

2022 NCHSAA BASEBALL PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

CHAPEL HILL - The North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) finalized and released the playoff brackets for the 2022 Baseball Championships. The tournament has four classifications of play with six playoff rounds each and a full complement of 64 teams per classification. The fifth round will be the Regional Finals and will be a best-of-three series. The State Championship will also be a best-of-three series.

The NCHSAA has secured two host sites for the 2022 Baseball State Championship Series. Once again, Burlington's Burlington Athletic Park will host two championship series while NC State's Doak Field at Dail Park will host a pair of state championship series. State Championship Series will still be a best-of-three format with opening games of each series scheduled for Friday night and the remainder of a series scheduled on Saturday, June 4th at the respective sites. The site assignments and championship schedule will be announced following completion of the Regional Championships.

Each game of the 2022 NCHSAA Baseball State Championship Series will be broadcast live by the NFHS Network. Network subscribers can watch NCHSAA Championships live and on-demand as well as playoff and championship action from other state associations across the country. Subscriptions are just \$10.95 for a month. Media outlets seeking to broadcast an NCHSAA Playoff game live must submit the online Broadcast Post-Season Request Form by visiting the Media section of the NCHSAA's website. All forms must be completed at least 24-hours prior to the start of the contest. A list of approved broadcasts will be posted on the NCHSAA Homepage prior to game day. Rights fees for the broadcast are made payable to the host school of the contest and must be paid prior to the start of a broadcast.



Russell also drove in the tying run in the sixth when Trey Armstrong dropped what would have been a sacrifice fly, scoring Thach and cutting down Mason Byrum at third on what was scored a fielder's choice.

Game 2 Recap | Thach closes the door on East Surry, Pirates hold on for 7-5 victory $\,$

Tanner Thach came in to protect a three-run lead in the seventh inning, and while things were a bit dicey for the powerful left-hander, he got the job done, stranding the tying runs in scoring position after putting them at second and third with just one out. Thach struck out the final two batters of the game to preserve the two-run lead and pick up the save in a 7-5 Perquimans win over East Surry.

The top of the sixth was the decisive inning, with Perquimans getting a leadoff double from Trenton Sawyer. Colby Brown followed that up with a bunt single, advancing the courtesy runner Mason Byrum to third. Byrum scored on a one-out wild pitch to give the Pirates a 5-4 lead before Macon and Jett Winslow both drew walks to load the bases. 2A Championship Game 1 | Seven-run third lifts Randleman past R-S Central 9-5

BURLINGTON – R-S Central struck first in Game 1 of the 2021 2A Baseball State Championship Series, but Randleman struck back with fury in a seven-run third inning that lifted the Tigers to a 9-5 opening game win over the Hilltoppers at Burlington Athletic Stadium. In a game that saw 20 hits between the two teams, and coaches having to piece together their pitching to get through the game, it was Randleman's offense that got the most out of their side on their way to victory.

Braylen Hayes led the Tiger offense, slashing a pair of hits in four plate appearances and driving in three runs. Hayes gave Randleman the lead in the bottom of the first with a double to left that plated two runs, putting the Tigers up 2-1. With the game tied at three in the third, Hayes again put the Tigers in front, this time 4-3, when he ripped a single to center with one out driving in Hunter Atkins. Randleman added five more runs in the inning, four of them with two outs.

The Hilltoppers drew first blood in the top of the first when Kael Snethen opened the game with a single and came around to score when Cameron Hill reached on an error with one out. It was Xavier Toms, hitting in the eighth spot in the order, who powered the R-S Central attack, going 3 for 4 and driving in a pair of runs on a pair of RBI singles. Toms trimmed the Randleman lead to 9-5 in the top of the fifth with two outs, but that was as close as the Hilltoppers could get as Freshman Pitcher Jake Purvis shut the door on any hope of a comeback with 1.2 innings of scoreless and hitless baseball, striking out three.

2A Championship Game 2 | R-S Central forces Game 3, holding off Randleman 2-1

BURLINGTON – R-S Central forced across single runs in the second and third innings and got a phenomenal performance on the mountd from junior Trip Triplett to hold off Randleman 2-1 and push the 2A Baseball State Championship Series to a decisive Game 3 tonight.

Triplett limited the powerful Tiger offense to just one run on six hits while striking out seven. He did not issue a walk during his 6.1 innings of work before passing the baton off to Kael Snethen who got the save by picking up the final two outs.

Snethen also played a key role offensively for the Hilltoppers, going one





for three out of the leadoff spot in the order, ripping a homer to left field to lead off the bottom of the third and put R-S Central back in front 2-1 after Randleman had tied the game in the top of the inning.

R-S Central scratched across the first run of the game in the second when Cameron Hill singled to open the inning and scored on an RBI single to center by Gavin Bright. Randleman got their lone run in the third after Kaden Ethier doubled to right and he came home on a two-out, RBI single to right by Trey Way that knotted the game at 1.

BURLINGTON – Ryan White pitched a nearly flawless game, striking out 11 and walking two as he no-hit R-S Central in the final game of the 2A State Baseball Championship Series, winning 4-0. Randleman's win gives the Tigers their second State Championship in program history, the first since 2011. White was selected as the 2A State Championship Series MVP for his performance in the decisive Game 3.

R-S Central was nearly as good on the mound but could not contain Randleman in the bottom of the third inning. The Tigers struck for all four of their runs in the bottom of the third, doing all their damage with one out in the inning.

Kaden Ethier started the decisive rally with a single to center and Owen Strickland drew a walk before Trey Way singled to load the bases, setting the table for the Tigers. Hunter Atkins drew first blood, singling to center scoring a pair, chasing Hilltoppers' starting pitcher Hayden Wheeler.

Kael Snethen came in for R-S Central and finished the game on the mound. He was greeted as Brooks Brannon doubled to bring in two more and push the Tigers' lead to 4-0, both runs charged to Wheeler. For his part, Snethen only allowed three hits and did not walk a batter in the final 3.2 innings, giving R-S Central a chance late, but the Hilltoppers' bats could not get going against White, as they went down in order in each of the final three innings.

R-S Central finished the season 17-4, they were 11-1 in the Southwestern 2A, winning the conference championship. The Hilltoppers reached the State Championship Series for the second time in program history, winning their second Western Regional Championship, their first since 2017.

Randleman claimed the program's second State Championship. It was their first since 2011. The Tigers were 19-2 on the season. They were a perfect 12-0 in the PAC 7 2A, claiming the league crown.

3A Championship Game 1 | J.H. Rose races to 8-1 series opening win over Cox Mill

FAYETTEVILLE – Lee Watson went the distance for J.H. Rose, pitching a complete game against Cox Mill to lead the Rampants to an 8-1 victory in Game 1 of the 3A State Championship Series. The Rampants only managed five hits but capitalized on eight walks and five Charger errors to walk away a win away from a State Championship.

Rose opened the scoring with three in the bottom of the second. The Rampants got going with a leadoff single by Cam Greenway followed by an RBI double by Caleb May. May later scored on a wild pitch before Jayden Grimes reached on a dropped third strike which allowed another

run home. Rose tacked on a pair of runs in both the fourth and fifth innings to give themselves some cushion heading to the late innings.

Grimes went one for three for the Rampants but drove in a pair of runs and scored another, as the offensive star for J.H. Rose. Watson did his part on the mound, striking out seven while allowing seven hits and a single earned run.

3A Championship Game 2 \mid J.H. Rose sweeps Cox Mill with 9-4 victory

FAYETTEVILLE – It took a little longer than expected but returning to Fayetteville for Sunday's Game 2 after rain pushed the schedule back proved worth the trip for J.H. Rose. The Rampants pushed past Cox Mill 9-4 in Game 2 of the series to earn a sweep and the program's sixth Baseball State Championship. The victory gave the Rampants their first title since 2008.

Cox Mill jumped out to an early 3-0 lead but could not hold off the powerful Rose attack, which pounded out 11 hits and nine runs in the game. The Chargers opened the scoring in the second inning Kyle Cassell homered to left with two outs in the innings. It was a solo shot, giving the Chargers a 1-0 advantage. Boyd was nearly flawless in the game, striking out 11 Bengal batters. He did walk four, but Fuquay-Varina only managed to push a runner to third





in the sixth inning, and only three total runners reached second in the game. Boyd also drove in a run in the game batting in the cleanup spot in the order.

Reagan jumped on the board in the top of the first with Josh Hartle's single plating Tommy Hawke from second base to put the Raiders up 1-0. Reagan put the game away in the second plating five runs on four hits with two walks and a hit by pitch opening the door for a big inning, chasing Bengals starter Colbie Howell who only lasted 1.2 innings surrendering six hits and six runs.

Rhett James got Fuquay-Varina off to a quick start, scoring the game's first run in the top of the first. James doubled to lead off the game, coming around to score when Aidan Cannaday singled to right with one out. James scored four times in the game, going three for four at the plate with a walk and an RBI. Cannaday, for his part, was two for five with three RBI's as the Bengals lineup mashed Reagan pitching.


Reagan finished the season 17-4 on the year. They were the champions of the Central Piedmont 4A and won the Western Regional Championship for the first time in program history.

2021 NCHSAA 1A BASEBALL STATE CHAMPIONSHIP








2021 NCHSAA 2A BASEBALL STATE CHAMPIONSHIP








2021 NCHSAA 3A BASEBALL STATE CHAMPIONSHIP





