Dear Selection Committee Members,

Robert Cody has touched many people's lives through his career as a teacher, coach, and mentor. Robert Cody deserves strong consideration to be inducted in the NCHSAA Hall of Fame.

While I've only had a personal relationship with Robert for 10 years, I've been a huge fan for over 20 years. In 1985, Robert began his head coaching career at Plymouth High School. My wife of 25 years attended Plymouth High School from 1987 to 1991 and she witnessed how Mr. Cody trained boys to become outstanding ambassadors of Plymouth High School. She witnessed how Robert's teachings made a long-lasting impact on her peers. To this day, my wife's peers affectionally refer to Mr. Cody as "Coach".

I've been covering North Carolina High School football for many years and I have researched the records of every high school football program from the years 1960 to present. In the 25 years preceding Robert's tenure at Plymouth, the Vikings made the playoffs exactly once. From 1981 to 1984, Plymouth's record was 7-32-1. Starting in Robert's first year at the helm of the Plymouth Vikings' football program the team made the playoffs. On many Friday nights he would face programs with twice the number of players and resources on the gridiron and lead his team to victory. His record speaks for itself. Three state championships, six state championship appearances, countless playoff victories, and over 260 victories.

As any head football coach will attest, success includes a team-based approach along with a strong coaching staff and countless volunteers. I've witnessed firsthand on how he mentors his coaching staff. Members of Robert's coaching staff have used his knowledge of the game to better enhance their own opportunities on and off the gridiron.

In 1992, I started dating my future wife and over the past 28 years I've been visiting Plymouth regularly.

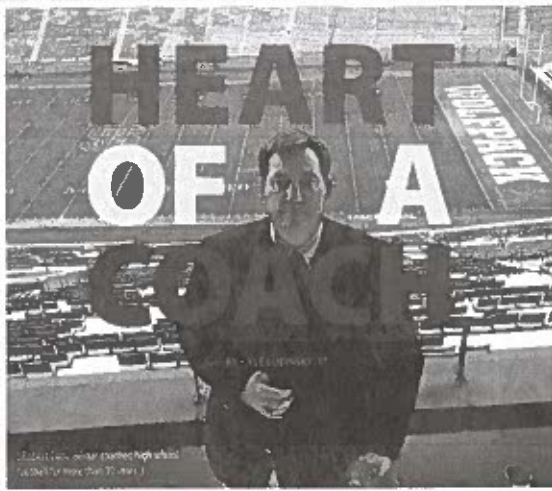
Washington County has experienced considerable heartache during this time due to a changing economy. Many people have fallen victim to a lack of resources and many businesses have failed. The one unifying element of Plymouth's society has been the tremendous success of Plymouth High School's athletic teams. To have a strong athletic program you must have a tremendous athletic director. From 1991 to 2013, Robert served as Plymouth High School's athletic director. His knowledge of life greatly surpasses the gridiron. He found some of the best coaching talent in the state to help mold the lives of many Plymouth adolescents.

On a personal note, I first met "Coach" about 10 years ago. Although I'm quite seasoned, I was very nervous when I first met Robert. He immediately put me at ease and shared with me many life stories. He also shared with me that his strongest emphasis in his life is his family. I've attended many Plymouth football games over the years and I would always see Robert's wife helping him out. He's introduced me to his daughter Ivy and his parents who happened to live in Durham, about 15 minutes from his home. Although I'm beyond impressed with Coach Cody's success on the gridiron, I'm the most impressed with his character.

Robert Cody has given so many people in Plymouth an avenue for success. He is a man of the highest moral and ethical character. I ask the Selection Committee to consider my letter when naming the next NCHSAA Hall of Fame class. Robert's induction would symbolize not only his incredible track record of success but also symbolizes how future minds in Plymouth can strive for success.

or many collegiate athletes, playing professional sports is an aspiration. For others, playing a sport helps them find their calling in life. For Robert Cody "Bo," a backup quarterback at Elon in the late 1970s, the lessons learned at the college level have translated to success as a high school coach.

The idea of coaching football began at Elon, Cody says. During his tenure as a member of the football team, he learned how to draw up plays and learn opposing teams' game plans. "It wasn't all that difficult for me," he says. "I was on the scout team. [I was] learning the other team's plays."

After graduating from Elon in 1980 with a degree in health and physical education, Cody remained in North Carolina after accepting a

teaching job at Rocky Mount High School and later Johnson County Schools. But he still hoped to be head coach for a football team. Then, on a family vacation, his life changed forever. While reading a newspaper, he noticed an ad for a coaching position at Plymouth (N.C.) High School.

Feeling that he had nothing to lose, Cody applied for the position. When he was offered the job, he took it. In his first season, the team went 8-3. But after this initial success, the team went through a lull for a while. That changed in 1992 with the addition of the recreation department, which allowed players to develop before joining the varsity team and offered Cody more competitive players to choose from. He typically gives 22 players the

chance to play every week, and no sports on the field are guaranteed, making every practice a battle for



position.

While Plymouth has enjoyed success during the last decade, it took patience for Cody's teams to win consistently. At first, Cody was on his own—the team didn't have a band, and support from the school was lackluster at times. "You can't turn something around in two or three years," he says. "It takes you a decade."

The turnaround at Plymouth culminated in a state championship. In 2006, and the team has consistently contended for the title since, winning state championships in 2007, 2012 and 2015. "He's had a tremendous impact" in the region, says Wesley Stokes, director of transportation and athletics for Washington County Schools.

"Football here in the 1970s was good, but then we went through a dry spell. After he got it going, we've been a contender." More importantly, Cody is building confident young men. "He's such a great teacher," says Stokes. "He doesn't do a lot of yelling. He goes and individually talks to players."

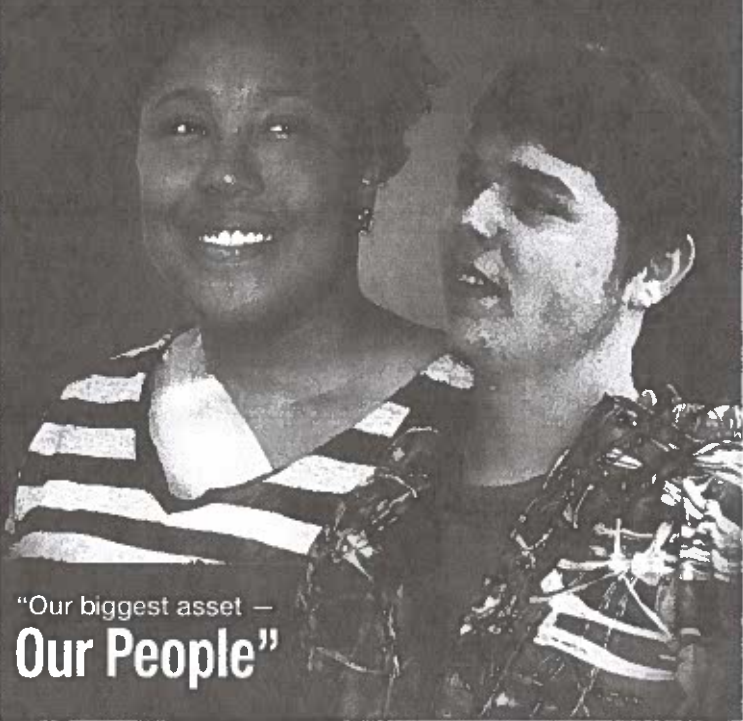
For many in Plymouth, the high school football team is a source of strength. Cody currently employs five of his former players as coaches. Many of the players he coached during his younger days now have sons who play for the team. "It's a real family environment down here," he says.

Not much has changed for Cody since he started at Plymouth in 1981. He still gets up on the weekend and mows the grass on the football field. After 31 years, though, there isn't much he'd change. "I don't think anything is better than having a group of people that all have the same goal," he says. "It's what happens at state championships—there can't be a personal milestone bigger than a team milestone."

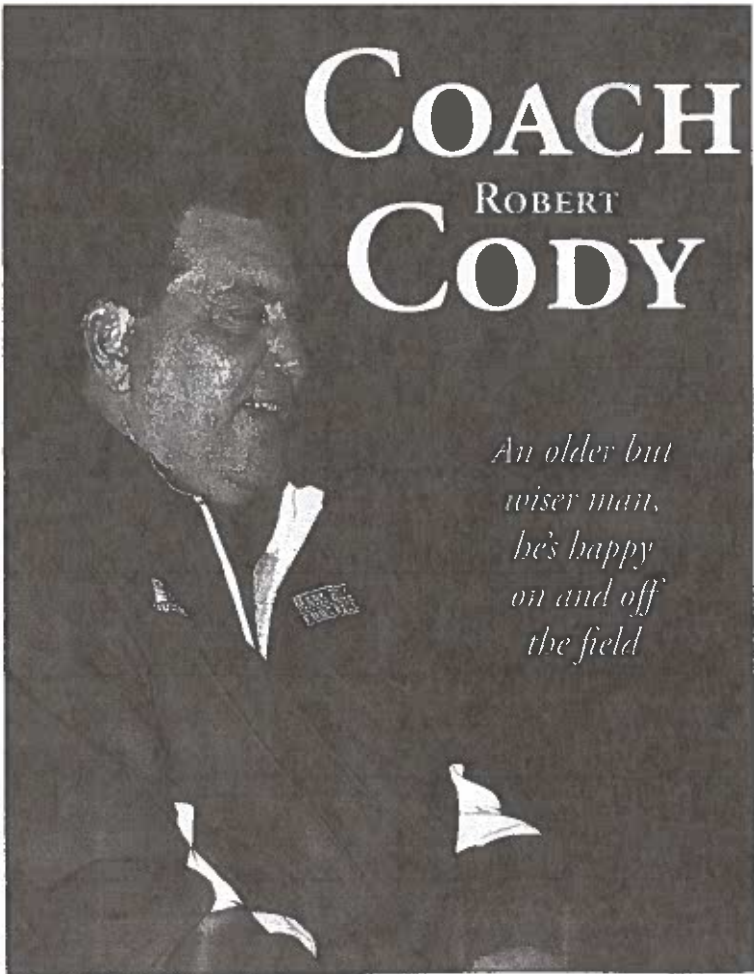

Starting not much older than the players he was coaching Robert Cody, Plymouth High School's head football coach, is older and wiser but his love for the students and the game have not changed.

Born in Morgan, his family eventually moved to Asheville and lived on the Biltmore Estate for 12 years, where his father was a herd supervisor for cattle.

They relocated to Durham, where he graduated from Northern Durham, before attending college at then Elon College, now Elon University, where he played football.

"Well, I played ball all my life and I guess to try and stay close to it; I chose to be a teacher and a coach.

"You know I always felt like I was influenced by my mother and father. They are probably your best role models and then your coaches are probably right after that. That is why I got into it," he said.

Growing up and playing ball, he had bigger aspirations but they didn't pan out. That was proven when he started at Elon.

"I was on the team, but I didn't play all the time. So that was the great, probably the best thing that ever happened to me. I became a better student. Being on the team, yea, but I didn't get to play a whole lot. That was probably the most learning experience in college. Going from high school being pretty good. Go to college and learn that there are a lot of good players. But you get an education."

Thirty-five years later and he doesn't regret it; 30 of those have been here in Washington County, at PHS. He thinks being around the teenagers helps keep him younger and wanting to stay healthy.

"I feel like I have something to offer to them. If they take it that's great, if they don't, they don't," he added.

He's had opportunities to go other places but has chosen to stay. He's taken a team that was not so good, as he described them when he got here, to state champions twice.

The question of why he stays is not new to him, he mentioned he is asked that often.

"I'm happy where I go to church. My wife's from here, she's happy and that's big," he said. "I enjoy being here."

He has his own analogy.

"You know the grass is not greener somewhere else. I see a lot of coaches move on and they're not happy over there. No matter where you're going to work, you're going to run into some difficult situations and then other times be happy."

He is centrally located and can walk everywhere he goes including church, work and the golf course. That is a plus.

was only 26.

Besides his job, he found love after coming here.

He describes his wife, Ann, as a treasure. Noting that over the last 10 years being married to her, he's had more opportunities to leave but he's never even considered it, primarily because she's happy here and they've been able to do good things here.

His other loves are his two daughters and two grandchildren. His youngest daughter is a junior at North Carolina State University, majoring in Spanish. His oldest lives in Tyner.

So what makes Coach Cody a good coach?

"I care about the kids, there's no bottom line that's better than that."

No one likes to be humiliated, so he tries his best not to do that to his students. To him it is all about relationships. If you can build relationships, the better you'll be able to coach.

He feels that most people who yell at players or personnel are people who can't teach you. When being yelled at you don't hear the message or learn the lesson.

"There's never been a kid who's gone on the field to make a mistake on purpose. If you're a coach and you can really live by that, you're a pretty good coach. 'Cause even as adults, when we try the best we can, nobody wants to be humiliated or told this is not good or be embarrassed in front of a crowd. It's so much about a relationship. The better you can build relationships, the better you'll be able to coach."

He also tries to include the students in what he does.

He also tries to use his teachings in Sunday school on the field.

"Anybody that goes to church, believes in Jesus Christ and reads the Bible. Try to follow the ways to love the other person more than you love you. People don't understand that. You have to be selfless in this job, as a coach or a teacher. Because nothing is achieved unless the student or the player does it."

Over the years, he's seen change, growth and progress. Noting that when he first got here, PHS wasn't that great in football. But he felt if he worked hard enough, they could be decent.

The team became average and in the last 10 years they've become really, really good, including going to the state championships the past four years. They've walked away champions two of those years.

He says his success has been a journey with the people he's with. He's tried to live the right way and treat people

correctly. Something he thinks everyone should do.

Cody says he doesn't think teaching or coaching has changed over the years. But he has. His own life has helped him.

"I think I am better now understanding kids, than I was in the beginning. But as far as (coaching) changing it hasn't.

"From the time you get your own kids or grandbaby, they just want your time. Want you to hug them up and love them. When they make mistakes dust them off, when they do well, pat them on the back."

He's coached in the Shrine Bowl and the East-West game. Looking back he realizes that he could have reached many more students if he had the understanding he has now.

"You have so much more understanding at 60 than you did at 22, cause you've lived that."

He chuckled, saying that there is something that most people don't know about him.

"I read a whole lot, I enjoy that. I don't think anybody would think I did that."

There's no difference in Coach Cody you see in the field and in the classroom and Robert Cody you see in the streets.

"I kind of like to be who I am."

Would he change anything about his life if he could go back? Without hesitation, res.

"I would definitely make sure I would get in church a whole lot quicker, accept Jesus Christ as my savior. Then I probably would have lived a more fulfilled and happier life," he said. "Another thing that I've learned is to stay quiet during heated or situations that are difficult to deal with. Sometime other people may have alternative motives to get you angry."

As a younger man, he loved confrontation. Now — not so much!
