CHAPEL HILL – The North Carolina High School Athletic Association finalized the brackets for the 2024 Men's and Women's Basketball Championships on February 24 and the playoffs began on Tuesday, February 27. The remaining schedule is as follows.

Second Round – March 1 at higher seed

Third Round – March 5 at higher seed

Fourth Round – March 8 at higher seed

Regional Finals – March 11-14 at Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem

State Championships – March 15-16 at LVJM.

There will be four Regional Final games per day at LVJM and will begin at 2 p.m. The following games will begin 20 minutes following the conclusion of the previous game. The State Championship games on Friday will be played at 1 p.m., 3:30 p.m., 6 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Championship games on Saturday will be played at 12 p.m., 2:30 p.m., 5:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. The Classifications will be assigned to the schedule at a later date.

NCHSAA Championships return to Winston-Salem

The North Carolina High School Athletic Association is excited to return to Winston-Salem for the 2023-24 men's and women's basketball championships March 11-16.

For the first time ever, the NCHSAA basketball championships will be contested in Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem. The LJVM Coliseum Complex has been host to multiple Western Regional Championships, most recently in 2018, but has never hosted a basketball state final.

"We are thrilled to be hosting the NCHSAA Basketball Championship in this exciting new format," said Brandon Berry, General Manager of ASM Global, which operates the Coliseum for Wake Forest University. "Our staff is eager to provide a first-class experience for athletes and fans from across North Carolina."

Also new in 2024, all of the East and West regional finals and the state championships will be held at the same site, creating a week-long NCHSAA basketball championship event.

The Regional Championship games will be contested Monday-Thursday and the Championship Games will be held Friday and Saturday, with four games each day. Winners of games on Monday and Tuesday will play again on Friday and Wednesday and Thursday winners will advance to Saturday. Game times and which classifications will play on which day will be announced later.

"The North Carolina High School Athletic Association is proud to partner with the City of Winston-Salem, Wake Forest University and the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum to stage our basketball championships," said Commissioner Que Tucker. "This year's new format should make for an exciting and excellent week of basketball and a great showcase of our student-athletes."

While the NCHSAA Basketball Championships have never been in LJVM, the City of Winston-Salem has served as host multiple times. The first NCHSAA men's basketball championship contested in Winston-Salem was in 1945 when Mineral Springs beat Sanford 41-30 for the Class B title. The Championships returned in 1953 for all three classifications, with the 3A remaining there in 1954. The 1A title was also contested there in 1959.

The 2A men's basketball championships were held in Winston-Salem every year from 1960-80. 2024 will mark the first women's championship contested in Winston-Salem.

First Round Notes

There were 32 upsets in the first round of the NCHSAA basketball playoffs across the eight tournaments including two No. 27 Seeds that knocked off No. 6 Seeds. In the 1A Boys Bracket, Christ the King beat Cherokee in a barnburner 85-83 and in the 4A Boys Bracket Marvin Ridge topped McDowell 62-47. The 1A Boys Bracket had the most first-round upset as eight higher seeds went on the road and picked up wins.

Close Calls

In the first round on Tuesday, 23 teams escaped one-possession games to advance to the next round and five teams won by a single point.

In the 3A Boys Bracket, No. 8 Seed Piedmont edged No. 25 East Lincoln 66-65 in overtime. Piedmont's Miles Leak hit a pair of free throws with 26 seconds left to take a four point lead and Jackson Fannon hit a three as time expired to cut the margin to one.

In the 2A Boys Bracket, No. 7 Seed North Surry avoided an upset by No. 26 North Wilkes thanks to a three-point play from Fisher Leftwich in the final 12 seconds to give the Greyhounds a 48-47 win.. Also in the 2A Boys Bracket, No. 21 Southeast Alamance upset No. 12 Roanoke Rapids thanks to a late free throw from Cardell West.

in the 2A Girls Bracket, No. 15 St. Pauls held off a furious comeback from No. 18 Southwest Edgecombe and won 73-72 despite not scoring for the final 3:53 of the contest. In the 4A girls bracket, D.H. Conley took a 33-32 lead with 4:30 left in the game as Savannah Akins hit a 3-pointer for what proved to be the final points of the game.

Second Round Notes

NCHSAA Releases Classification Schedule for Basketball Regional Championships

CHAPEL HILL – The North Carolina High School Athletic Association has assigned classifications to the schedule of the Regional and State Basketball Championships at Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum (LJVM) in Winston Salem.

The 1A Regional Championships will be played on Monday, March 11, with the 3A Regional Championships on Tuesday, March 12. The 1A and 3A State Championship Games will be played on Friday, March 15.

The 2A Regional Championships will be played on Wednesday, March 13, and the 4A Regional Championships are set from Thursday, March 14. The 2A and 4A State Championship Games will be played on Saturday, March 16.

There will be four Regional Final games per day at LJVM, with the first game beginning at 2 p.m. The following games will begin 20 minutes following the conclusion of the previous game. The State Championship games on Friday will be played at 1 p.m., 3:30 p.m., 6 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Championship games on Saturday will be played at 12 p.m., 2:30 p.m., 5:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

The order of the games on each day will be determined later this week to best accommodate the teams involved in the Regional Finals.

Road Warriors

Six teams across the eight brackets have gone on the road in each of the first two rounds and come away with upsets. Two No. 24 Seeds are still dancing in the third round of the NCHSAA Basketball playoffs: in the 4A Boys' Bracket the Sanderson Spartans and in the 3A Girls' Bracket, the St. Stephen's Indians.

4A Boys East No. 24. Sanderson upset the No. 9 Seed New Bern in the first round 75-69 and then beat No. 8 Lumberton in the second round 70-65. They face No. 1 New Hanover in round three.

3A Girls West No. 24 St. Stephen's beat No. 9 Seed Piedmont 60-42 in round one and then beat No. 8 West Henderson 60-51 in round two to earn a trip to No. 1 A.C. Reynolds in round three.

2A Boys West No. 23 Bandys topped No. 10 Seed North Stanly 58-56 in round one and No. 7 North Surry 68-66 in round two. The Trojans will travel to No. 2 Salisbury in round three.

1A Boys West No. 23 Mountain Island Charter beat No. 10 Hiwassee Dam in round one 82-73 and No. 7 South Stanly 55-52 in round two. They will meet No. 2 Corvian Community in round three.

2A Boys East No. 21 Southeast Alamance edged No. 12 Roanoke Rapids 60-59 in round one and then beat No. 5 South Granville 78-68 in round two. They will meet No. 4 Northwood in the third round.

4A Girls East No. 20 Southeast Raleigh beat No. 13 Hillside 46-39 in the opening round and slid past No. 4 Willow Spring 41-40 in round two. They will head to No. 5 Richmond for the third round.

3A Girls East No. 23 C.B. Aycock knocked off No. 10 West Carteret 53-30 in round one but were rewarded with a home game in the second round as No. 26 Triton also earned a first round upset. Aycock topped Triton 46-44 in round two and will face No. 2 Cape Fear in round three.

Still Standing

Of the 64 teams seeded fourth or higher, 57 of them remain alive in their brackets. All 16 of the No. 1 Seeds are still playing and 15 of the No. 2 Seeds remain. In the 2A Girls East bracket, No. 15 St. Pauls beat No. 2 Southwest Onslow in the second round. 14 of the 16 No. 3 Seeds are still participating as 3A Boys West No. 3 Central Davidson was toppled by No. 14 Ben L. Smith and 2A Boys East No. 3 West Bladen fell to No. 14 Fairmount. Only 12 of the No. 4 Seeds remain in the tournaments as both of the No. 4 Seeds in the 2A Girls' Bracket -- Eastern Wayne and Community School of Davidson -- as well as 4A Girls East No. 4 Willow Spring and 3A Girls West No. 4 Oak Grove all fell in the second round.

Survive and Advance

In the second round, 11 teams won by three points or less to survive and advance to the third round, including a pair of No. 1 Seeds. Three teams won by a single point. In the 4A Girls bracket, No. 20 Southeast Raleigh upset No. 4 Willow Spring after the Storm's Zariah Burnette hit a free throw with 6.3 seconds left and the Bulldogs went the length of the floor and Jada Rhodes made a buzzer-beating layup to earn the 41-40 win. In the 1A Girls Bracket, No. 1 Seed Mountain Heritage also escaped with a one-point win 42-41 over No. 16 Rosman, giving the Cougars three wins over the Tigers this season. Title Defense

All eight of the 2023 NCHSAA Basketball Champions are still alive in the 2024 Tournaments with the goal of a successful title defense still in sight. In the 1A Boys' Bracket, Wilson Prep is the No. 1 Seed in the East will host No. 9 North Duplin tonight while Bishop McGuinness, in the 1A Girls' Bracket, is the No. 2 Seed and will host No. 7 North Rowan in the third round. In the 2A Boys' Bracket, No. 1 seed Farmville Central hosts No. 9 Southwest Onslow in the third round and, in the 2A Girls' Bracket, Salisbury is the No. 6 seed and will travel to No. 3 East Burke in round three.

In the 3A Boys' Bracket, No. 2 Seed Central Cabarrus hosts No. 7 A.C. Reynolds in the third round and, in the 3A Girls' Bracket, No. 2 Seed West Rowan hosts No. 7 Ashe County tonight. In the 4A Boys' Bracket, Myers Park is the No. 1 Seed in the West and will host No. 9 Independence in the third round. In the 4A Girls' Bracket, Panther Creek is the No. 3 Seed in the East and will play host to the Tigers from Chapel Hill in round three.

Third Round Notes

Narrow Escapes

Of the 64 games played in the third round of the NCHSAA Basketball Playoffs, seven of them were decided by three points or less including 2A Boys No. 2 Seed Goldsboro's 62-60 win against No. 7 Hertford County and 2A Girls No. 7 West Craven's 47-45 win over No. 2 East Duplin.

In a rematch of last year's 2A East Regional Semifinal, Hertford County's Rimiez Williams made one of two free throws in the final seconds to pull within two points and then stole the ensuing inbounds pass and laid it in to tie the game. After a timeout, Goldsboro inbounded the ball and broke Hertford County's press to give Amari Latham room for the game-winning layup. Hertford County's last-second, full-court heave missed the mark and the Cougars advanced to meet No. 14 Fairmont in the Regional Semifinals.

West Craven started the fourth quarter down by eight points and took the lead over East Duplin late in the game. East Duplin's Kinsey Cave hit a corner three-pointer with 40 seconds to play to tie the score but Shalawn Yates drove to the basket on the next play to hit the go-ahead bucket and that proved to be the final points of the contest. Cinderella Story

Only 11 double-digit seeds remain in the Regional Semifinals and no team that played on the road in the first round is still participating in the post season. The highest remaining seed is St. Pauls in the 2A Girls East Bracket. The No. 15 seeded Bulldogs beat No. 18 SouthWest Edgecombe 73-72 in the first round, the No. 2 seed Southwest Onslow 65-54 in the second and No. 7 Northeastern 51-48 in round three. Regional Semifinal Streaks

In both brackets, half of the 32 teams playing in the Regional Semifinals were also playing in this round in the 2023 season.

In the Boys' Bracket, the 2024 season marks the seventh consecutive season that Farmville Central has appeared in the Regional Semis and the fifth straight year that Wilson Prep has been one of the final eight teams in the 1A bracket. This year also represents five straight trips to the Regional Semis for North Mecklenburg. Northwood is making its first appearance in the 2A Regional Semifinals after three straight years in the 3A Regional Semifinals. Ben L. Smith, Central Cabarrus, Richmond, Myers Park and Chambers are each making their third straight appearance in the Regional Semis and Bertie, South Stokes, Bishop McGuinness, Goldsboro, Reidsville, Salisbury and New Hanover are appearing back-to-back.

In the Girls' Bracket, the Villains from Bishop McGuinness are in the Regional Semifinals for the fifth straight year. Falls Lake Academy, Terry Sanford, Charlotte Catholic and Lake Norman are in the final eight for the third consecutive year and Cherokee, North Pitt, Seaforth, East Bladen, Cape Fear, Ben L. Smith, East Lincoln, West Rowan, Chapel Hill, Rolesville and Watauga are all back for the second year in a row. Mountain Heritage didn't make it last year but is back for the third time in four years.

Game times for Friday will be 1:00, 3:30, 6:00, and 8:30 p.m. and the game times for Saturday will be 12:00, 2:30, 5:00, and 7:30 p.m. Which Championship is played at what time will be determined later in the week.

Seeding Breakdown

On February 27, the NCHSAA announced the brackets for the 2024 Basketball Playoffs and named 16 No. 1 Seeds. Of those 16 No. 1s, 13 of them reached the Regional Finals. All four of the 3A No. 1s are still alive as Women's East No. 1 South Central, Women's West No. 1 A.C. Reynolds, Men's East No. 1 Seventy-First and Men's West No. 1 Hickory will all take the floor at LJVM on Tuesday. Three of the four No. 1s in each of the other classifications are also participating in Winston-Salem. In the 1A: West Women's No. 1 Mountain Heritage, West Men's No. 1 South Stokes and East Men's No. 1 Wilson Prep. In the 2A: East Women's No. 1 North Pitt, East Men's No. 1 Farmville Central and West Men's No. 1 Reidsville. And in the 4A: West Women's No. 1 Watauga, East Women's No. 1 Hoggard and East Men's No. 1 New Hanover.

There are nine No. 2 seeds, five No. 3 seeds and one No. 5 seed also in the Regional Finals. Three double-digit seeded

teams have reached the final week of the 2023-24 season as well. 1A East Men's No. 11 Bertie, 1A East Women's No. 12 East Bladen and 3A West No. 12 Lincoln Charter all washed and packed their away uniforms for their trips to Winston-Salem. In the Regional Finals, the higher seed is the home team. In the State Championship games, the West Regional Champions will be designated as the home teams.

Squeaking Through

In the Regional Semifinal games played on Thursday, three teams won by a single possession to punch thier tickets to LJVM. Brief recaps are available below.

1A Boys: Wilson Prep 54 – Southern Wake 52

In a rematch of a late November clash won by Southern Wake Academy, Wilson Prep led by five at the break in round four and stretched the lead out to 10 for most of the fourth quarter. Southern Wake Academy came storming back in the final minutes of the game, and tied things up 52-52 with 11 seconds left as Chris Crudup hit a layup. But the Tigers acted fast and throw a $\frac{3}{4}$ -court inbound pass immediately after that bucket and Ben Ferguson had an uncontested layup with eight seconds left to score what would be the game-winning points.

4A Boys: New Hanover 63 – Panther Creek 61

NCHSAC Championship Results



The North Carolina High School Athletic Conference served for many years as the athletic organization for historically black high schools. The NCHSAC conducted championships in several sports, and Dr. W.T. "Army" Armstrong of Rocky Mount served as commissioner for many years.

The NCHSAA has spent quite a bit of time and effort trying to research state champions and other facts about the Conference, although what had been uncovered was sketchy. Recently, though, we acquired some documents which Tim Brayboy, who worked for the state Department of Public Instruction before his retirement, had discovered, and it sheds terrific light on the organization. The organization was fairly loosely knit in the 1920's and '30's, basically consisting of 30 to 35 black high schools with no well defined or consistent plan for declaring championships in any sport.

In 1946, a meeting was held in Charlotte to discuss reorganization. Dr. Armstrong was asked to draw up a constitution with rules and

regulations, suggest fees, and establish basic guidelines. There were 35 schools represented at that initial meeting. The organization actually used two different names during its time, including the North Carolina Negro High School Athletic Association and then the North Carolina High School Athletic Conference.

The conference's record membership was 215 high schools in 1959. That level stayed fairly consistent until the late 1960's, as integration began to take place. At its height, the Conference had approximately 90 football teams, 215 basketball teams, 75 in baseball, 30 in tennis and 40 in track.

In its last year of operation, in 1969, the NCHSAC was down to 48 schools, including 17 with football teams, all 48 with basketball, nine with baseball, four in tennis and five in track.

INDIAN HIGH SCHOOL TOURNAMENT



The Robeson Indian High School Athletic Conference began interscholastic participation in the 1920's. Original members of the conference were Fairmont, Green Grove, Magnolia, Pembroke, Piney Grove, Prospect and Union Chapel. Teams competed in several sports, but the post-season basketball tournament at Pembroke State was always a highlight of the year. With consolidation reducing the number of schools to four, the league added Hawkeye (Hoke County) and Les Maxwell (Cumberland in 1966 to become the Tri-County Indian High School Athletic Conference. Then in 1968 the schools joined the NCHSAA, just as the schools in the North Carolina High School Athletic Conference for black high schools did.

2023 1A MEN'S BASKETBALL RECAP | Wilson Prep holds off Eastern Randolph 84-73 to win second title

RALEIGH, NC – Five players were in double-figures for Wilson Prep as a balanced attack lifted the Tigers past a scrappy Eastern Randolph team 84-73 at historic Reynolds Coliseum in the 1A State Championship Game. David Ellis grabbed 19 rebounds had five blocks and scored 14 points to help lead Wilson Prep, earning distinction as the Charlie Adams Most Valuable Player in the game.

Ellis' performance helped the Tigers dominate in the paint, where they outscored Eastern Randolph 50-26. His rebounding efforts also triggered some fast break opportunities, where Wilson Prep outscored the Wildcats 25-8.

Jahmar Jones led all Tigers with 20 points and six rebounds to help Wilson Prep win the school's second State Championship. Jones was selected as the Tigers' Most Outstanding Player chipping in five steals to round out a solid performance.

Eastern got 34 points from DaVonte Brooks who also grabbed 19 rebounds and had three steals in the game. He was chosen as the Wildcats' Most Outstanding Player. The only other Wildcat in double-figures was Timothy Brower with 20 points and eight rebounds.

Eastern Randolph concluded their year 29-3. The Wildcats reached the State Championship Game for the first time in program history after winning the school's first Western Regional Championship. The Wildcats also won the Patriot Athletic 1A/2A.

Wilson Prep was 27-7 this season, winning the school's second men's basketball State Championship in three years. The Tigers were 15-1 in the Tar Roanoke 1A, winning the league championship and appeared in the second State Championship in program history.

Farmville was led by a 35-point performance by Jah Short, who also grabbed seven rebounds on his way to earning the Charlie Adams Most Valuable Player award and the program's eighth State Championship.

Two other Jaguars were in double-figures, with JD Daniels and MJ Williams both scoring 14 points in the game. Daniels added nine rebounds and had a pair of assists on his way to earning Most Outstanding Player honors for the Jags. Williams capped off his day with three boards and three assists.

Late in the third quarter, the Rams managed to trim a 12-point deficit to just 3 as Kendre Harrison hit a jumper with 2:03 to go in the quarter to cut the lead to 47-44. However, Farmville closed the quarter on a 5-0 run and built some cushion and kept the Rams at arm's length for the remainder of the game.

The Rams were led by a pair of underclassmen, Dionet Neal and Kendre Harrison. Neal was a difficult matchup in the game, scoring 32 points including 3-6 from three. He dished out four assists and had all five Reidsville steals. Neal was selected as the Rams' Most Outstanding Player. Harrison dumped in 13 points and grabbed 14 rebounds with five blocks in the game.

Farmville really distinguished themselves with their high-pressure defense. The Jags scored 21 points off Rams turnovers and only gave up four points off their own miscues.

Reidsville ended the season 26-1. The Rams were the unbeaten champions of the Mid-State 2A, winning the regular season and conference tournament championship. Reidsville's men collected the program's fifth regional championship and their first State Championship appearance since 2003.

Desmond Kent Jr. had 16 points and added four rebounds on as he led the team. He also had three blocks on his way to being selected as the Charlie Adams Most Valuable Player. Fellow Viking Adriel Miller also knocked in 16 points and picked up two rebounds.

Jaiden Thompson really directed the show for Central Cabarrus, scoring 10 points but grabbing four rebounds and dishing out four assists in the game. Defensively, he also had a standout game, ripping three steals and helping the Vikings build a 20-10 advantage in points off turnovers. He was chosen as the Most Outstanding Player for the Vikings.

Myers Park was hyper-efficient, knocking down 56.5% of their shots from the field. Bishop Boswell led the team with 22 points and six rebounds. He also added four assists and had three steals, drawing the tough assignment of covering Richmond's Paul McNeil for most of the game after Sir Mohammed was injured early. Boswell was selected as the Charlie Adams Most Valuable Player for his efforts.

The Mustangs dominated in the paint as well, outscoring the Raiders in the paint by a 44-18 margin. Much of that advantage can be attributed to the 22 points from Elijah Strong who also banged out seven rebounds and tacked on a block for good measure. Strong was a powerhouse inside and with his strength was awarded the Most Outstanding Player honors for Myers Park.

Richmond never led in the game. The Raiders did manage to cut the Mustang advantage to three several times in the first half. However, any time the Raiders would make a surge, the Mustangs would answer. McNeil was the leader on the floor for Richmond, scoring 21 points and grabbing six rebounds. He added two steals and a pair of assists on his way to the Most Outstanding Player honor for Richmond.

Myers Park had one other player in double-figures, scoring 15 points and grabbing seven boards in the game. The only Raider other than McNeil in double-figures was JV Drake, who chipped in 10 points in the loss.

The Raiders wrapped the year at 28-3. The Raiders won the Sandhills Athletic 3A/4A and collected the program's fourth Regional Championship. Richmond returned to the State Championship Game for the first time since back-to-back appearances in 1996 and 1997.

2023 2A WOMEN'S BASKETBALL RECAP | Salisbury climbs back over Seaforth 48-39 to win back-to-back championships

CHAPEL HILL, NC – The Salisbury Hornets started slowly, but they erased a 13-point first-quarter deficit to slide by Seaforth 48-39 and win the 2A Women's Basketball State Championship for the second year in a row. Makayla Noble jump started the Hornet offense in the fourth quarter, scoring eight of her 15 points in the quarter on her way to earning the Kay Yow Most Valuable Player Award for the 2A Championship.

Seaforth came out hot, running off the first 13 points of the game to go up 13-0 with 1:44 to go in the first quarter. Gabby White and Peyton Collins combined to put up 13 of the Hawk's 15 points in the opening frame. Haley Dalton finally got the Hornets on the board with a layup 20 seconds after the Hornets fell behind 13, and they slowly started to claw their way out of the early hole.

Icesis Nwafor was a catalyst for the Hornets breaking out of the slow start. She hit one deep three late in the first quarter and then bombed home her first two threes of the second quarter to help the Hornets cut the lead to just two at the 5:16 mark of the second. Nwafor also helped defend White, one of the toughest draws on the Hawks roster, on her way to being named the Most Outstanding Player for the Hornets.

Kyla Bryant also had an outstanding game for Salisbury, handling point guard duties admirably with 14 points and four assists against just two turnovers. For Seaforth, White was the lone double-figure scorer, tossing in 15 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. White was selected as the Hawks' Most Outstanding Player.

Seaforth wrapped their year at 27-4, champions of the Mid-Carolina 1A/2A. The team appeared in the State Championship Game for the first time in the school's brief two-year history. The Hawks will return all players on the roster for next year.

CHAPEL HILL, NC – The Panther Creek Catamounts collected the program's first women's basketball State Championship, knocking off Lake Norman 75-65. Panther Creek junior guards Taylor Barner and Olivia Tucker combined for 47 of the Catamount's 75 points on the way to the victory.

Panther Creek stretched the lead out to eight three separate occasions, but never led by more than that until Tucker stole a cross court pass with ten seconds remaining in the game to pick up another two points and cement her selection as the Kay Yow Most Valuable Player for the game. Tucker finished with 27 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals.

Lake Norman briefly surged in front with 4:55 to go in the game, taking a 63-62 lead when Alexis Shehan scored four straight points to give the Wildcats their only lead of the final quarter. The Wildcats did not record another field goal in the game, as the Catamounts surged to end the game on a 13-2 run, with the only Lake Norman points coming on two free throws by senior Kirsten Lewis-Williams who finished her career with 16 points and 12 rebounds.

Each time the Catamounts extended the lead, Lake Norman clawed their way back into the game with three-point shooting. Kelsey Rhyne, a freshman, shot 6-11 from three, scoring 20 points and grabbing six rebounds on her way to being named the Most Outstanding Player for the Wildcats. Overall, Lake Norman shot 42.9% from three.

Panther Creek relied heavily on the speed of their guards to put points on the board. In addition to the 27 points by Tucker, Barner knocked down 20 of her own, regularly slashing into the lane to make contested layups. Barner also distributed the ball well, assisting on four buckets as well on her way to being named the Most Outstanding Player for the Catamounts.

Lake Norman finished the season at 31-1, the best season in school history. The Wildcats won the 4A Western Regional to make the first appearance in a State Championship Game in program history. The Wildcats were unbeaten in conference play, winning the Greater Metro 4A regular season and conference tournament.
