BENCH DECORUM

- The Officiating Sub-Committee, authorized and formed by the NCHSAA Board of Directors, identified behavior of Basketball coaches as a crucial area of needed improvement for game officials to monitor.
- North Carolina has adopted the 28-foot Coaching Box to allow our coaches maximal area to instruct and direct their players during the course of the game.



The purpose of the Coaching Box is not to promote or encourage coaching involvement towards the officials on every play during the contest.

BENCH DECORUM

- A dramatic increase in aggressive and unsporting action of coaches towards game officials has been observed and identified. Simply stated, this must be addressed and abated.
- A major point of emphasis for game officials this year will be to utilize Rule 10-5-4 Penalty which states, "The officials may warn the head coach unless the offense is judged to be major, in which case a technical foul shall be ruled."



When a warning to a coach is given, this shall be recorded in the scorebook and communicated to the head coach and officiating crew.

BENCH DECORUM

- The purpose of recording the warning in the official scorebook is to make clear any further action of this nature will result in a technical foul, which takes away the Coaching Box from the Head Coach.
- Doing so has a major consequence to that team as it limits the instructional opportunity detailed earlier.
- As officials, we do not want to inhibit the ability of coaches to do just that...coach. But over-involvement in questioning or opining about officiating calls must be eradicated from our game.

BENCH DECORUM

- Let's remember that role modeling excellence is a comprehensive responsibility.
- Positive and professional communication is expected. REMINDER: Only the Head Coach can have communication with game officials. If an Assistant Coach does so in an unsporting manner, this technical foul is also charged to the Head Coach as one of two they are allowed before removal from the contest.



Officials – use the warning effectively. Coaches – understand the warning is a protocol to ensure proper behavior and communication.
