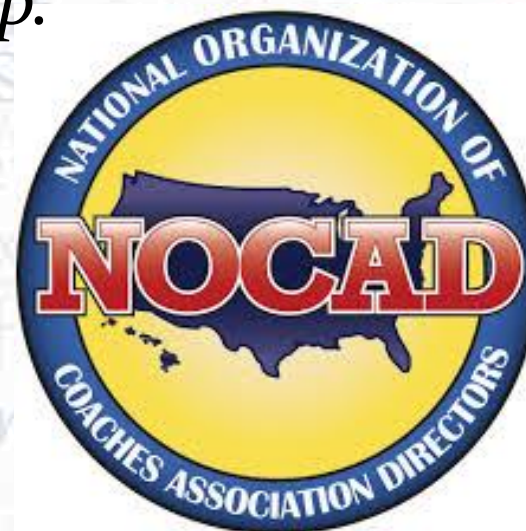

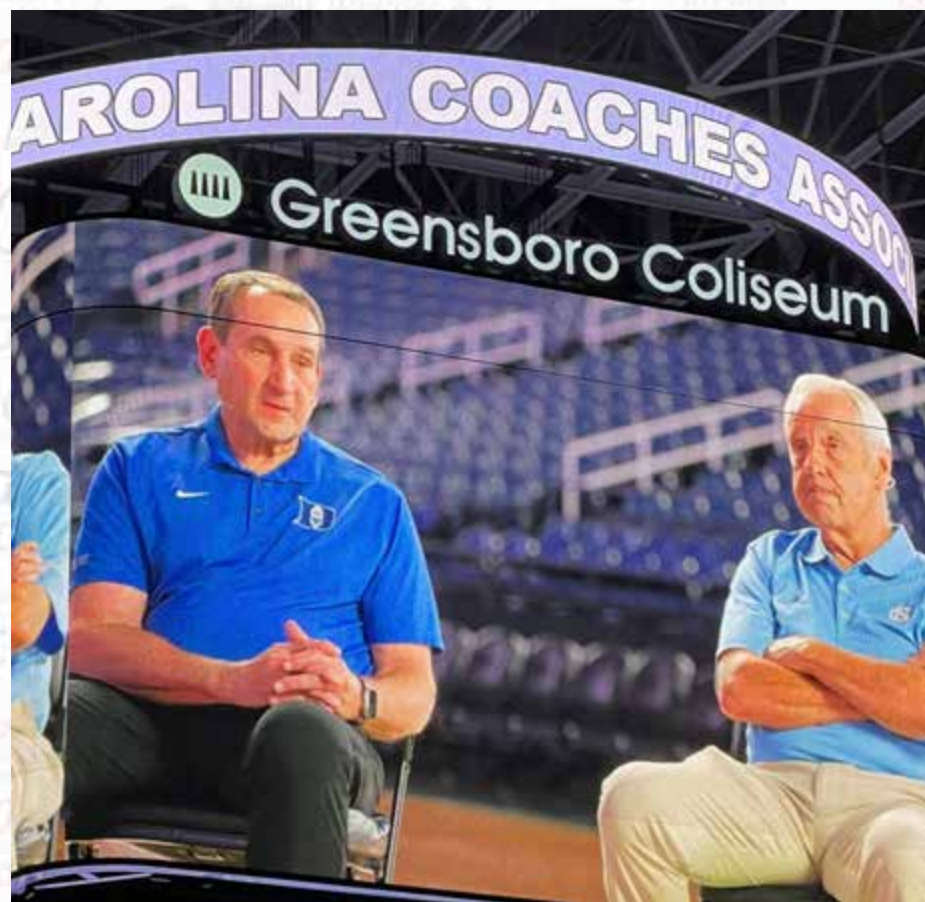

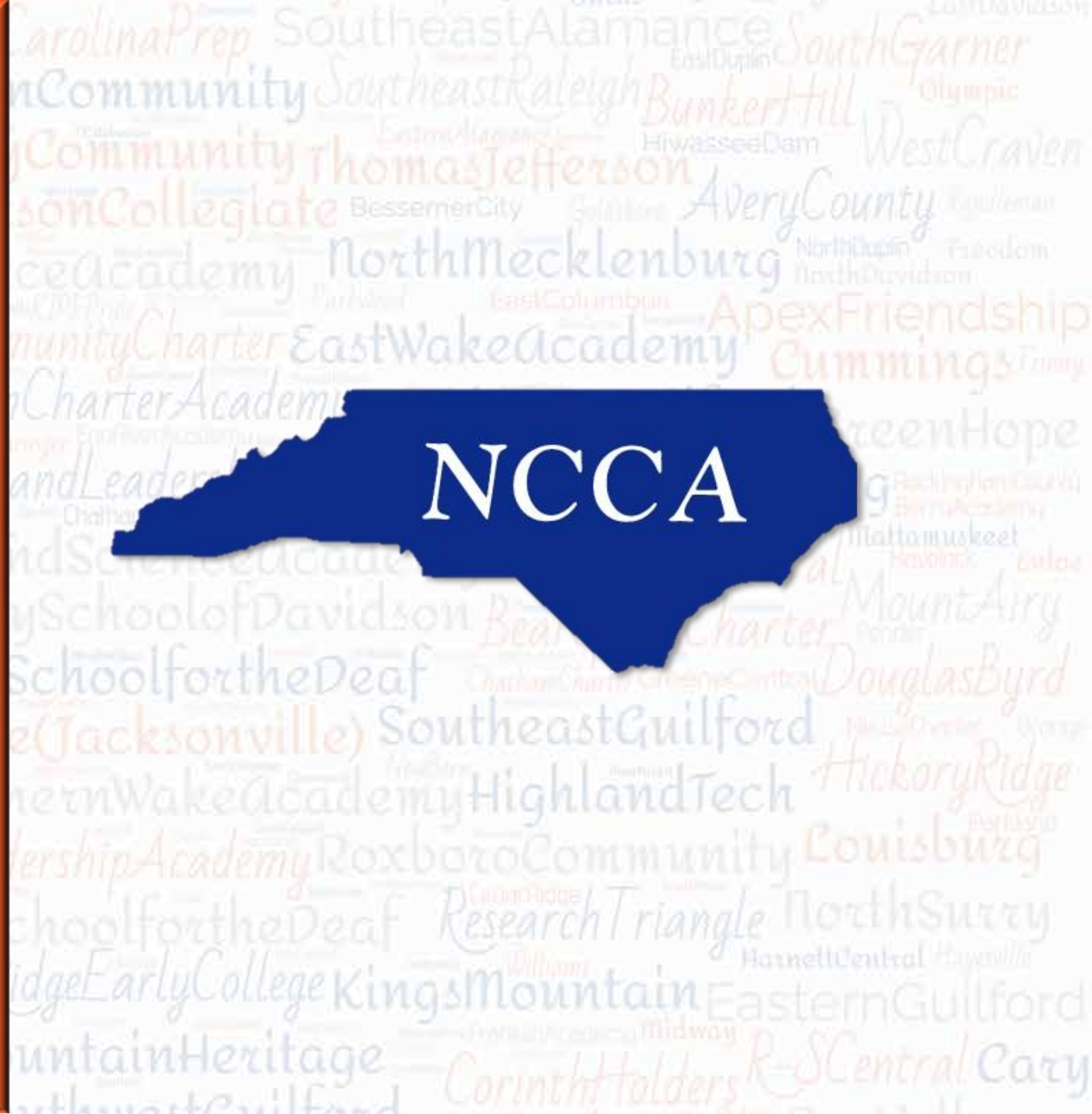

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NCHSAA Foundation

- ❖ Creation approved by the Board of Directors during the 2023 Spring Meeting
- ❖ Incorporated on May 5, 2023 as a 501(c)(3) entity
- ❖ *Purpose:* Continue to give back to membership
- ❖ Established to serve and protect the integrity of member high school sports and related activities in North Carolina
 - *By funding grants, scholarships, and programs that support the students, coaches, administrators, and officials engaged in those sports and activities*



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NCHSAA Foundation

❖ What's different?

- *Distinguishes between Association operating revenues and expenses and the endowment fund accounts*
- *Creates a separation of funds*
- *Provides additional transparency*

- ❖ A Board of Trustees will manage the formerly designated endowment funds within the Foundation

1. Who is the gameday administrator and what is their contact information?
2. Is there a Licensed Athletic Trainer (LAT) and/or First Responder (FR) on site and what is their contact information? If a LAT or FR is not on site who is the most qualified person to provide CPR and first aid care?
3. Has the Emergency Action Plan (EAP) been reviewed and where is the posted venue specific EAP located?

Outdoor Events

1. Who will be monitoring environmental and field/facility conditions during the event? (e.g., thunder and lightning, Wet Bulb Globe Temperature)
2. Who will notify officials of unsafe environmental or field/facility conditions?
3. Has the lightning or thunder disturbances safe shelter and evacuation route been identified?
4. What is the Wet Bulb Globe Temperature, if available, at the beginning of the contest?





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Addressing Mental Health Issues

Primary Prevention

Communicate coaches' role and responsibilities in supporting an athlete's mental health

Model value-consistent behaviors (words matter)

Reinforce athlete behaviors consistent with desired team culture

Secondary Prevention

Attend to changes in athlete's behavior (See Something, Say Something)

Communicate coaches' boundaries in providing care

Communicate with caregivers of concern/observation

Tertiary Prevention

Provide reinforcement to athletes seeking mental health care

Protect confidentiality

Express willingness to modify sports-related demands to accommodate athletes' treatment

Provide opportunities for athlete to continue to engage with team

General Changes – AED/CPR

Effective 2024-25, all coaches must be CPR/AED certified prior to the first practice date.

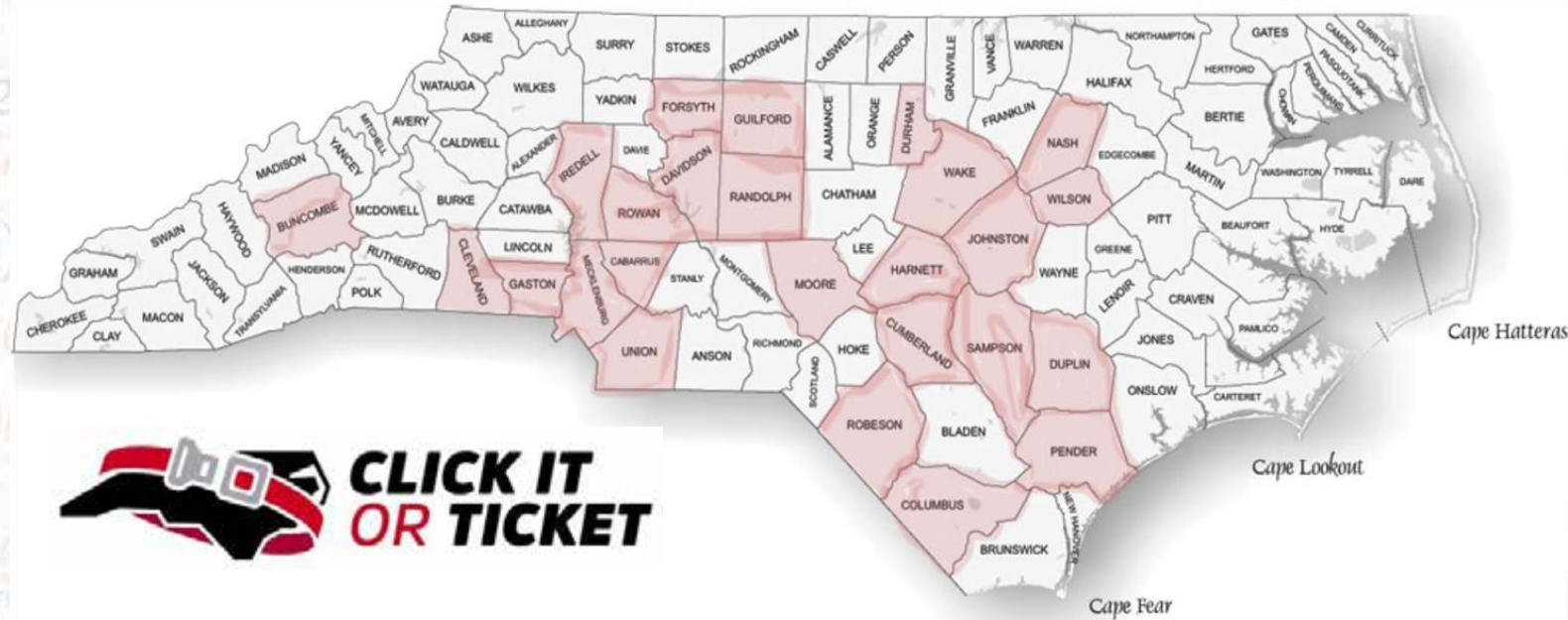

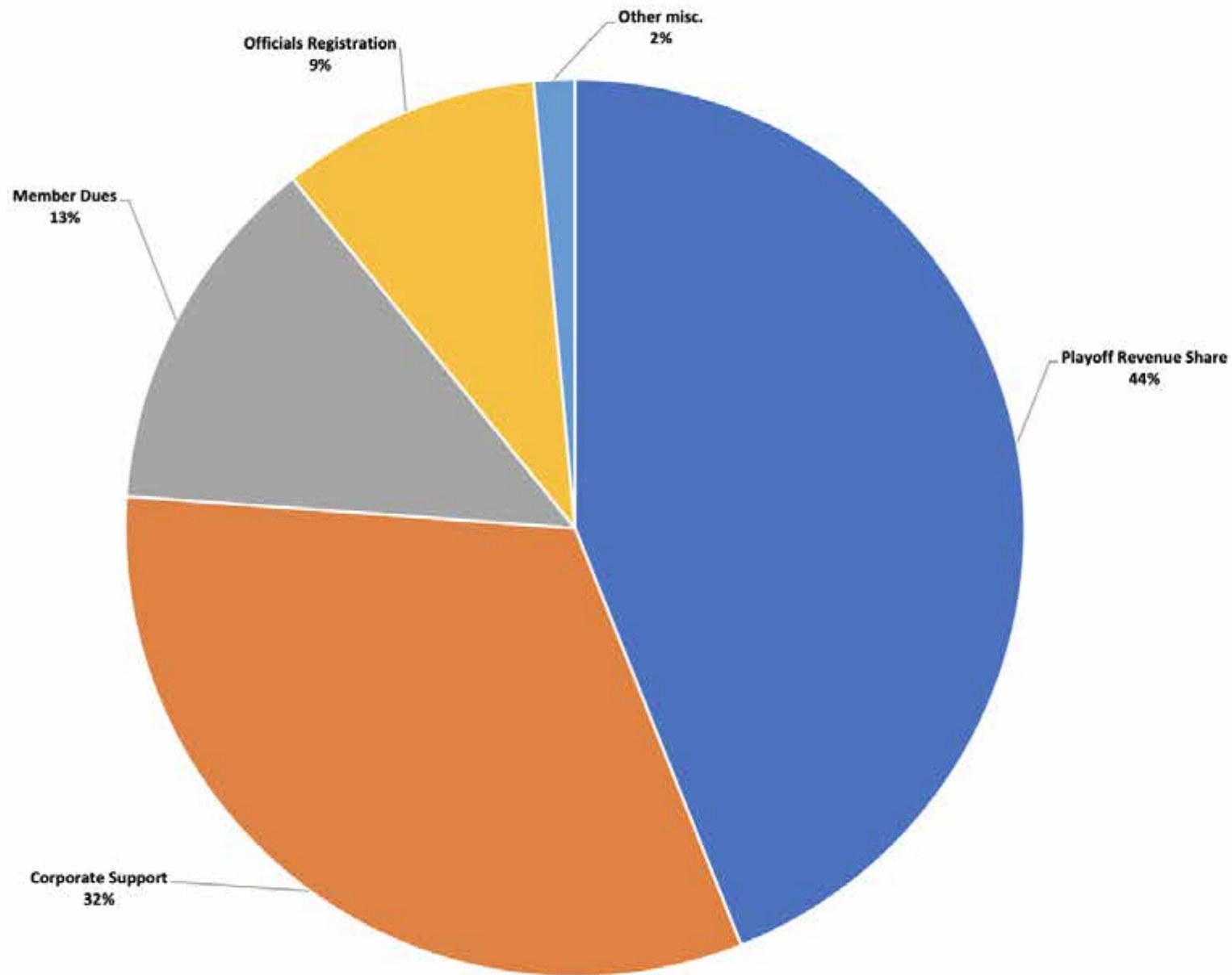

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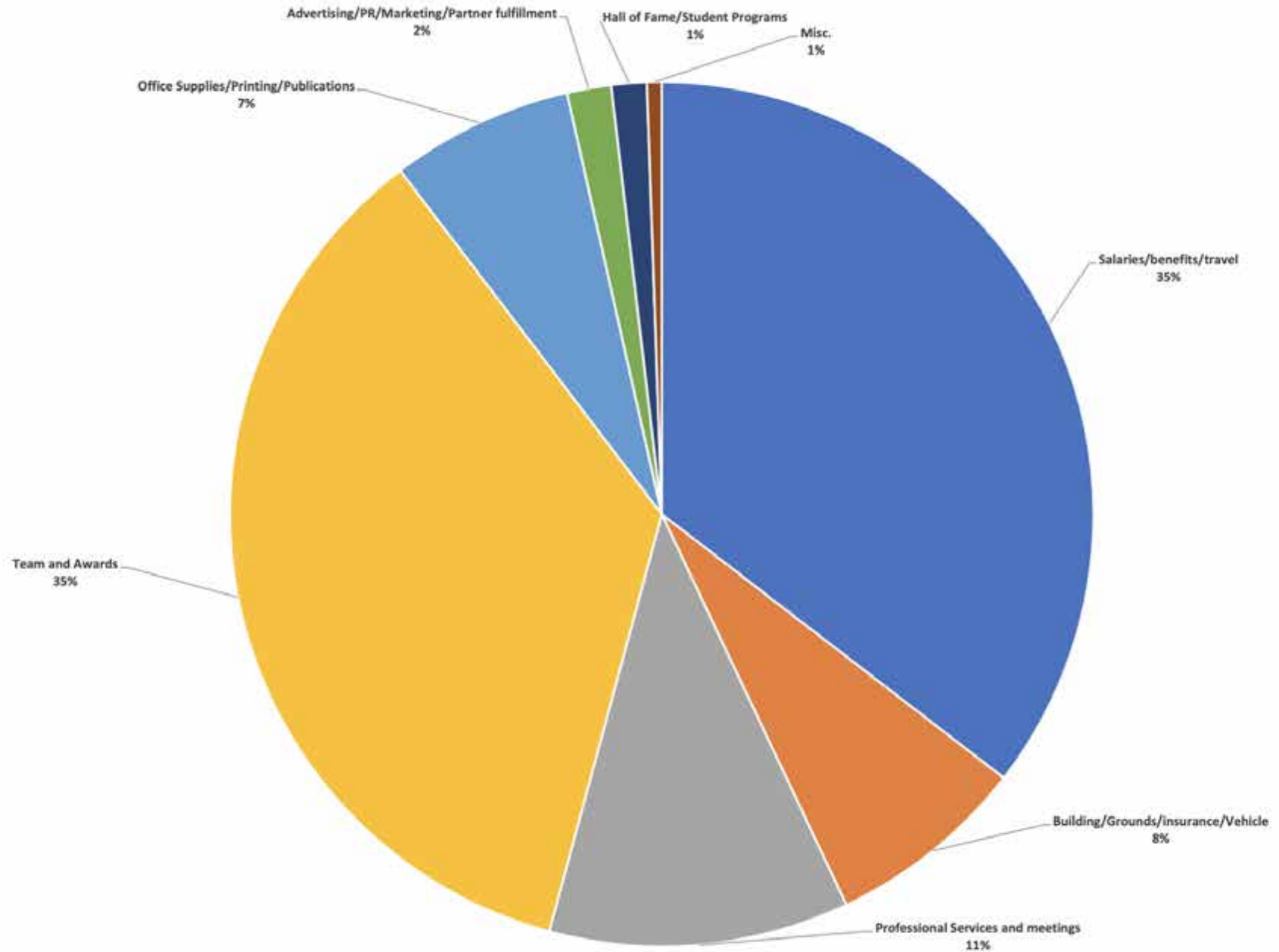
Projected 2023-2024 Revenue- Annual Operating Budget \$3,749,985.00

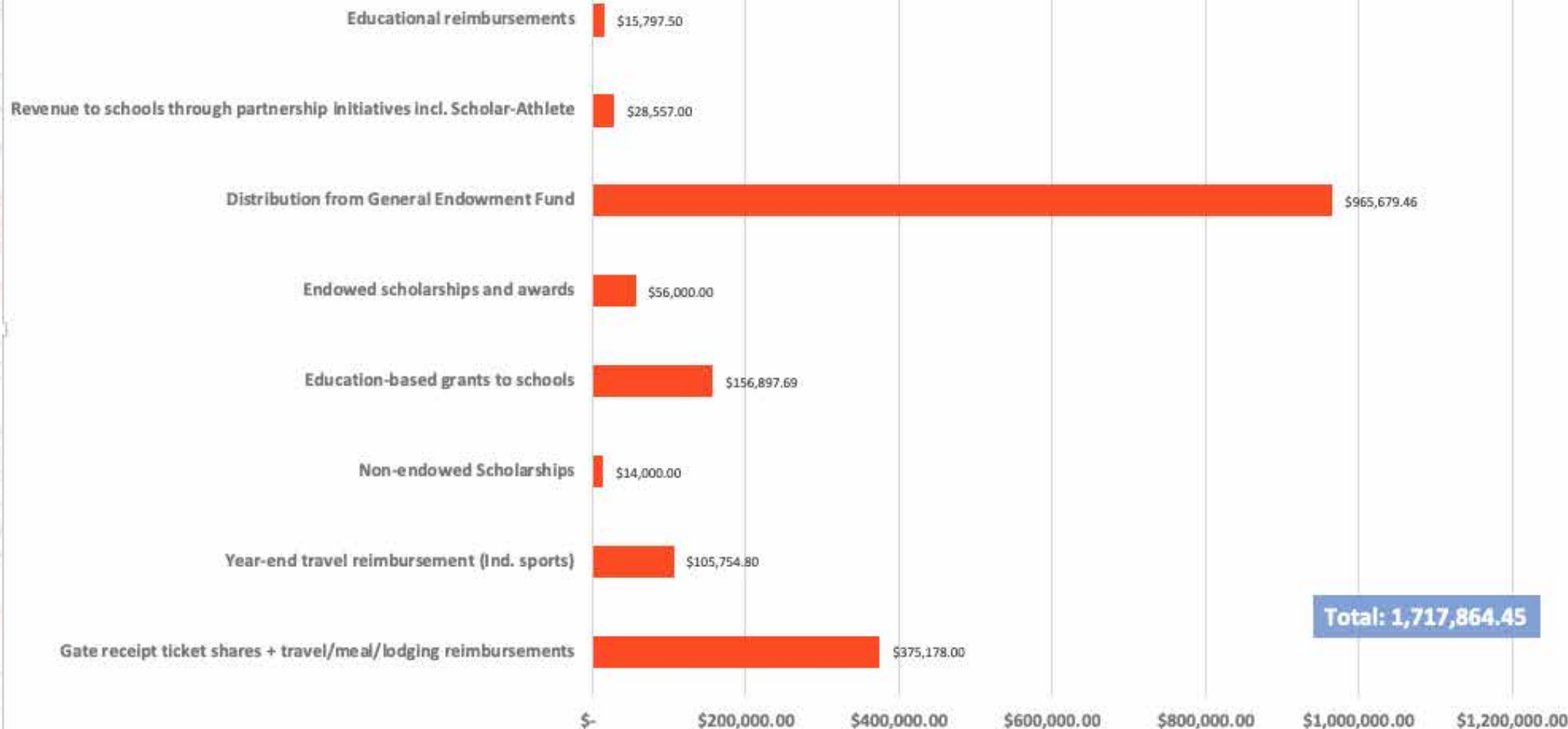

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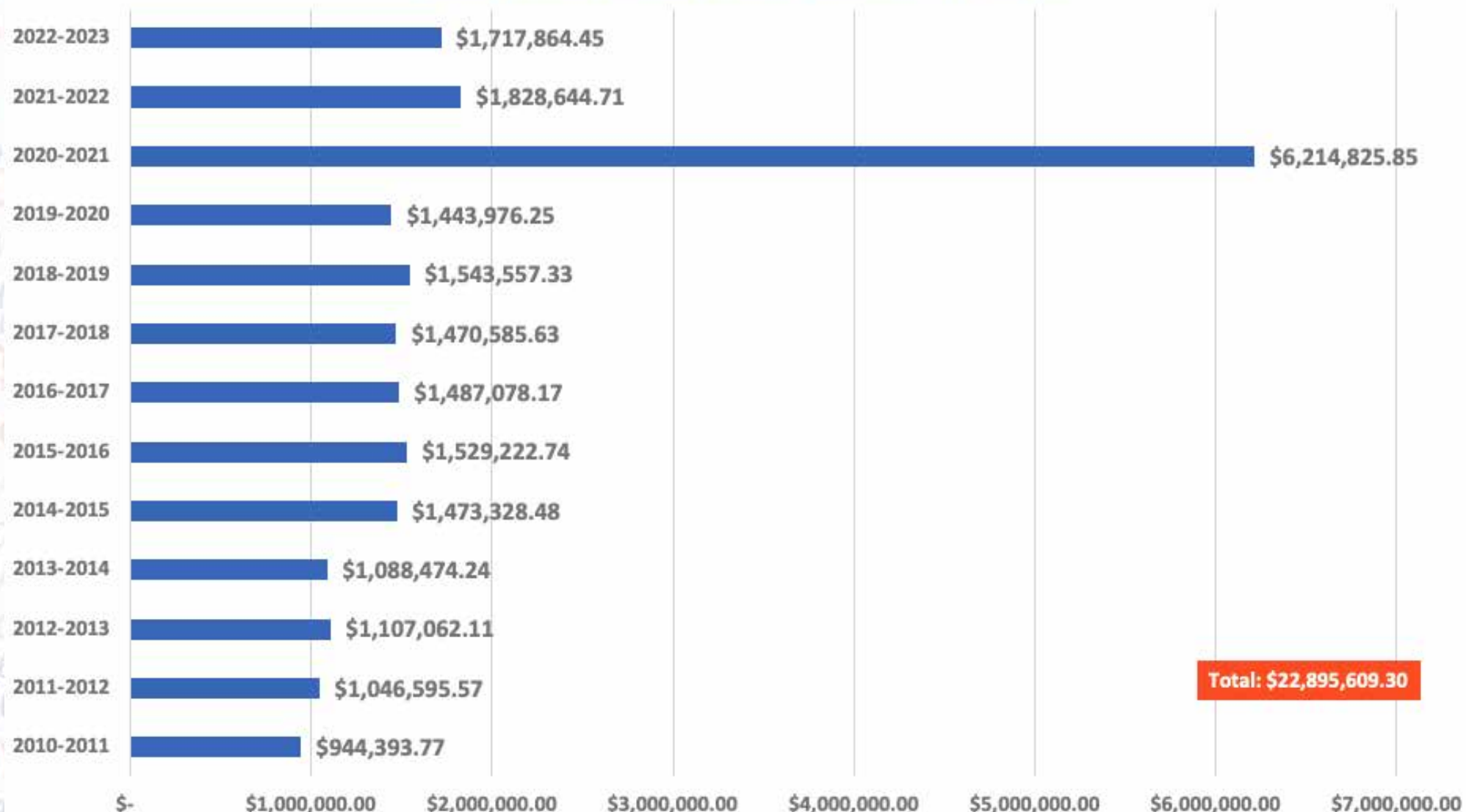
2022-2023 Fund Distribution by NCHSAA to Schools/Students

- ❖ 10% fee increase in all sports rounded to the next dollar amount.

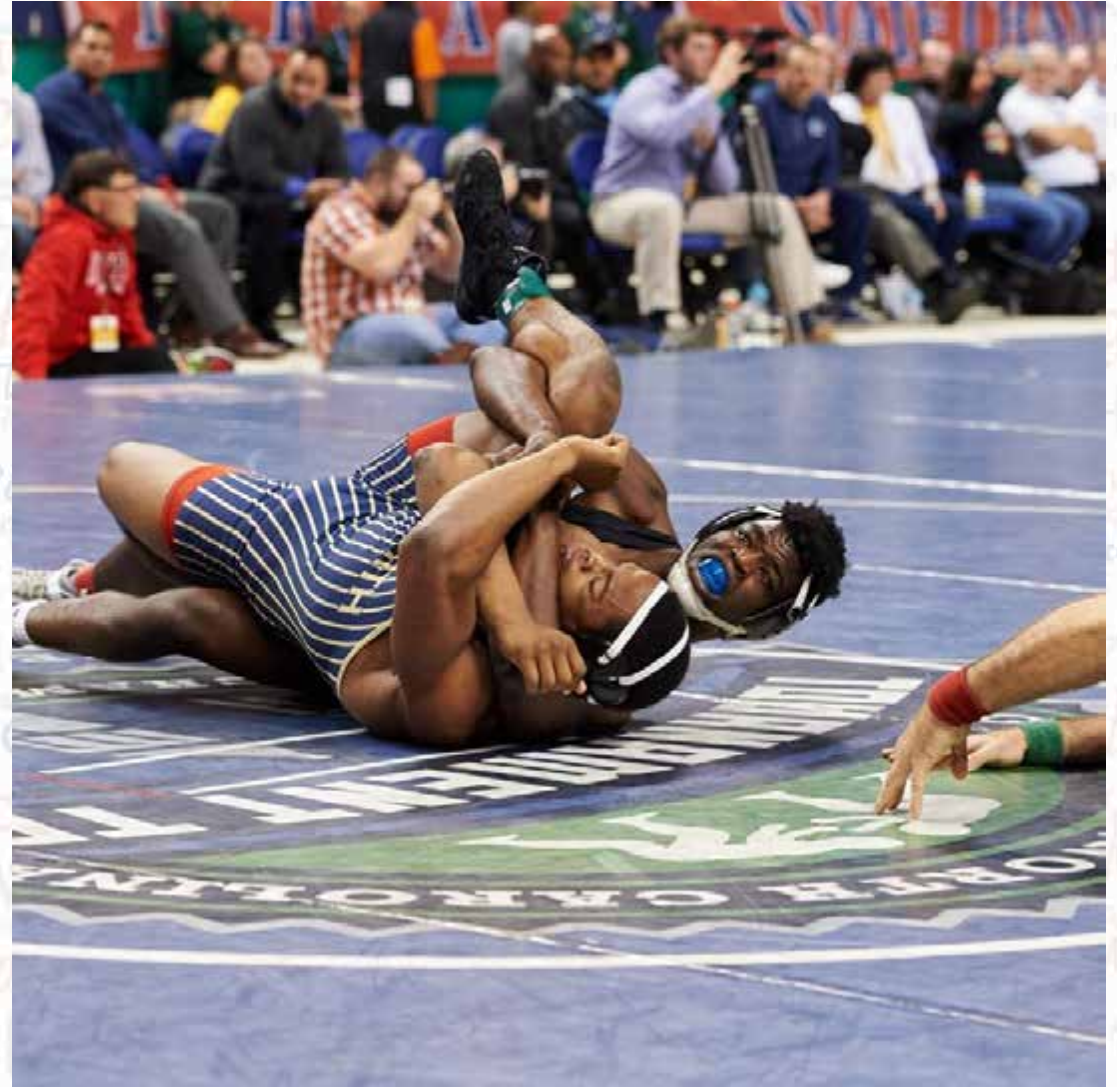

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Rule Changes - Golf

Maximum Score Rule on a Hole – No student-athlete shall score more than triple bogey on any hole (6 on a par 3; 7 on a par 4; 8 on a par 5) during the regular season. Once a student-athlete has reached this threshold, they shall pick up their ball, record a triple bogey on the scorecard and let the group complete the hole and move on to the next hole.

- ❖ Applies to regular season, regional, and state championship play.





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Rule Changes - Golf



❖ Men's Golf State Qualifying

- 3 teams per regional will qualify and will be allowed to take 5 players to the state championship.
- Top 9 individuals that are not on a qualifying team will advance to the state championship.

❖ Women's Golf State Qualifying

- 3 teams per regional will qualify and will be allowed to take 5 players to the state championship.
- Top 17 individuals that are not on a qualifying team will advance to the state championship.



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Rule Changes - Volleyball

- ❖ No more than 4 matches per day inclusive of best of three or best of five
- ❖ RPI rankings will be determined based on all matches played inclusive of best of three or best of five
- ❖ Conference matches must be best of five
- ❖ Conference tournaments must be the best of five
- ❖ All playoff matches will be best of five
- ❖ 22 total matches – tournaments count as one match
- ❖ 20 regular season matches played – 2 tournaments allowed
- ❖ 21 regular season matches played – 1 tournament allowed
- ❖ 22 regular season matches played – 0 tournaments allowed





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Rule Changes - Tennis

- ❖ Expanded the dual-team playoffs:
 - 64 teams in 3A/4A
 - 48 teams in 2A
 - 32 teams in 1A (no change)
- ❖ MaxPreps RPI rankings will be used for seeding of teams and selection of wildcards in dual team tennis.





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Rule Changes - BB, BBK, LAX, SOC, & SB



- ❖ Eliminated tournament language from the NCHSAA Handbook in the sports of baseball, basketball, lacrosse, soccer, and softball
 - *Reverting to a season limit of 24 games.*
- ❖ All games played will count toward the season limit
 - *Example: If a team plays in three tournaments and plays three games per tournament (9 games)*
 - *Leaves 15 games to be played.*



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Rule Changes – Swimming & Diving

- ❖ Pay increase for swimming and diving officials:
 - Referee from \$53.50 flat fee to \$70.00
 - Stroke and turn judge, starter, and diving judge from \$27.50 flat fee to \$40.00.
- Regular season meet results must be entered into NCPrepSwimming within 48 hours of the completion of the meet.

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Rule Changes - Softball



- ❖ Approved mandatory bat testing for regular season play and directed NCHSAA staff to create procedures for testing and selection of testers.
- ❖ Based on conversations with other states, athletic directors, and coaches, this will be revisited in the Fall.



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Rule Changes - Softball



❖ Procedure:

- *The NCHSAA will provide two bat-testing machines per region and require at least one certified machine tester. The tester cannot be a coach—must be a neutral tester, i.e. County or School Athletic Director*
- *Bat testers must use the USA Softball Bat List for specific bat pressures.*
 - Note: some bats, i.e. Easton Ghost will fall in the illegal range; however, these bats can be legal based on different pressure allowances
- *Bats must pass 2 out of 3 test attempts to be legal.*
- *Once tested, an approved bat will receive a sticker applied by the bat tester.*
- *All bats will be tested at the state championships*

Rule Changes - Softball

Officially approved another game-ending rule for softball:

A game is terminated if a team is ahead by 15 runs after three complete innings.

 - *The regional finals for all classifications will occur during the week (Monday-Thursday) leading into the state championship.*
 - *State Championships will be held on Friday and Saturday the same week. All games will be held at one (1) location with games occurring throughout the day.*

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Background Information from 2021 Survey

- ❖ The NCHSAA surveyed principals, athletic directors, and coaches:
- ❖ The survey results are outlined below:
 - ❖ **Principals:**
 - Oppose shot clock implementation 52.38%
 - Approve beginning with the 23-24 season: 9.52%*
 - Approve beginning with the 24-25 season: 5.95%*
 - ❖ **Athletic Directors:**
 - Oppose shot clock implementation 58.47%
 - Approve beginning with the 23-24 season: 13.66%*
 - Approve beginning with the 24-25 season: 5.46%*
 - ❖ Principals and athletic directors voted to approve the implementation of a shot clock for the 22-23 season at 32.14% (principals) and 22.4% (athletic directors)



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Background Information from 2021 Survey cont.

❖ Women's Coaches:

Oppose shot clock implementation 36.61%

Approve beginning with the 23-24 season: 12.05%

Approve beginning with the 24-25 season: 2.23%

❖ Men's Coaches:

Oppose shot clock implementation 32.27%

Approve beginning with the 23-24 season: 12.35%

Approve beginning with the 24-25 season: 3.98%

- ❖ Both men and women coaches voted for the implementation of a shot clock in 22-23 with 51% (men) and 49% (women) respectively.



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Information from NFHS Summer Meeting

- ❖ 20 states will be using the shot clock for the 23-24 school year
- ❖ The average cost -- about \$5,000.00/school
- ❖ Multiple issues:
 - *Compatibility with existing clocks*
 - *Parts*
 - *Installation*
- ❖ No functionality issues by some states
- ❖ NCAA rules being applied to high school has created issues during games
- ❖ Stoppage of the game for correction for most has been 3-5 times
- ❖ NFHS Poll 20 states using it; no plans by other states

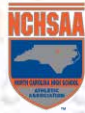

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Education-Based Athletics Grant Program

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BYLAW VI

- ❖ For purposes of athletic competition, the number of classifications shall be based on the total number of member schools, with no classification exceeding sixty-four schools.



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BYLAW VI

When at least 25 percent of the total number of member schools, or at least half the schools in a classification participate in a sport sanctioned by the NCHSAA, that sport shall culminate in a state championship for that classification. When less than half of the schools in a classification participate, those schools shall be grouped with schools from the next largest classification(s) not having fifty percent participation in that sport to create a state playoff bracket culminating in a multi-class state championship. If only one classification has less than fifty percent of schools participating in a sport, the schools in that classification shall have a reduced playoff bracket by one round. If that is not possible, then the schools of that classification shall be placed in the state playoffs of the next highest classification.



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BYLAW VI

- ❖ The initial classification plan using this format will be effective with the 2025-26 school year and shall solely use the ADM figures averaging the daily membership in grades 9,10, 11 and 12 for the first month as submitted to the State Department of Public Instruction. The classification and alignment plan shall be adopted by the Board of Directors every four years and will be effective for a four-year period. Schools may request reclassification in the second year of the alignment period by following the process published by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall distribute to all member schools and systems annually the process and criteria for classification and alignment, the process for requesting reclassification in the second year of the alignment period, and the process for appealing the classification and alignment decisions of the Association.
