Dear NCHSAA committee,

It is my honor to write to you on behalf of Tori Ensley from Franklin High School. Tori, quite frankly, is the most decorated female athlete to come out of Franklin High School. This young lady is amazing. She has been all conference in volleyball, basketball, and softball. Tori is a 4-time all-conference member in basketball and a 2-time conference player of the year in basketball. She was also the conference tournament MVP in Basketball as well as a NCBCA all-district selection and an all-WNC selection. She broke the single season steals record at Franklin High and is the career all-time leader in steals.

As good as Tori is in Basketball, she is even better as a softball player. The NC State signee has been an all-conference selection two times and is likely going to have a third year this season. Currently, her team is first in the conference and is ranked 5th in the state. She missed the 2019 season due to COVID. Tori was an all-conference, all-district, and all-state selection in 2021.
