 22-11 edge in draw controls.

Both teams have been in the playoffs in each of the six years the NCHSAA has had a women's championship. Lake Norman won its first NCHSAA state title in the sport and finished the season with an 18-2 record. Gibbons, in its first women's final, wound up 19-2 overall.

The women's lacrosse state championships are currently conducted as an "open" tournament, with all classifications competing for a single crown.

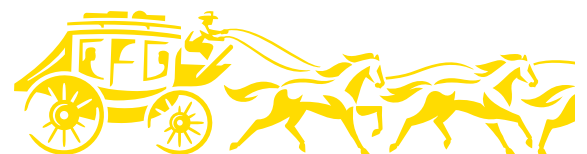

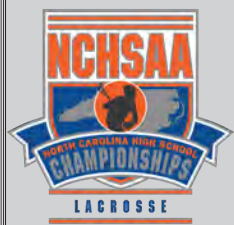

## **2021 1A/2A/3A Men's Lacrosse Championship | Marvin Ridge races away from East Chapel Hill to win their second title**

RALEIGH, NC – Marvin Ridge sprinted out to a three-goal lead in the first three minutes of the game thanks to a hat trick by Emmett Houlihan to open the scoring. The Mavericks added three more in the opening frame and held East Chapel Hill at arms' length the rest of the game on their way to a 14-6 victory and the school's second State Championship in Men's Lacrosse.

Houlihan and Reid Smith stole the show for the Mavericks, each scoring three goals and dishing an assist in the opening half. Houlihan was selected as the match's Most Valuable Player, finishing with six goals and two assists in the game.

East Chapel Hill made a run in the second quarter on the back of Alec Levy to get back in the contest. Levy scored a pair of unassisted markers in the quarter and slipped a nifty feed to Nicholas Castro to get the Wildcats on the board and pull them within four at the half.

The Wildcats tacked on the first goal of the second half when Seiji Stanford slipped one past the Maverick keeper at the 5:39 mark of the third to make it 7-4. But Marvin Ridge answered with four straight goals to close the quarter and carry a comfortable 11-4 lead into the final frame.

East Chapel Hill finished the season 10-5. The Wildcats were 3-1 in Conference 10 league play, winning the conference title. The Wildcats won the Eastern Regional Championship for the third time in program history and returned to the State Championship Game for the first time since 2018.

The Mavericks finished their year with a 15-3 record, 7-1 in Conference 17 play, winning the league championship. Marvin Ridge won the Western Regional Championship for the second time in program history, claiming the second State Title in Men's Lacrosse for the school. Their previous title came in 2016 when they defeated Carrboro 16-3 in the 1A/2A/3A Championship.

## **2021 4A Men's Lacrosse Championship | Cardinal Gibbons rushes past Hough 14-5 for fifth title**

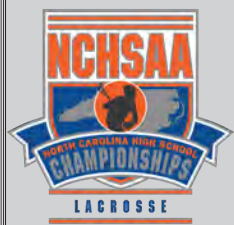
RALEIGH, NC – Cardinal Gibbons picked up their fifth State Championship in Men's Lacrosse with a 14-5 victory over Hough. The Crusaders got five goals from Bryce Wojnovich to win the 4A Championship for the second year in a row.

Hough grabbed the lead right off the opening faceoff as Ryan Scanlon scooted into the offensive zone and slipped the game's first shot by the Crusader keeper to put the Huskies in front just 23 seconds into the contest. The two teams traded first-period goals, with Griffin Cooling and Caden Zadell finding the net for Gibbons, while Peyton Turner added a marker for Hough to get through the opening frame with a 2-2 tie.

After the opening period, 4A Championship Game Most Valuable Player, Wojnovich, found the back of the net just 29 seconds into the second quarter, with Hank Kelso tallying one of his two Crusader goals about two minutes later to give Gibbons a 4-2 advantage. Hough trimmed the Crusader lead to just one at the 3:47 mark in the second, with Peyton Turner netting his second of four. Wojnovich finished the half with another pair of goals, both unassisted, to give the Crusaders a comfortable 6-3 lead at the half.

Gibbons turned up the defensive pressure for long stretches of the night, using an effective double team in the offensive zone to force many of the Huskies 26 turnovers in the game while com-

mitting just 10 of their own. Six of those turnovers were forced by Gibbons' long stick midfielder Daniel Enoch, who also had a goal and an assist in the game.

After a Turner goal opened the second half, scoring with 8:18 to go in the third trimming the Gibbons lead to 6-4, the Crusaders answered with the next seven goals to take control. The decisive seven-goal run for Gibbons was highlighted by another two goals from Wojnovich, one in the third period and another in the fourth that capped his night in style with an over-the-shoulder shot to the twine to put Gibbons up 12-4 with 8:51 to play.

Hough wrapped up the year 13-3 on the season and the champions of Conference 16. For the first time in program history, the Huskies won the Western Regional Finals, appearing in the school's first State Championship Game.

Cardinal Gibbons season concluded 16-0, winning Conference 5. The Crusaders won the program's sixth Eastern Regional Championship, grabbing an NCHSAA record fifth Men's Lacrosse State Championship. The title was the program's second title in a row after winning the 4A Title in 2019.

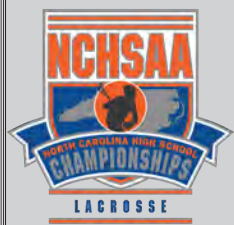

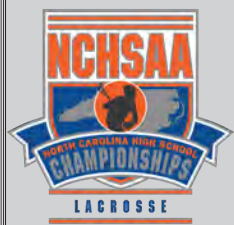

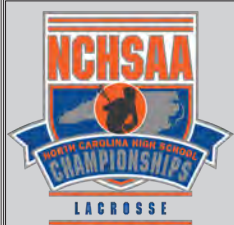

## 2016 1A/2A/3A MLAX Championship: Marvin Ridge sprints past Carrboro

CARY, N.C. - Marvin Ridge (14-7) scored early and often to race past Carrboro 16-3 in the 1A/2A/3A Men's Lacrosse Championship Game at WakeMed Soccer Stadium in Cary, winning the school's first Men's Lacrosse title in three trips to the state finals.

Cam Renner was hot early as he put the Mavericks on the board just two minutes into the contest, and would add three more goals in the first quarter to lift Marvin Ridge past Carrboro. Renner finished the game with five goals and four assists on the night as he was named the game's most valuable player.

Marvin Ridge scored the game's first 11 goals, and led 11-0 at halftime. Carrboro (15-2) got on the board in the third period right out of halftime scoring a goal on a man advantage in the opening minute of the quarter when Logan Marro broke the ice for the Jaguars. He would add one more goal on the night, finishing with two of the Jaguars three markers on the night. Chad Osborne had the other goal for Carrboro.

The Mavericks made their third straight appearance in the 1A/2A/3A Men's Championship game, and finally broke through to win the championship after tough losses to Cardinal Gibbons in each of the last two years, including a heart-breaking 13-12 overtime decision in last year's final.

## 2016 4A MLAX Championship: Gibbons starts fast, defeats Lake Norman 14-8

CARY, N.C. - Cardinal Gibbons jumped in front early, turning up the pressure on Lake Norman in a 7-0 first quarter that saw the Crusaders hold Lake Norman without a shot in the period. The Crusaders went on to win 14-8, hoisting their third straight men's lacrosse championship, and their first at the 4A level.

The Crusaders poured on the pressure, outshooting Lake Norman 38-27 on the day. They also dominated in the faceoff circle, winning 16 faceoffs of the 20 total on the day. Crusader faceoff man, Trevor Kirsch, was named the game's MVP. He was 16-7 at the faceoff spot. Gibbons on the day was 17-8 in faceoffs for the day.

Mark Schachte from Gibbons scored four goals on five shots for the Crusaders in his final high school game. Kevin Barry and Jack Shelton each chipped in three goals on the day. Anthony Digirolamo had a pair of goals and Charles Van Dyke and Jack Biestek each added a single goal on the afternoon.

Lake Norman trailed 8-0 before Jakob Sawicki tallied in the second quarter to break the ice. They added two more in the frame before Cardinal Gibbons scored at the halftime horn to take a 10-3 lead into the break. Sawicki added two more goals on the afternoon for a total of three. Jake Hogan added two late goals for the Wildcats and Duncan Heredia and Blake Lecky both chipped in single goals.

Wesley Wagner had 12 saves for the Crusaders on the afternoon and was solid in goal all afternoon. Gibbons won the ground ball battle 46-40.

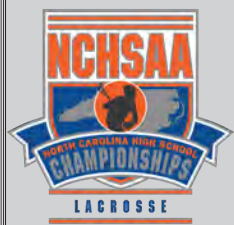
## 2015 1A/2A/3A MLAX Championship: Forbes Goal In Sudden Death Leads Cardinal Gibbons Past Marvin Ridge

CARY – Senior Nick Forbes scored the winning goal in sudden death overtime to lift Raleigh Cardinal Gibbons to an exciting 13-12 victory over Waxhaw Marvin Ridge on Saturday afternoon in the North Carolina High School Athletic Association's state men's 1-A/2-A/3-A lacrosse championship at WakeMed Soccer Park.

Gibbons dominated possession in the overtime, taking several shots and then forcing Maverick turnovers when Marvin Ridge finally got the ball, before Forbes found the back of the net for the game winner. The Crusader standout had a monster game with four goals and seven assists and was named the championship Most Valuable Player.

Marvin Ridge led 8-6 at halftime but Gibbons scored two goals in the first minute of the third quarter and then took the lead with 7:22 left in the period. The Mavericks came back to lead by three in the fourth quarter before Gibbons battled back again, getting the equalizer by Mark Schachte on a great pass from Forbes with just 22 seconds remaining to force overtime.

For the game Gibbons had 47 shots, 25 on goal, to 32 for the Mavericks with 17 on goal. Gibbons also had a huge 48-23 edge in ground balls.

Another key to the Cardinal Gibbons victory was the play of Stephen Albright on face offs in the second half, as he won 12 of 13 after halftime.

Schachte scored five goals for the winners, with Forbes assisting on all five of those goals. Camden Porta led the Marvin Ridge scoring with three goals while Shane Hanlon, Jared Blum and Jack Rich had two each. Blum also had two assists.

Gibbons, winning its second straight NCHSAA men's lacrosse title, ended the season with a 17-4 record and has been in the playoffs in every year the NCHSAA has had lacrosse. The Crusaders also have a postseason record of 17-4 all-time and made their third trip to the championship.

Marvin Ridge wound up 18-2 in its second straight trip to the finals, having lost to Gibbons 11-8 in last year's final.

This was the second year in the six-year history of NCHSAA men's lacrosse playoffs that there were championships, with a separate 4-A final and then the 1-A/2-A/3-A championship.

## **2015 4A MLAX Championship: Apex Nips Charlotte Catholic**

CARY – Apex built a solid lead and then held off a furious comeback by Charlotte Catholic to take a narrow 7-6 victory Friday night in the North Carolina High School Athletic Association's state 4-A men's lacrosse championship at WakeMed Soccer Park.

Senior midfielder Nick Greco of Apex scored two goals and handed out two assists, earning the Most Valuable Player award for the championship.

It was a rematch of last year's championship which was won by Catholic 11-8.

Greco, Jack Hayden, and Chandler Besser each scored two goals for Apex, with Hayden finishing the season with a total of 48 goals. Besser also had two assists.

Apex led most of the way, holding a 4-1 lead at the half, and was up 6-3 with 10 minutes to play before Catholic mounted a rally. A goal by Seamus Bryne pulled Catholic to within 6-5 with 7:20 to go.

The Charlotte team in the battle of Cougars had the ball down 7-6 with 1:36 to play but could not score, with Apex finally taking possession in the final seconds. However, Catholic had a whopping 39-14 advantage in shots, with an 18-10 edge in shots on goal. Seamus Byrne had two goals to lead the Catholic scoring.

Charlotte Catholic ended the year with a 20-3 record and was making its second consecutive trip to an NCHSAA men's lacrosse final.

Apex wound up 20-2 and was in the championship for the fourth time in the tournament's six-year history, with a win in the 2013 state championship. The Cougars have compiled an outstanding 22-4 mark all-time in NCHSAA playoff action.
