

# 2022 NCHSAA BASEBALL PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

CHAPEL HILL - The North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) finalized and released the playoff brackets for the 2022 Baseball Championships. The tournament has four classifications of play with six playoff rounds each and a full complement of 64 teams per classification. The fifth round will be the Regional Finals and will be a best-of-three series. The State Championship will also be a best-of-three series.

The NCHSAA has secured two host sites for the 2022 Baseball State Championship Series. Once again, Burlington's Burlington Athletic Park will host two championship series while NC State's Doak Field at Dail Park will host a pair of state championship series. State Championship Series will still be a best-of-three format with opening games of each series scheduled for Friday night and the remainder of a series scheduled on Saturday, June 4th at the respective sites. The site assignments and championship schedule will be announced following completion of the Regional Championships.

Each game of the 2022 NCHSAA Baseball State Championship Series will be broadcast live by the NFHS Network. Network subscribers can watch NCHSAA Championships live and on-demand as well as playoff and championship action from other state associations across the country. Subscriptions are just \$10.95 for a month. Media outlets seeking to broadcast an NCHSAA Playoff game live must submit the online Broadcast Post-Season Request Form by visiting the Media section of the NCHSAA's website. All forms must be completed at least 24-hours prior to the start of the contest. A list of approved broadcasts will be posted on the NCHSAA Homepage prior to game day. Rights fees for the broadcast are made payable to the host school of the contest and must be paid prior to the start of a broadcast.

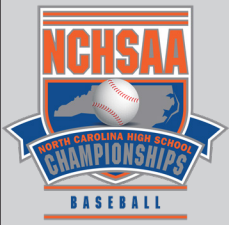

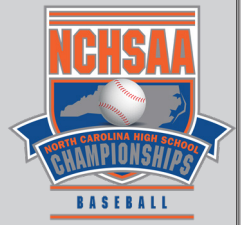

## 1A Championship Game 1 Recap | Perquimans walks off East Surry 5-4 in 10 innings

Having just finished his third scoreless inning of work on the mound, Tanner Thach helped his own cause and drove a leadoff double to left center to open the 10th inning. It proved to be a crucial blow when Jackson Russell slapped a one-out single to left, plating his second RBI of the game and driving in the courtesy runner for Thach, M. Byrum, to close out the game 5-4.

Thach was nearly flawless on the mound in Game 1, striking out seven without a walk while allowing just a single hit. His mound work backed up Landon Gregory who threw 4.2 innings allowing just two runs on two hits after the resumption of play on Sunday.

East Surry led through the overnight suspension, plating a pair of runs in the top of the second. After a leadoff single for Folger Boaz in the second, Evan McCreary drove him home to draw first blood with a line single to right. Anthony Ayers added an RBI groundout for the second run of the inning, giving the Cardinals a 2-0 lead.

Perquimans answered with one run in the bottom of the third when Jett Winslow drove a ball for a single to left, pushing home a run and cutting the East Surry lead in half with runners on the corners and one away in the inning. That's when the rain began to fall and play was suspended for the night.

On the resumption of play, Thach worked the count full before doubling to center field and pushing home both runners to put the Pirates up 3-2. The Cardinals answered with a pair of their own in the top of the fifth, Luke Bowman doubled in two runs with two outs to surge back in front 4-3.

Russell also drove in the tying run in the sixth when Trey Armstrong dropped what would have been a sacrifice fly, scoring Thach and cutting down Mason Byrum at third on what was scored a fielder's choice.

## Game 2 Recap | Thach closes the door on East Surry, Pirates hold on for 7-5 victory

Tanner Thach came in to protect a three-run lead in the seventh inning, and while things were a bit dicey for the powerful left-hander, he got the job done, stranding the tying runs in scoring position after putting them at second and third with just one out. Thach struck out the final two batters of the game to preserve the two-run lead and pick up the save in a 7-5 Perquimans win over East Surry.

The top of the sixth was the decisive inning, with Perquimans getting a leadoff double from Trenton Sawyer. Colby Brown followed that up with a bunt single, advancing the courtesy runner Mason Byrum to third. Byrum scored on a one-out wild pitch to give the Pirates a 5-4 lead before Macon and Jett Winslow both drew walks to load the bases. Thach drew a bases-loaded walk, pushing across the second run of the frame and putting Perquimans up 6-4. Jacob Meads singled to left to push another run across and give the Pirates a 7-4 lead.

The Pirates opened the scoring early, plating one in the top of the first as Macon Winslow stole third and the throw to try and get him squirted into left field allowing him to scamper home for the first run of the game. East Surry managed to even the game at 1 with a run in the bottom of the frame.

Perquimans picked up another run in the second when Colby Brown doubled to center plating Russell. Brown was tagged out between second and third trying to advance, and Folger Boaz managed to get weak contact from the Pirates hitters for the final two outs of the second to prevent further damage in the inning.

The Cardinals hung three on the board in the second as a bases-loaded, two-out, infield single by Benji Gosnell plated the tying run, evening the game at two. The pitcher Boaz slapped a line drive single to right, scoring two and putting the Cardinals up 4-2.

Perquimans opened the fourth with three straight singles before Jackson Russell scored on an error by Boaz in the fourth. After surrendering the single run, Boaz struck out the side. The Pirates knotted the game in the fifth thanks to a leadoff single by Thach, who advanced to third on a passed ball followed by a wild pitch. He came home on a sacrifice fly by Landon Gregory, tying the game at four.

## 2A Championship Game 1 | Seven-run third lifts Randleman past R-S Central 9-5

BURLINGTON – R-S Central struck first in Game 1 of the 2021 2A Baseball State Championship Series, but Randleman struck back with fury in a seven-run third inning that lifted the Tigers to a 9-5 opening game win over the Hilltoppers at Burlington Athletic Stadium. In a game that saw 20 hits between the two teams, and coaches having to piece together their pitching to get through the game, it was Randleman's offense that got the most out of their side on their way to victory.

It was Xavier Toms, hitting in the eighth spot in the order, who powered the R-S Central attack, going 3 for 4 and driving in a pair of runs on a pair of RBI singles. Toms trimmed the Randleman lead to 9-5 in the top of the fifth with two outs, but that was as close as the Hilltoppers could get as Freshman Pitcher Jake Purvis shut the door on any hope of a comeback with 1.2 innings of scoreless and hitless baseball, striking out three.

## 2A Championship Game 2 | R-S Central forces Game 3, holding off Randleman 2-1

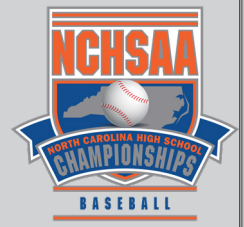
BURLINGTON – R-S Central forced across single runs in the second and third innings and got a phenomenal performance on the mound from junior Trip Triplett to hold off Randleman 2-1 and push the 2A Baseball State Championship Series to a decisive Game 3 tonight.

Triplett limited the powerful Tiger offense to just one run on six hits while striking out seven. He did not issue a walk during his 6.1 innings of work before passing the baton off to Kael Snethen who got the save by picking up the final two outs.

Snethen also played a key role offensively for the Hilltoppers, going one

for three out of the leadoff spot in the order, ripping a homer to left field to lead off the bottom of the third and put R-S Central back in front 2-1 after Randleman had tied the game in the top of the inning.

R-S Central scratched across the first run of the game in the second when Cameron Hill singled to open the inning and scored on an RBI single to center by Gavin Bright. Randleman got their lone run in the third after Kaden Ethier doubled to right and he came home on a two-out, RBI single to right by Trey Way that knotted the game at 1.

## **2A Game 3 | Randleman's White no-hits R-S Central to bring the Tigers their second state title**

BURLINGTON – Ryan White pitched a nearly flawless game, striking out 11 and walking two as he no-hit R-S Central in the final game of the 2A State Baseball Championship Series, winning 4-0. Randleman's win gives the Tigers their second State Championship in program history, the first since 2011. White was selected as the 2A State Championship Series MVP for his performance in the decisive Game 3.

R-S Central was nearly as good on the mound but could not contain Randleman in the bottom of the third inning. The Tigers struck for all four of their runs in the bottom of the third, doing all their damage with one out in the inning.

Kaden Ethier started the decisive rally with a single to center and Owen Strickland drew a walk before Trey Way singled to load the bases, setting the table for the Tigers. Hunter Atkins drew first blood, singling to center scoring a pair, chasing Hilltoppers' starting pitcher Hayden Wheeler.

Kael Snethen came in for R-S Central and finished the game on the mound. He was greeted as Brooks Brannon doubled to bring in two more and push the Tigers' lead to 4-0, both runs charged to Wheeler. For his part, Snethen only allowed three hits and did not walk a batter in the final 3.2 innings, giving R-S Central a chance late, but the Hilltoppers' bats could not get going against White, as they went down in order in each of the final three innings.

R-S Central finished the season 17-4, they were 11-1 in the Southwestern 2A, winning the conference championship. The Hilltoppers reached the State Championship Series for the second time in program history, winning their second Western Regional Championship, their first since 2017.

Randleman claimed the program's second State Championship. It was their first since 2011. The Tigers were 19-2 on the season. They were a perfect 12-0 in the PAC 7 2A, claiming the league crown.

## **3A Championship Game 1 | J.H. Rose races to 8-1 series opening win over Cox Mill**

FAYETTEVILLE – Lee Watson went the distance for J.H. Rose, pitching a complete game against Cox Mill to lead the Rampants to an 8-1 victory in Game 1 of the 3A State Championship Series. The Rampants only managed five hits but capitalized on eight walks and five Charger errors to walk away a win away from a State Championship.

Rose opened the scoring with three in the bottom of the second. The Rampants got going with a leadoff single by Cam Greenway followed by an RBI double by Caleb May. May later scored on a wild pitch before Jayden Grimes reached on a dropped third strike which allowed another

run home. Rose tacked on a pair of runs in both the fourth and fifth innings to give themselves some cushion heading to the late innings.

Grimes went one for three for the Rampants but drove in a pair of runs and scored another, as the offensive star for J.H. Rose. Watson did his part on the mound, striking out seven while allowing seven hits and a single earned run.

## **3A Championship Game 2 | J.H. Rose sweeps Cox Mill with 9-4 victory**

FAYETTEVILLE – It took a little longer than expected but returning to Fayetteville for Sunday's Game 2 after rain pushed the schedule back proved worth the trip for J.H. Rose. The Rampants pushed past Cox Mill 9-4 in Game 2 of the series to earn a sweep and the program's sixth Baseball State Championship. The victory gave the Rampants their first title since 2008.

Cox Mill jumped out to an early 3-0 lead but could not hold off the powerful Rose attack, which pounded out 11 hits and nine runs in the game. The Chargers opened the scoring in the second inning Kyle Cassell homered to left with two outs in the innings. It was a solo shot, giving the Chargers a 1-0 advantage. They added another two runs in the third as Cale Oehler drove in a run with a two-out single to center before Nick Alderfer came around to make it 3-0 when Joe Javier grounded out to first and Marty Gair was caught in a rundown.

Rose responded immediately in the top of the fourth, scoring five runs to surge in front 5-3. After a pair of walks to lead off the inning, Wade Jarman singled in the first Rampant run ahead of an RBI double by Cam Greenway that made it 3-2. Caleb May powered a sacrifice fly to center to bring Jarman home and knot the game at three. Cole Watkins then singled home the go-ahead run before Danny Sadler tripled to bring him in completing the five-run rally.

Cox Mill scratched one run across in the fourth, trimming the Rose lead to 5-4. Jack Brandle drove in a run on a fly-out to center field, but that would be the closest the Chargers could get. In the top of the fifth, Ryker Galaska reached on an error, the sixth of the series for Cox Mill, to lead off the inning. That set the table for Grayson Myrick, who made no mistake in driving an 0-1 pitch out of the park to left to put Rose up 7-4.

Danny Sadler was named the 3A Baseball State Championship Series MVP going two for six in the series with a triple, two walks, three runs scored, and two RBI to help J.H. Rose past Cox Mill.

## **4A Championship Game 1 | Reagan pounds Fuquay-Varina 7-0 behind Boyd's no-hitter**

BURLINGTON – Reagan's Carter Boyd dominated from the mound, pitching a complete game, no-hitter in Game 1 of the 2021 4A State Championship Series to launch the Raiders to a 7-0 win and a 1-0 series advantage against Fuquay-Varina.

Boyd was nearly flawless in the game, striking out 11 Bengal batters. He did walk four, but Fuquay-Varina only managed to push a runner to third

in the sixth inning, and only three total runners reached second in the game. Boyd also drove in a run in the game batting in the cleanup spot in the order.

Reagan jumped on the board in the top of the first with Josh Hartle's single plating Tommy Hawke from second base to put the Raiders up 1-0. Reagan put the game away in the second plating five runs on four hits with two walks and a hit by pitch opening the door for a big inning, chasing Bengals starter Colbie Howell who only lasted 1.2 innings surrendering six hits and six runs.

The Raiders scored the game's only other run in the third when Zack Middleton stepped on the plate thanks to a single by Colby Welborn. Welborn's single stretched the Reagan lead to 7-0 and provided some insurance.

## **4A Championship Game 2 | Fuquay-Varina explodes for 13 runs to force decisive Game 3 with Reagan**

BURLINGTON – Carter Boyd from Reagan dominated Game 1, but the Fuquay-Varina bats woke up and dominated Game 2, pounding out 17 hits and plating 13 runs on their way to a 13-3 victory over Reagan in Game 2 of the 4A State Championship best-of-three Series.

Rhett James got Fuquay-Varina off to a quick start, scoring the game's first run in the top of the first. James doubled to lead off the game, coming around to score when Aidan Cannaday singled to right with one out. James scored four times in the game, going three for four at the plate with a walk and an RBI. Cannaday, for his part, was two for five with three RBI's as the Bengals lineup mashed Reagan pitching.

Senior third baseman Parker McGraw showed his offensive prowess, driving in five runs, including a three-run homer to left in the third. He finished the game three for four with a run scored and a walk.

Cyle Phelan was outstanding for the Bengals, spinning six innings of three-hit ball from the mound. Phelan allowed three runs, two of them earned, while striking out three and walking five. After being no-hit in the series opener by Reagan star, Carter Boyd, the Bengals rebounded in the final two games of the series to post 32 hits and score 25 runs.

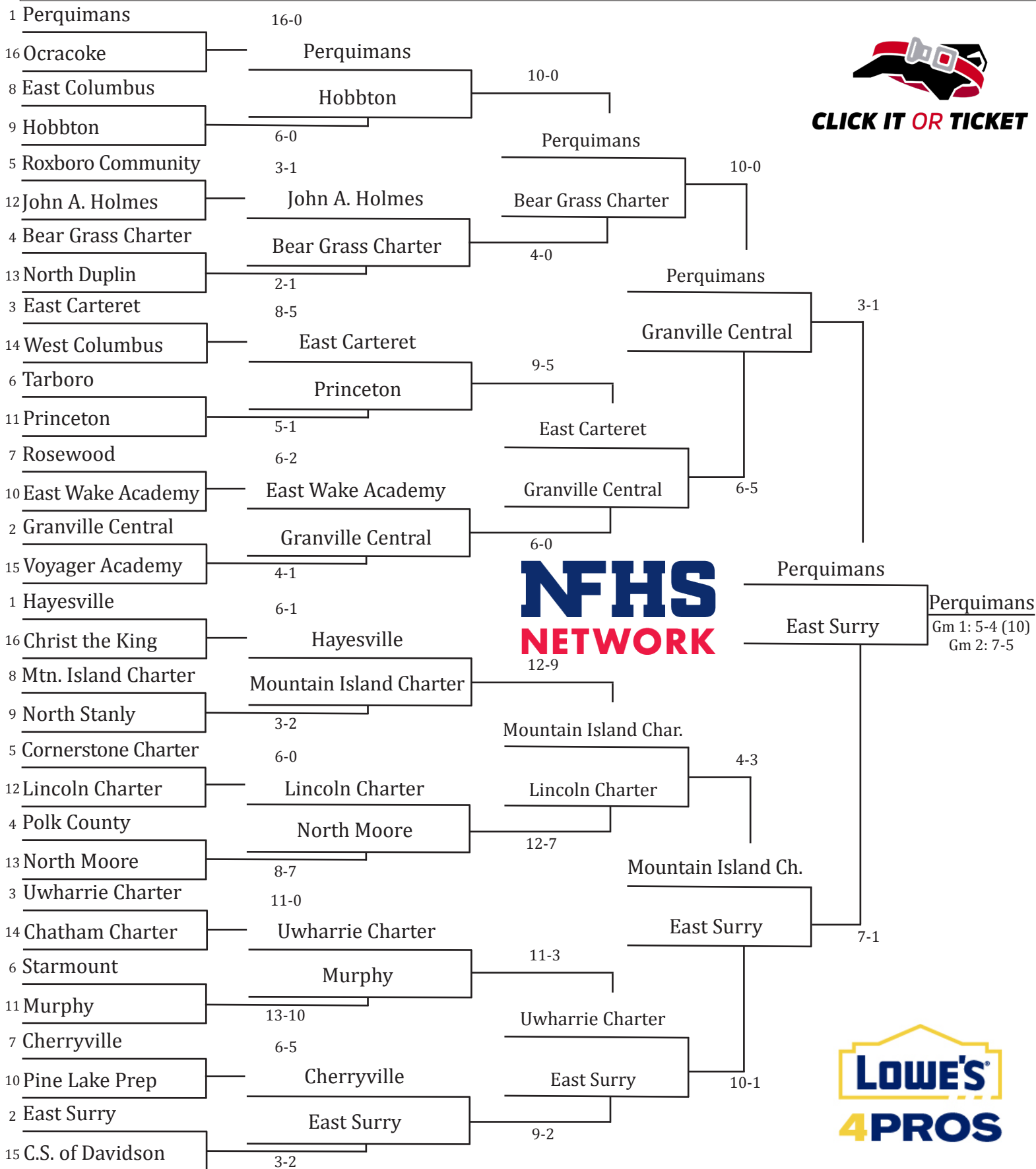

## **1A Baseball Game 1: Uwharrie Charter holds off Rosewood 6-4 to take Game 1**

ZEBULON, NC – After sleeping on a 2-0 lead overnight during the suspension of play for inclement weather, Uwharrie Charter fell behind early after the resumption of play when Rosewood tacked on three runs in the first two innings played on Saturday. Uwharrie Charter responded with a pair of runs in the fifth and another two in the seventh to hold off Rosewood 6-4 and take Game 1 of the 2019 NCHSAA 1A Baseball Championship Series.

Uwharrie jumped out to an early 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning as a pair of one-out walks came around to score on a Lanier double to the gap in right center. Play was then suspended for the night after inclement weather moved into the area following the completion of the top of the second.

Series Most Valuable Player Spencer Lanier went 2 for 4 with three RBI's in the Game 2 win, adding to his 4 for 4, 2 RBI performance in the opening game. Lanier gave Uwharrie the lead for the first time in Game 2 as he ripped a 2-RBI single to right to push Uwharrie ahead 2-1. He added an RBI single in the fourth that extended the Uwharrie advantage to 6-1.

Uwharrie broke the game open in the fourth, scoring seven runs as Braylen Hayes led off the inning with a single. Sniffen was named the series Most Valuable Player for his contributions in the series. In addition to his pitching line in Game 2, Sniffen was 1 for 4 at the plate in the finale. In the series opener, he was 2 for 3 at the dish, with a walk and an RBI, as he hit a towering homer to left that smashed into the jumbotron about three-quarters of the way up the video board.

New Hanover only managed two hits through the first three innings, without plating a run. However, Marvin Ridge was not able to get anything going during those frames either. Mooresville scored four runs in the bottom of the third inning to grab the lead 4-2 and never looked back on the way to an 8-2 Game 2 victory.

Corinth Holders jumped out to a 2-0 lead again in Game 2, plating a pair of runs in the top of the third inning. The Pirates got a leadoff single from Dalton Wood and a single by Tanner Smith to open the inning. Then Wood came home on a throwing error by the catcher as Smith attempted to steal second. Five pitches later the Pirates plated another run with Smith crossing the plate on a passed ball to go up 2-0.

Mooresville responded in the third as John Faulkenberry and Jackson Brant both walked to open the inning. Then Trevor McHouell placed a bunt single that loaded the bases and the Blue Devils knotted the score at two on a double to right by Cameron Clonch. Then Davis Turner singled back up the middle to score two more and give Mooresville a 4-2 lead they did not relinquish.
