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2022 NCHSAA MEN'S SOCCER PLAYOFF CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

CHAPEL HILL, NC - The North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) will hold the 2022 Men's Soccer State Championship in Browns Summit at MacPherson Stadium, home of NC Fusion. The Men's Soccer Championships will be held in the Greensboro area for the first time since the championships were conducted at school sites

in the 1980's.

MacPherson Stadium is part of the Truist Soccer Complex at Bryan Park just north of Greensboro in Browns Summit. The stadium is capable of seating 3,000 and features a press box, with scoreboard, locker rooms for the teams, spectator restrooms and concessions.

President of the Greensboro Sports Foundation, Richard Beard, added, "Greensboro has a rich history of soccer, and the city is fortunate to have great facilities to host championships. We also have a rich history with hosting all types of NCHSAA Championships. Tournament Town welcomes the NCHSAA Men's Soccer Championships to our city and Macpherson Stadium at Bryan Park."

"We are excited to host this great event in MacPherson Stadium at Bryan Park. This facility will provide a top-notch experience and a championship atmosphere that teams will remember forever," said Gary Gartner, the Tournament Director for NC Fusion.

Christ the King runs away from Voyager 3-0 for first title

CARY, NC – Christ the King got a pair of goals from Marcos Frias to down Voyager Academy 3-0 and win the 1A Men's Soccer State Championship. The State Championship was the first in program history for the Crusaders.

Voyager eventually found their footing, as Emory Crichlow and Ryan Dillon were able to get a few shots off on frame before the game reached the 20th minute. However, in the 23rd minute Christ the King flipped the field quickly on a counter opportunity and the ball was deflected high in the air in the Viking box. As the ball fell about 10 yards from goal, it found the foot of Frias, who switched it quickly to his right foot and slipped it low and hard past the Voyager keeper to open the scoring and give the Crusaders a 1-0 lead.

The Crusaders added another marker in the 65th minute as they won a corner kick and the ball trickled through the box before Olivier Harrison chipped it in front of an open Dillon Kocher who volleyed it home off his right boot to give the Crusaders a 2-0 lead.

As Voyager scrambled to get back in the match a minute later, Charley Whight picked up his second yellow card and the Viking had to finish the final 14 minutes a man down. Playing shorthanded, the Vikings conceded a foul at the top of the penalty area in the 73rd minute. Frias hammered a free kick with his right foot, curling it around the wall and past the keeper from about 22 yards out to ice the Crusader win and cement his selection as the 1A State Championship Match MVP.

Voyager Academy finished the season 17-2-3. The Vikings were 10-0-0 as the champions of the Triangle North 1A Conference. The Vikings won the Eastern Regional final for the second time in program history, returning the State Finals for the first time since 2018.

Christ the King concluded the year 22-1-0. The Crusaders collected the conference title in the Catawba Shores Athletic 1A posting a perfect 10-0-0 record. The Crusaders won the program's first State Championship and second regional title. They reached the State Finals for the first time since falling in the 2019 1A Final to Franklin Academy 3-2.

Penalty Kicks Shelby Wins 4-3 on penalties

CARY, NC – In the closest of championship matches, Shelby outlasted a feisty Greene Central team, edging the Rams in penalty kicks 5-3. Golden Lions goalkeeper Eli Wilbanks managed to keep Greene Central off the scoreboard in 110 minutes of regulation and overtime periods, making nine saves on his way to being named the 2A Men's Soccer State Championship Match MVP.

Greene Central had more of the high-quality scoring opportunities in regulation as the Rams outshot Shelby 25-15 in the match, putting nine of those 25 on frame. Shelby likewise had brilliant spurts of play from Greg Arce and Dylan Steeves but were consistently thwarted by the organized back four of Greene Central. Rams' defenders Miguel Lopez-Berrios and Ernesto Rubio shut down attacks on the flanks and Shelby struggled to piece together any attacks at the center of the Greene Central defense.

After a scoreless draw through 120 minutes, the match headed to penalty kicks. Shelby netted the opening kick of the shootout, while Greene Central's Enrique Lopez-Lemus sent the Rams' first kick off of the crossbar and out. It was the only miss of the shootout for either team, as in the fifth round of the shootout Cade Ledbetter drilled a ball into the right side of the net to claim Shelby's third State Championship in program history

Greene Central finished the season 25-2-0. The Rams won the Eastern Plains 2A Conference with a perfect 12-0-0 record. The Rams won their first Eastern Regional Championship and appeared in the program's first State Championship Match.

Shelby wrapped up the year 23-1-2. The Golden Lions were the champions of the Southern Piedmont 1A/2A at 12-0-0. The Lions won the Western Regional Championship for the fourth time in school history and appeared in the State Finals for the first time since three-straight finals appearances from 2008-2010.

Orlando Almanza headed the ball towards the frame on a loose ball in the edge of the Warrior penalty area, requiring the save from Dee.

It was nearly déjà vu in the overtime sessions, as the Warriors struck just 18 seconds into the first overtime and had to hold off a furious challenge from the Wildcats in the second overtime to claim the school's second Men's Soccer State Championship 2-1.

Weddington's early pressure paid off in the 37' as a ball bounced loose in the box off a save by the Wildcat keeper. Tucker Robinson pounced on the loose ball and knocked it home to put Weddington up 1-0.

New Hanover responded in the second half on a foray into the box in the 58'. Chase Schardt worked his way into the right side of the box, turning and finding a streaking Aidan Payne who made no mistake finding the back of the net to equalize 1-1.

In the first overtime, it took just 18 seconds for Jacob Wells to stick in a loose ball on another follow-up chance off a Wildcat save. Wells' marker gave Weddington a 2-1 lead and turned out to be the game-winner, earning Wells 3A State Championship Most Valuable Player honors.

New Hanover charged forward numerous times in the second overtime, rushing three quality chances toward the Warrior goal in the final three minutes of play. No Wildcat chance was as quality as senior Seiden Baldwin's dance through the left side of the Warrior defense into the penalty area, switching over to his right foot and working to near the penalty spot where he fired a curling shot that just sailed high of the upper right corner of the netting, spoiling a potential second New Hanover equalizer.

New Hanover finished the season 15-1-0. The Wildcats were the champions of the Mideastern 3A/4A with a perfect 11-0-0 season. New Hanover won the Eastern Regional Championship for the second time in program history, returning to the State Championship for the first time since falling since 2008.

Weddington wrapped up the year 16-1-1 with an 11-1-1 record in the Southern Carolina 3A where they claimed the conference title. The Warriors won the Western Regional Championship for the second time in program history, returning to the State Finals for the first time since 2015. They earned the school's second Men's Soccer State Championship.

Gibbons dominates possession and puts away Myers Park 3-0 with trio of second half goals

CARY, NC – Cardinal Gibbons broke through in the 45' of the 4A State Championship Match against Myers Park. The Crusaders got on the board first thanks to a beautiful give-and-go passing play between Luke Lillis and Alec Perez, with Lillis slotting the ball by the Mustang keeper on a slick feed from Perez pushing the Crusaders in front for good 1-0.

Lillis was named the 4A State Championship Most Valuable Player in the game, holding the game-deciding goal and playing solidly in the offensive end all game for the Crusaders. Cardinal Gibbons held the ball well for the first half, frustrating a high-powered Myers Park attack that was not able to generate more than a handful of quality scoring opportunities.

Gibbons added to their advantage just two minutes after their opening goal when Brendan Peeples worked loose just outside the area and blasted the ball into the back of the net for a 2-0 lead. The Crusaders closed the books on any hope of a comeback in the 75', capitalizing on a handball in the penalty area when Dean Mercer beat the Myers Park keeper to the lower-left corner on a penalty kick to go up 3-0.

Myers Park concluded their campaign 12-1-1, winning the So Meck 7 4A conference with a league record of 7-0-1. The Mustangs won the Western Regional Championship for the eighth time in program history.

Cardinal Gibbons finished the season 14-2-1, winning the CAP 7 4A with a 9-2-1 record. The Crusaders won the Eastern Regional Final for the ninth time in program history capturing their seventh State Championship. The win makes Crusaders Head Coach, Tim Healy, the first Men's Soccer Coach in NCHSAA history to win multiple State Championships in three different classifications, having won a pair of 2A and 4A titles to go with his three 3A crowns.



CARY, NC – Franklin Academy stormed from behind scoring the final three goals to defeat Christ the King 3-2 and win the Patriots' second Men's Soccer State Championship. Max Bademian netted a pair of goals for Franklin Academy to grab Most Valuable Player honors.

It took both teams a few minutes to adjust to the slick surface at rain-soaked Koka Booth Stadium, but eventually the scoring got going in the 18th minute as Christ the King's Ray Sastoque jumped on a loose ball in the box to put the Crusaders up 1-0. Then in the 30th minute the Crusaders nabbed another goal as Jack Saltrick slipped one past the keeper to go up 2-0.

Franklin Academy responded nearly immediately as they pushed their attack forward with Josh Eatmon ripping a shot from 40 yards that slipped through the keepers arms on a wet surface to bring the Patriots within 1 at 2-1. Then in the 37th minute, Mateo Espinoza picked out Bademian for his first goal. Bademian made no mistake with a solid right-footed finish. Bademian got the game-winner in the early part of the second half, taking a Luis Peters feed and finding the back of the net in the 44th minute to take a 3-2 lead.

Christ the King finished the season 19-6-1, the Crusaders were 12-0 as the champions of the Southern Piedmont 1A Conference. They won the program's first NCHSAA Regional Championship and appeared in the school's first NCHSAA State Championship Game.

2A Championship: Dixon strikes three times in second half to pull away for a 4-3 victory over East Lincoln

Dixon claimed the school's second Men's Soccer State Championship, their first since winning the 2A title in 2006, with a 4-3 victory over previously unbeaten and untied East Lincoln.

The Mustangs started off the evening's festivities with fireworks in the opening minute. Senior Caleb Gilley took a pass from his twin brother Logan Gilley, slotting it past the Dixon keeper with his right foot to put East Lincoln in front early 1-0. In the 49th minute, Dixon senior Matthew Hardison sent an in-swinging corner towards the goal with his left foot, curling off the keeper and into the net to put the Bulldogs up 2-1. Hardison was selected as the game's Most Valuable Player. Dixon pushed right back into the box in the following minute as Carlos Ochoa-Sanchez slipped a ball to a streaking Max Franken in the box who pushed it home to go up 3-1 with 30 minutes to play. Franken followed up a loose ball in the box to net a second goal in the 70th minute to put the Bulldogs up 4-1.

East Lincoln kept throwing balls forward in the latter stages and Logan Gilley put away a beautiful one-touch feed from Logan Gilley in the 72nd minute to draw the Mustangs closer at 4-2. CARY, NC – In a game that was largely bereft of good scoring chances for the first 70 minutes, it was a pair of late goals that secured the second State Championship in Wake Forest program history as the Cougars slipped by R.J. Reynolds 2-0 to win the 4A State Championship.

Neither team was able to generate much in the way of attack over the first 70 minutes, as the surface played extra fast during a steady rainstorm. Much like the weather forecast on the afternoon, what started out as a trickle, turned into a full-blown downpour as Wake Forest began finding some success attacking into the box with about six minutes to play.

The Cougars one a corner kick on one of their forays into the Demons penalty area. While the Demons were able to clear the initial ball into the box, they were not able to completely clear their lines and the ball fell just outside the area to Austin Talmadge, a junior defender. With most of his defensive mates forward in the 75th minute, Talmadge bought time and space enough to loft a chipped ball into the box, curling onto the head of 6' 4" senior defender Abdoulie Sanneh who banged it home to put the Cougars up 1-0. R.J. Reynolds wrapped up the season 19-3-1, the Demons were 10-0 in the Central Piedmont 4A where they won the conference championship. The Demons reached the State Championship for the third time in program history and the first time since 1986 when they fell to Sanderson.

The Cougars won the school's second Eastern Regional Championship, returning to the State Championship for the first time since 1996. The team claimed the program's second Men's Soccer State Championship.

1A Championship: Scarantino's Golden Goal lifts Voyager Academy past Community School of Davidson 2-1 in Overtime

RALEIGH, NC – Voyager Academy and Community School of Davidson both entered the day looking for their first State Championships in Men's Soccer, and after an incredibly even match, it was Cole Scarantino's golden goal in sudden victory overtime that lifted the Vikings to their title, 2-1 in the 114th minute.

Community School of Davidson had the run of play in the first half, but neither team could find the back of the net. Isaac Haddock intercepted a clearance in the box and booted it on frame in the 13th minute, but it was saved by Jacob McGhinnis, one of his 12 on the day. Liam Timoney crept into the box from his defensive slot for CSD in the 26th minute, and a deflected ball found him but he pushed the shot just wide.

Perhaps the best chance for either side in the first half was when CSD's Micah Chabeda got loose along the goal line in the penalty area and rifled a shot off the outstretched hands of McGhinnis and off the crossbar to carry the two sides to halftime scoreless.

Community School of Davidson finished the season 22-2-2, they were 14-0 as the champions of the PAC 7 1A. The Spartans reached the State Championship for the second time in school history.

Voyager Academy wrapped up the year 22-3-2, they were the champions of the North Central Athletic 1A Conference at 14-0. The Vikings won the schools first state championship in men's soccer in their first championship appearance.

2A Championship: Clinton Dark Horses come from behind to down Newton-Conover and win first title

RALEIGH, NC – In the school's first State Championship appearance in Men's Soccer, the Clinton Dark Horses looked smooth and calm, despite falling behind in the second half against the defending 2A State Champions from Newton-Conover.

Clinton had the better of the possession in the first half, and had the first real scoring opportunity of the day when Jared Aguilar got in on the keeper one-on-one, but it was parried away in the 20th minute. Aguilar again got loose behind the Red Devil's defense two minutes later, earning a corner kick which was headed just wide of the target.

After a scoreless first half, it was Newton-Conover that got on the board first. Dribbling along well outside the box on the left side, Jason Agreda stunned everyone when he turned loose a shot that skimmed low along the ground, finding the right side of the net in the 43rdminute to give the Red Devils a 1-0 lead.

After springing Aguilar on the first two Clinton opportunities and seeing his team fall behind, Parker Norris went to work for the Dark Horses. Clinton played a ball into the right side of the box and Peter Darden chipped it over the keeper, clanging it off the bar where it fell to the waiting Norris who pounded it into the net to tie the score at 1 with 22:58 to go.

Just over five minutes later, the Dark Horses earned a corner kick, one of their eight in the match, and Reid Taylor bent an out-swinging ball right onto the waiting right foot of Norris who promptly deposited it into the bottom right corner of the net through traffic to lift Clinton to a 2-1 lead in the 63rd minute. Norris was named the game's MVP with the two goals.

Newton-Conover finished the season at 22-4-1, they were 12-1-1 in the South Fork 2A where they were the conference champions. The Red Devils appeared in the State Championship for the fourth time in school history and the second consecutive year.

Clinton wrapped up their campaign at 26-1-0 on the year, 11-1 in the East Central 2A where they were the Champions. The Dark Horses advanced to the State Championship for the first time with a 0-0 (4-2 PK) decision over the defending 2A Eastern Regional Champions from First Flight. 3A Championship: Chapel Hill goes back-to-back with a 1-0 win over Marvin Ridge

RALEIGH, NC – Chapel Hill won the school's second straight State Championship in Men's Soccer as they held off Marvin Ridge in a tightly contested match 1-0, winning the 3A Championship.

Chapel Hill outshot the Mavericks 6-3 on the day, but Marvin Ridge had the first big chance as Nick Jones sent a cross in along the ground all the way through the goal mouth in the 14th minute. That send Chapel Hill defenders scrambling in the box, eventually clearing the ball to safety. Two minutes later the Tigers, who held the majority of possession in the first half, sent a high, curling ball into the box that was ripped down by the keeper just in front of a Tiger attacker, keeping the game scoreless.

In the 20th minute, the Chapel Hill pressure paid off for the Tigers as a high cross came into the box, knocking off of three or four players before finding the head of Kalvin Matishack. Matishack cooly deposited the ball in the back of the net to lift the Tigers into the lead, 1-0, a lead they would never relinquish, as they moved on to the fifth state Championship in school history.

Matishack was the second straight defender to win the 3A Most Valuable Player honors, joining teammate Ryan Smith who won the honor a year ago. The Center Back played a critical role all afternoon, shutting down attacks in the center of the park by the Mavericks and of course had the game winning goal.

The Tigers had two more first half opportunities to put the match away, as a corner pinballed around the box in the 32nd minute, eventually dropping to the right foot of Tom Morioka who blistered a shot off the keeper and out of play. Six minutes later Morioka again played a huge role in setting up an attack, getting to the goal line and sliding a cross through the box all the way across goal to Gabo Tobin-Xet who pounded the ball off the crossbar and out.

Chapel Hill continued the pressure in the second half as Cobi Promislow had two shots on frame, knocking it off the keeper both times in the 44th minute. Marvin Ridge began to gain their footing in the 53rd minute when Jones volleyed a beautiful cross from Zenou Tchamwa. The shot skimmed low and along the ground right on, swallowed by the keeper as the score remained 1-0. The Tigers had the final good opportunity as Morioka headed one right and saved off the line from a cross sent in by Tobin-Xet.

Marvin Ridge wrapped up the season 21-4, 12-2 in the Southern Carolina 3A where they were second. The Mavericks made their fourth Championship appearance and their first since 2016.

Chapel Hill finished the season 21-3-1, they were 12-2 in the Big 8 3A where they finished second this year. The Tigers made their eighth appearance in an NCHSAA Men's Soccer Championship, earning their fifth state championship in school history.

4A Championship: Green Hope gets two from Durand and beats Myers Park 4-1 for fourth State Championship

RALEIGH – The Green Hope Falcons netted two second half goals, both by Sam Durand, and ran away to a 4-1 victory over Myers Park for their fourth men's soccer State Championship in school history.

In the early going, both teams had opportunites, but were unable to cash in. The Falcons saw a header by Josh Mohess sail wide off a corner kick in the 13th minute. Then in the 14thminute, Myers Park lofted a ball up to Daniel Watts in the center of the box. Watts cooly too the ball down off his chest and turn towards goal, ripping a shot right at the keeper which was held out to keep the game scoreless.

The Falcons broke the ice in the 20th minute as Daniel Cho ran onto a ball in the edge of the penalty area. With the keeper running on, Cho took a step right and slipped a pass just in front of the sprawling keeper to Dylan Enseling who slotted the ball in the net for the 1-0 lead.

Watts created another two chance for Myers Park in the 33rd minute as he rang a shot low off the left post, bouncing out to teammate Charles Pringle. Pringle's put back attempt was off the mark as well, and the Falcons held on to their 1-0 lead at the half.

Just two minutes into the second half, Sam Cooper shook his Mustang defender, splitting a pair of them into the box. He let loose a right-footed shot that was knocked away by the keeper, but fell right to Sam Durand. Durand chipped in the rebound for his first of two markers on the night and a 2-0 Green Hope lead.

Enseling picked out Alex Penel making a run towards the left side from midfield, who then slipped a pass to Durand at the edge of the box. Durand slid the ball under the keeper in the left side of the net for a 3-0 lead. Durand was named the game's Most Valuable Player.

Myers Park tried to claw back into the game with Daniel Watts picking up an unassisted goal in the 62nd minute to cut it to 3-1. However, the damage had been done with the Falcons three goals, and they added a fourth in the 73rd minute when Sam Cooper banged home a rebound chance following Daniel Cho's shot off the post.

Myers Park finished the year 20-3, 11-2 in the Southwestern 4A Conference where they finished second behind Porter Ridge. The Mustangs reached the State Championship for the seventh time in school history.

Green Hope wrapped up the year 23-2-1, champions of the Triangle 6 4A Conference where they held a 9-1 record. The Falcons reached the State Championship game for the sixth time in school history, earning the school's fourth championship. It was the first title for Green Hope in men's soccer since 2016 when they defeated Providence 3-0.



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1A Championship: Bishop McGuinness takes first crown with a 2-0 decision over Franklin Academy

RALEIGH – Franklin Academy dominated the possession and game for the majority of the first half, but a 33rd minute counter-attack strike lifted Bishop McGuinness to a 1-0 lead and eventually their first Men's Soccer State Championship.

Franklin Academy had the Villains hemmed into their own end for most of the first 25 minutes, with Bishop McGuinness absorbing most of the pressure of the first half. Franklin Academy had a few chances, but not any that they could manage to put a shot on frame with any pace.

Ultimately it was a turnover and a transition moment that saw Cameron Bovender on the ball in the midfield. Bovender took a single dribble and threaded a ball to Brad Standen who poked it with his right foot around a defender and past the keeper for a 1-0 lead in the 33rd minute. Standen was named the game's M.V.P.

Bishop gained confidence with the 1-0 lead and looked more comfortable on the ball in the second half. Franklin Academy had a few desperate attempts and as the Patriots pushed more men forward, Nathan Joseph got on the ball deep in the Patriot end, 1-on-1 versus a final defender. Joseph won the footrace to the ball and into the box, tracking the ball down just before it ran out on the endline. He chipped a ball across the front of the net and after an initial save by the Patriots goal keeper, Alan Linares pounded it home for a 2-0 lead in the 78th minute.

Franklin Academy finished the season 23-1-1, they were 12-0 in the North Central 1A where they were the league champions. The Patriots won the Eastern Regional for the second time in school history.

Bishop McGuinness completed the year 19-2-3, 5-1 in the Northwest 1A. The Villains won their second all-time and second consecutive Western Regional Championship. They captured the school's first Men's Soccer State Championship.

2A Championship: Newton-Conover slips past First Flight 1-0 for third title

RALEIGH – In an exciting and hard-fought battle, it was Newton-Conover that got the lone goal to win the school's third State Championship in Men's Soccer in the school's history.

The two teams both showcased a very physical brand of soccer, each creating numerous chances throughout the game. First Flight peppered Newton-Conover keeper Jon Joplin all game, showering the sophomore with 15 shots, 11 of them on frame. Joplin stood firm, making all 11 required saves for the shutout.

The sparkling championship moment for the Red Devils came in the 58th minute as a clearance out of the Devil defense found the lone forward at the time, Francisco Tapia at midfield. Outnumbered 3-1, Tapia forced the issue, dribbling through the Nighthawk rear defenders and working the ball to his left foot. Tapia slotted a shot low and hard along the ground just to the left of the sprawling left foot of keeper Stryker Owens to give Newton-Conover a 1-0 lead.

Tapia's goal made him the match M.V.P. and was the lone goal surrendered by the emergency keeper for First Flight. Owens was tapped as the starter when First Flight's starting keeper, Lucas Neitherlander, sustained a hand injury during the pre-game warm-ups.

First Flight ended the season 21-2, with an 8-0 record in the Northeastern Coastal 2A where they were the champions of the league. They won the Eastern Regional for the second straight year and fourth time in school history.

Newton-Conover secured the school's third State Championship in Men's Soccer. The Red Devils season concluded with 27-0-2 with a perfect 14-0 record in the South Fork 2A. The Red Devils won the Western Regional title for the third time in school history and the first time since 2014.





3A Championship: Chapel Hill gets a pair of second half goals to get by A.C. Reynolds 2-0

RALEIGH – Chapel Hill hasn't won a State Championship in Men's Soccer since 1983. The Tigers had an all-time record of 1-4 in their previous State Championship appearances, including a stinging 1-0 defeat by Marvin Ridge in last year's 3A State Final. This year's team, remembering that difficult defeat, finished the job with a 2-0 win over A.C. Reynolds.

The two teams battled to a scoreless stalemate at halftime, with neither side registering a shot on goal. A.C. Reynolds' Izaiah Vignali had the most dangerous scoring opportunity of the first half as he cracked a shot a foot or two over the bar from about 30 yards out.

Chapel Hill got going with an offensive foray into the box turning into a corner kick opportunity in the 62nd minute. Ryan Smith went to the corner and sent in a beautiful out-swinging cross that found Justin Mecham who knocked it through traffic into the back of the net for a 1-0 lead.

After some furious attempts by A.C. Reynolds, including a corner kick opportunity that saw Vignali take another crack from 20 yards out that was deflected out for another corner, Chapel Hill won a free kick deep in their own end with about two minutes to play. Mecham took the free kick and dropped a ball right on Smith in the edge of the penalty area from about 75 yards out and Smith one-touch volleyed the ball past the keeper to ice the Tiger victory.

A.C. Reynolds finished the season 23-3-2, they were 14-1-1 in the Western Mountain 3A where they were league champions. The Rockets won the Western Regional for the first time in school history and made their first State Championship game appearance.

Chapel Hill wrapped up the season 23-4-1, they were 12-1-1 as the champions of the Big 8 3A. The Tigers made the school's sixth appearance in an NCHSAA Men's Soccer State Championship game, winning the school's second title all-time.

4A Championship: Cardinal Gibbons nips Hough 2-1 to win their first 4A title

RALEIGH – In a 4A State Championship match that featured a lot of firepower on both sides, It was a corner kick in the 45th minute that made the ultimate difference, lifting Cardinal Gibbons to a 2-1 lead and eventually the school's first 4A State Championship in Men's Soccer.

With the score tied at 1, Gibbons earned a corner kick on a deep probing run into the box. Sal Bottone stepped into the corner to deliver the corner kick, dropping a beautiful in-swinging ball onto the back post where it found the waiting head of Jackson Hollenbach. The senior midfielder Hollenbach directed it on frame and into the back of the net with a flick of his head in the 45th minute, giving the Crusaders the decisive 2-1 lead.

Hollenbach also played a role in the Crusaders first marker of the game, when the Crusaders won possession in the Hough penalty area, Hollenbach slipped a pass to Jack Zarnik from the edge of the box. Zarnik danced by two Huskies defenders and slipped the ball off his right foot into the back of the net, breaking the ice in the 24th minute. Hollenbach was named the game's M.V.P. with a goal and an assist.

Hough equalized the match just four minutes after the first Gibbons goal. Davis Ashbrook found Kyle Jeffrey who knocked home the goal that sent the match to halftime tied. Hough finished the season 24-2, they were 14-0 as champions of the I-Meck 4A Conference. Hough won their first Western Regional Final on their way to their first State Championship appearance.

Cardinal Gibbons concluded the season with a 23-0-2 record overall, they were 11-0-1 as the champions of the Cap 7 4A Conference. Gibbons appeared in their eighth state championship game in Men's Soccer, and won the school's sixth Men's Soccer State Championship in all classifications.

2016 1-A: Wallace-Rose Hill captures third state title, Espinoza breaks national record

RALEIGH, N.C. - Wallace-Rose Hill gave up the first goal in the 2016 1A State Championship Soccer Match, but the Bulldogs netted the next three to take a 3-1 victory over Bishop McGuinness. The victory was the Bulldogs third state championship in as many appearances.

Wallace-Rose Hill dominated play for much of the game with Jack Arnold making 4 saves in the first half to keep things level until teammate Cameron Bovender took a shot off a deflected clear that found the back of the net giving the Villains a 1-0 lead just 20 minutes in.

The Bulldogs kept the pressure high and the effort finally paid off in the 32nd minute as a corner kick pinballed around in the box, dropping to senior Lukas Heither who swept it past the keeper tying the score.

Six minutes later David Sosa finished a beautiful ball by Jorge Aguilar giving Wallace-Rose Hill a lead they did not relinquish.

The highlight of the match, and a career, came in the 47th minute. Bulldog senior forward Maynor Espinoza came into the State Championship Match sitting on 213 goals for his four-year career, tied for the NFHS National Record for career goals with Sean Shapert from Moon High School in Pennsylvania. Shapert held the record from 1984 when he set the mark until Espinoza spun a ball past the Villains keeper to give Wallace-Rose Hill a 3-1 lead and a 1A State Championship. Espinoza was named the match M.V.P.

2016 2-A: FIRST FLIGHT WINS FIRST TITLE WITH A 4-0 SHUTOUT OF CHASE

RALEIGH, N.C – First Flight came in to the 2A Men's Soccer State Championship Match riding high off of a 3-1 win over Carrboro in the regional finals, they kept that momentum moving right through the Championship match. The Nighthawks netted a goal in the 7th minute as Quinn Douglas knocked home a rebound giving First Flight a 1-0 lead they would never relinquish on their way to the first Soccer State Championship in school history.

The Nighthawks' journey was not one without adversity. Just 15 minutes into the regional final against Carrboro, starting goal keeper Grayson Shier broke his clavicle, ending his season. Sophomore Wilmer Andi-

no stepped in to finish out the game against Carrboro, allowing just one goal in the 3-1 win, and securing a bid to the state finals. With Andino making his first Varsity start, the Nighthawks got out on the front foot early with Douglas goal and followed it up with another rebound goal, this one by Vega Sproul in the 27th minute, giving First Flight a 2-0 lead.

Game M.V.P. Tommy Scott added two second half markers to put the game out of reach. He scored off of a rebound in minute 44, and then broke into the box and slipped one under the diving Trojan goal keeper in the 59th minute to push the lead to 4-0. Andino was tested several times, making a single save in the first half to keep the game scoreless early. He made one other routine save, but late in the match, Chase earned a free kick at the corner edge of the 18-yard box. Luis Vasquez for the Trojans stepped up to take the kick and curled a ball off his right foot that looked ticketed for the upper-right corner of the goal before a diving Andino parried away for a corner, sealing his shut out and first clean sheet of his career.

Chase finished the season at 22-2, 15-1 in conference play as champions of the South Mountain Athletic 3A Conference. First Flight concluded year 12 for head coach Juan Ramirez with his first state championship and a 21-0-2 record.

2016 3-A: MARVIN RIDGE HOLDS OFF CHAPEL HILL 1-0 TO WIN 3A CROWN

RALEIGH, N.C. – A 39th minute penalty kick was the difference for Marvin Ridge as Brandon Young drove the ball into the upper-right corner of the net and lifted the Mavericks to the lead late in the first half. Young was named the game's M.V.P. as the lone goal scorer in the match. The Mavericks won their third championship in as many appearances in the State Championship Match.

Despite heavy pressure from Chapel Hill for much of first half, Marvin Ridge held the lead on some stellar goalkeeping by Tyler Fant. The Senior parried a bullet free kick just over the bar from just 30 yards out off the boot of Chapel Hill's Justin Mecham 20 minutes into the first half. Fant made two other spectacular saves in the first half, punching out a line shot and cleaning up a loose corner attempt.

The difference in the match was the final two minutes of the first half. After being on their heels and defen-

sive for much of the first frame, Marvin Ridge built a counter-attack and sprung Matt Winesette down the left side and into the edge of the box. 2016 4-A: GREEN HOPE WINS THIRD TITLE WITH 3-0 WIN OVER PORTER RIDGE

RALEIGH, N.C. – Green Hope won their third state championship, and first since back-to-back titles in 2011 & 2012, beating Porter Ridge 3-0 in the 4A State Championship Match.

The Falcons opened the scoring in the 25th minute as a deflection dropped to the penalty spot and Connor Munz volleyed it off his left foot into the back of the net making it 1-0. Just seven minutes later Green Hope was on the board again as Porter Ridge keeper Julio Rangel stopped the first shot attempt by Anthony Boswell, but he couldn't get to the rebound chance. Jacob Sciandra, a senior midfielder, followed the Boswell shot knocking the rebound just out of the reach of Rangel and gave the Falcons a 2-0 lead.

The final goal for the Falcons came in the 75th minute off a corner kick. Camden Holbrook took a left footed in-swinging corner and found the head of William Dugger who knocked it off the keeper and in the net making it 3-0. The Green Hope defense was impressive all night, the Falcon back four did not allowed only three shots on the night, only one of which was on target. Falcon Senior Zach Curtis anchored the defense and was named the game M.V.P. Porter Ridge was under siege most of the night, goal keeper Rangel was under fire, but did make 5 saves. The Falcons fired 16 shots on the night, nine of them were on frame.

Green Hope finished the year 28-1, 15-1 in the Southwest Wake 4A as the conference champions. Their lone loss of the season came 2-0 to rival Panther Creek.
