Champions to be crowned

CHAPEL HILL -- The North Carolina High School Athletic Association released the brackets for the 2024 Football Championships on Sunday, November 10, ahead of the First Round Games on Friday, Nov. 15. This year's State Championship Games will mark the 110th season in which North Carolina has crowned a high school football state champion, dating back to Raleigh's win in 1913 (no champion in 1918). The 2024 football playoffs are the fourth iteration of the current NCHSAA Football Playoff format as the classifications were split and eight champions were crowned from 2002 to the spring of 2021 (Covid-19 year).

The 2024 Championship Games will be held December 20th and 21st at Kenan Memorial Stadium on the campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and at Carter-Finley Stadium on the campus of North Carolina State University.

## How Playoff Seeding Works

Each conference is allotted playoff berths based on the number of schools fielding a team in a particular sport:

1-5 Teams = 1 Berth (Conference Champion)

6+ Teams = 2 Berths (Conference Champion + 2nd Place)

The highest finishing team from a given classification in a split conference will automatically qualify, regardless of overall conference finish (minimum of 2 schools per classification) RPI rating was added to the Handbook for conference tie-breaking procedure as the final tiebreaker.

The remaining non-automatic teams in each region (East/West) will fill the remaining berths based solely on their RPI rating, with the caveat that a team can only make the playoffs if all of the teams above them in the conference standings have also made the playoffs.

Conference champions are seeded before any other qualifying teams by RPI rating. All other teams are seeded after the conference champions by the RPI rating of the school, regardless of conference finish. Each region (East/West) is seeded independently of one another, utilizing the RPI rating of the school.

## Championship Sites

UNC's Kenan Memorial Stadium is the most frequent host of NCHSAA Football Championship games having hosted 81 championship games since 1989. This year's games will be the 83rd and 84th in Kenan Stadium (first in 1929). Carter-Finley will be hosting its 35th and 36th NCHSAA Championship Games this season. Wake Forest's BB&T Field (Groves) has held 25 Championship Games and Duke's Wallace Wade has played host nine times. In 1988, Groves Stadium hosted the 4A Championship, prior to that game, championships were played predominately at high school sites. From 1990-2001, all four classifications played their Championship Games at Kenan.

## Round 4 Notes

### Survive and Advance

Of the 32 games in the third round, only five of them were decided by seven points or less. The closest contest in the third round was the matchup between James Kenan and Wallace-Rose Hill. The Bulldogs had a chance to win the game at the end of regulation but the field goal attempt missed wide right. In overtime, David “Cito” Zelaya scored for James Kenan and senior Emerson Gomez made the extra point to take the 14-7 lead. Matthew Wells scored for Wallace Rose-Hill when the Bulldogs took over but they decided to go for two and Wells was stopped just inches shy of the goal line.

East Forsyth trailed early on Friday night as Mooresville lead 17-7 and held a 24-21 lead going into the fourth quarter. Corey Blair helped the Eagles put the game away with two touchdowns in the final frame, the second coming on a 48-yard run. East Forsyth’s Robbie Whitney recovered Mooresville’s onside kick in the last minute to seal the win.

### Light ‘em up

Teams participating in the third round racked up a total of 1,768 points, for an average of 55.25 points per game. Seven teams scored 55 or more and 13 teams scored 48 or more including Crest, who fell 63-48 to Hickory. Tarboro scored 71 in the third round after scoring 55 in the second round. For the Vikings, 10 different players had at least one carry and six of them scored. Senior Mason Satterfield ran four times, scored three times and tallied 71 yards.

Defending 3A Champion Hickory trailed Crest most of the game and was behind 42-28 mid way through the third quarter when senior quarterback Brady Stober took over. The Samford committ finished the game 17-of-23 for 478 yards and six touchdowns, including 52- and 80-yard touchdown passes. Senior running back Isaiah Lackey also had a solid night for the Red Tornadoes as he rushed for 100 yards and three TDs on 22 carries.

## Not-so-nice to see you

Two of the 16 games in the third round will be rematches of games from earlier in the season.

Hickory hosted North Lincoln on October 2, in a Western Foothills Conference game and the Red Tornadoes beat the Knights 60-25. Hickory is still undefeated on the year and has not lost since the first round of the playoffs in 2022 — 30 straight games. The Red Tornadoes currently have the 12th longest active winning streak in the nation and second longest in NC. The loss in October was North Lincoln's only one of the year as they are 12-1 heading into Friday night.

Havelock beat Jacksonville in a Big Carolina 3A/4A conference clash on October 11 at Jacksonville 21-14 thanks to LeBron Sharpe's 148 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries. The loss was the only one of the year for Jacksonville, which is now 11-1 on the year. Havelock is 12-1, having only lost to New Bern 28-27 back in September.

## Regional Semifinal Appearances

From 1961 through 1971, play did not culminate in a state champion in all classifications. Since 1972 every classification has declared a state champion and from 2001-2020, each classification had two champions. The NCHSAA All-Time Playoff records and subsequently the regional final and semifinal appearances records, go back only to 1972. In the period from 2001-2020, the Regional Semifinal was the third round, in the last four seasons, it has been the fourth.

Tarboro is playing in the Regional Semifinal for the 17th consecutive year, the longest streak in North Carolina. 2024 is the ninth straight season of playing in the fourth round. A win this week for Tarboro would put them in the Regional Finals for the ninth consecutive year and the 14th time since 2008. The Vikings have been the East Regional Champions seven years in a row. The Vikings will host Pender, who last reached the regional semifinals in 2021. Since 1972, Pender has reached the regional semis six times, including five straight years from 2006-2010.

In the other 1A East Regional Semifinal, Wilson Prep is making its second appearance in the Regional Semis after making its NCHSAA Playoff debut just two seasons ago. They lost in the fourth round last year. They will face Lakewood, who is appearing in the Regional Semis for the ninth time since its first appearance in 1974.

In the 1A West, Mount Airy is in the Regional Final for the 17th time since 1972 and the third year in a row. The Granite Bears are currently on a 43-game winning streak, the fifth longest active streak in the United States. They will host Corvian Community, which is making its second appearance in the NCHSAA Playoffs after losing in the second round last year.

Murphy is in the Regional Semis for the 25th time since 1972 and first time since 2021. They will face Mountain Heritage, who is playing in the Regional Semis for the 8th time. The last appearance for Mountain Heritage was in 2020 when they won the 2A West Regional Championship.

In the 2A bracket, Northeastern is back in the Regional Semis for the 13th time in the last 15 seasons, winning seven of those 12 games. They will host James Kenan, which is in the Regional Semis for the first time since 2015. Kinston will make its fifth appearance in the Regional Semis on Friday night when they travel to Whiteville. Whiteville is playing in the regional Semis for the 18th time since 1972.

Brevard is playing in the Regional Semis for the 13th time, winning seven of those 12 games to date. Last season the Blue Devils fell in the third round. They will host Forest Hills, which is playing in the Regional Semis for the 15th time. Monroe is back in the Regional Semis for the 12th time as they travel to Shelby, the school with the most playoff wins of any school since 1972 with 123. The Golden Lions are making their 30th appearance in the Regional Semifinals this year.

Havelock is playing in the Regional Semis for the 20th time on Friday and they will host Jacksonville, which is making its 18th appearance since 1972. Jacksonville last reached the fourth round in 2021, while Havelock reached the fourth round last season.

J.H. Rose's Cinderella run as the No. 30 seed continues into the fourth round this week, a place the Rampants have been 14 times before, including four straight years from 2003-2007 as they won four consecutive 4A State Championships. They will face 71st this week, the defending 3A East Champions. The Falcons are making their 14th appearance in the Regional Semis.

West Charlotte is making its first appearance in the Regional Semis since 2007 as they will face Dudley. The Panthers reached the fifth round last season and are making their 15th appearance in the Regional Semis since 1972.

The Hickory Red Tornadoes are making their fifth appearance in the Regional Semis, every time they have won the Regional Semifinal, they have gone on to win the State Championship as they are 2-0 in Regional Finals and 2-0 in State Finals. Their round four opponent, North Lincoln, has never won three playoff games in the same postseason before but has reached the Regional Semifinal three times before, going 0-3 in those contests.

Cleveland is making its seventh appearance in the last 13 years and Rolesville is in the Regional Semis for the fifth consecutive year. Hoggard is back for the 13th time, facing Cardinal Gibbons this year. The Crusaders are playing in the Regional Semifinals for the ninth time.

Grimsley is back for the third year in a row and sixth time in the last seven years. Hough is playing in the Regional Semis for the seventh time in the last 11 seasons. East Forsyth is playing in the regional semifinals for the 14th time, facing Weddington this year. The Warriors are the defending champions and are in the regional semis for the 11th time in the last 12 seasons.

## Round 3 Notes

### Highs and Lows

Of the 64 winners in round two, eight teams scored more than 55 points, led by Whiteville's 63-point performance. The Wolfpack was left by 194 yards and five touchdowns on just 15 carries from Cameron McKvian. Nallegame Powell added 180 yards and a touchdown on 26 carries. Seven teams showed out on the other side of the ball, pitching shutouts in the second round. Wallace-Rose Hill, Warren County, Eastern Randolph, Dudley, Shelby, Mallard Creek and Robbinsville all advanced to the third round without allowing a point. Warren County, Eastern Randolph, Dudley and Shelby have yet to be scored on in the playoffs. Tarboro (defending 1A East Champions) have also yet to allow a point in the playoffs, but were the beneficiary of a first round bye. 4A West No. 5 Hough has allowed just three points through the first two rounds.

## Run it back

Eight of the 32 matchups in the third round are rematches of regular season contests, including a rematch of a barn-burner from the Northwest 1A Conference. On September 28, the defending 1A Champion Mount Airy Granite Bears went to Starmount and gave the Rams their only loss of the season, 17-14. The Rams will travel to Mount Airy in the third round with the hope of avenging that loss and ending the Bears 42-game winning streak. ## Still Dancin'

Just four teams have gone on the road in both of the first two rounds and came back home with upset wins to keep thier season alive. 3A East No. 30 is the highest remaining seed in the postseason as they have beaten No. 3 Northern Nash 32-25 and No. 14 Southern Nash 28-16. The Rampants were led by senior running back Tevin Council and she 138 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries.

The 2A West No. 17 East Rutherford Cavaliers provided the biggest surprise of the playoffs so far in the second round in Reidsville as they beat the defending 2A champions 27-26. It was the first loss since September 8, 2023 for the Rams and the first time they have lost before the fourth round of the playoffs since 2015. Coincidentally, the Rams beat East Rutherford 16-7 in the first round in 2015, before falling to Lincolnton. Since that time, the Rams have played in seven of the eight state championship games. On Friday, Brandon Pinkerton led the charge for the upset-minded Cavaliers as he had 186 rushing yards and two scores on 37 carries. Blake McClellan added 136 yards and a score on the ground and the East Rutherford defense held the Rams to just 206 total yards and forced three turnovers.

The defending 1A Champion Mount Airy also had a big offensive showing in Round 1, shutting out Thomas Jefferson 68-0. ## VIDEO STREAMING & TELEVISION BROADCASTS

The media rights to all NCHSAA post-season events, including playoffs and State Championships, are held by the NCHSAA. Sinclair Broadcasting Group has purchased the exclusive rights to produce and distribute the Football and Basketball State Championships. They also have the right of first refusal on any playoff contest in those two sports for their contract with the NCHSAA.

The NCHSAA also has an agreement with the NFHS Network that cedes the remaining portion of NCHSAA post-season events media rights to the NFHS Network. Per the agreement with them, they would have the following choice of games during the football and basketball playoffs after Sinclair. They have first right of refusal on all other sports during the playoffs.

Many of the 2024 NCHSAA Football Playoff Contests will be broadcast live by the NFHS Network. Network subscribers can watch NCHSAA games live and on-demand as well as playoff and championship action from other state associations across the country. Subscriptions are just \$11.99/ a month. Media outlets seeking to broadcast an NCHSAA Playoff game live must submit the online Broadcast Request Form by visiting the Media section of the NCHSAA's website. All forms must be completed at least 24-hours prior to the start of the contest.
